made-to-order, weather, recent tests indicate certain practices which increase the moisture penetrating capacity of the soil
greatly aid in making land more drouth resistant. Tests conducted at the Spur Experiment Station show that moisture penetration was doubled over experimental plots the previous spring. Soil moisture also was increased on grass land
treated with sorghum litter and treated with sorghum litter and barnyard manure.
Cotton burrs sil at a rate of 4,8 and to the to the acre increased moisture penetration to 28,30 and 39 inches, respectively. Plots not so
treated had a water penetration treated had a water penetration
of only 16 inches. The burrs not only increase water storage and penetration, but contain nitrogen, phosphorus and pota
sential soil elements.
