National Economy

| Speaking before about 175 persons in a meeting of the Cooke County Agricultural Club in the public school auditorium Monday night, John C. White Texas Commissioner of Agriculture, explained the vital part that farmers are playing in their state and national economy <br> He said that agriculture is this country's greatest bulwark against radicalism, explaining that a large percentage of farmers own the land and tools they work and are interested therefore in protecting the human right to own property, Quoting the pioneer statesman Daniel Webster he said, "Those who do not have property usually do not favor laws protecting property." <br> White also told his audience that the average American farm family's production sustains seven other families. One out of every 8 American workers is a farmer. By comparison 88, per cent of the workers in Tibet are farmers and the standard of living they sustain is much lower than that provided by our 12 per cent. In addition to all this produce a surplus which is dis tributed among needy nations Their efforts constitute an im portant factor in winning the friendship of other countries. <br> Another point emphasized by White is the mistaken opinion |
