mouth and digestive system. A carrier is a person who ha had typhoid fever at some time and who even after recover arries the germs of the diseas
in the urine and discharge the bowels. Carriers who are careless in their personal habits are likely to infect any food hey handle with unwashe and far-reaching outbreaks of the disease have been caused by drinking milk or eating foods hat have been handled by car without knowing it.
