curred in the House this week. curred in the House this week.
It was over the extension of ments program. The Reciprocal Trade-Agreements Act is the
handiwork of former Secretary handiwork of former Secretary
of State, Cordell Hull. It was 1934. The program has been extended from time to time since that date, usually for 1 and 2
year periods. This week the year periods. This week the
House passed a bill extending this program for an additional 3 years. The Reciprocal TradeAgreements Act authorizes the
President, largely through the President, largely through the
Secretary of State, to negotiate Secretary of State, to negotiate
trade agreements with foreign countries, raising or lowering
tariffs and duties almost as he sees fit. Our big argument in
the House was over 2 amendthe House was over 2 amend-
ments to this Act. One is known as the peril-point amendment.
