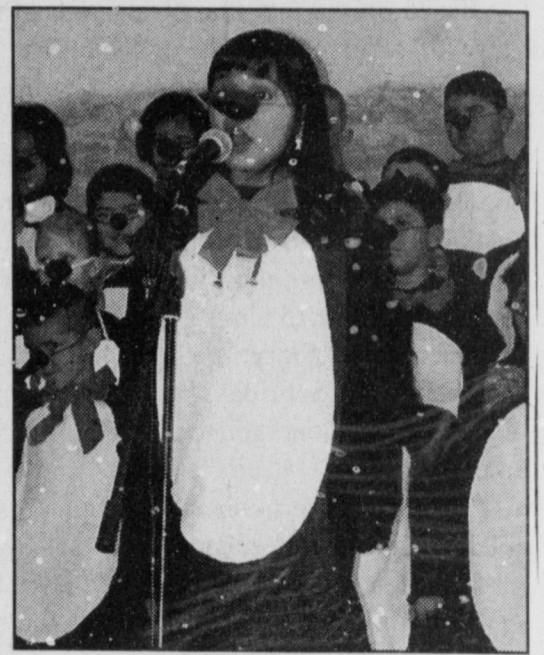
Also on Dec. 16 — The Republic of Texas Congress grants the first railroad charter west of the Mississippi.

Lady Mules dunk 10-0 Slaton in 44-39 win

SLATON — The Lady Mules entered the Tigerette cage in Slaton on Dec. 11, coming face-to-face with a very disciplined and undefeated team, and emerged with a 44-39 win.

Chris Kennedy's Slaton girls came into the contest with a 10-0 record and controlled the tempo of the game, trying to prevent the Lady Mules from running the floor and pushing the game into high gear.

Anne Cox made only two points in the game, but they were the silver bullets that put the game out of reach at 44-39. She had been fouled with six seconds remaining in the game and Muleshoe leading 42-39.

Slaton called time-out to try to freeze

Cox, and when she stepped to the line there was not a friendly face in sight as the Lady Mules had all dropped back on defense in case Cox were to misfire.

She hit nothing but the bottom of the net on the first shot to give Muleshoe a four-point lead, and then for good measure added the second free throw.

The Statue of Liberty play in football is a very tricky play to sell and execute to the defense. But Statue defense in basketball proved to be very effect as the Lady Mules did not move on defense so they could be called for an unnecessary foul as Slaton brought the ball down court as the final seconds ticked away.

The lack of movement by the Lady Mule defense must have startled the Tigerettes, as Slaton failed to get a shot up

in the final six seconds.

Jessica Carpenter — Muleshoe's leading scorer at 13 points — had given the Lady Mules an early lead by scoring five points of her own and feeding Shani Rasco after crashing the boards and pulling down an offensive rebound among the tall trees. Rasco's shot put the Lady Mules up 7-2.

Slaton called a time-out, and Kennedy settled her troops back into their game. They nailed Muleshoe to nine points for the final four minutes of the first period while scoring eight unanswered points, taking a 13-9 lead into the second period.

Mindy Locker hit a free throw with 5:30 remaining in the first half to complete a traditional three-point play and cut the

Farm Bureau, Farmers Union decry Senate delay

WASHINGTON, D.C. (DTN) — Reacting to Republican senators voting Thursday against a motion to move ahead with the farm bill, American Farm Bureau President Bob Stallman urged his members Friday to call their senators and tell them "it will be a slap in farmers' faces" if the procedural delays result in a farm bill with less money than the \$73.5 billion in the current congressional budget resolution.

National Farmers Union President Leland Swenson also issued a statement that the group is "appalled" at the Senate vote.

But the statement by Stallman, a well-known Texas Republican, is the most likely to cause a reaction.

The Senate voted Thursday on a cloture petition by Senate Majority Leader Tom Daschle, D-S.D., to bring the farm bill debate to a close and hold a vote early next week.

Daschle and the Democrats have been

pushing for a vote because the congressional session is coming to a close and they are worried that Congress is less likely to be generous with funding farm programs next year.

Stallman expressed "profound disappointment and anger" at the Senate's failure to move ahead with the farm bill and said farmers and ranchers will "hold accountable those senators who have kept the

measure bottled up."

Stallman continued by saying, "The stalling tactics used by some senators this week have jeopardized needed assistance for farmers. If the result is that we don't get a final bill until next year and the \$73.5 billion allocated to agriculture in the budget is cut, we'll know who to blame. We

Area cotton growers more cautious

Explaining the reasons why Farm Bill deliberations by the Senate have slowed considerably is becoming a significant challenge.

That explanation is especially difficult in light of the fact that obstacles continue to pop up to delay approval of the Senate's

version of farm legislation.

As of Friday, the Senate appeared to be looking at a farm bill vote no sooner than this Tuesday.

Had Senate Democrats been successful in their effort to pass a cloture motion to limit further debate and restrict the filing of additional amendments, the Tuesday vote would have

been locked in.

As it stands now Tuesday is still a likely date, but by no means certain.

Plains Cotton Growers and cotton producers across the High Plains have been actively communicating with Texas Sens. Phil Gramm and Kay Bailey see COTTON on page 2

Library programs to change

The Muleshoe Area Public Library will move its regular "Storytime" from Mondays to Saturdays starting in January and also begin new programs called "Ready for Life" and "Saturday Afternoon at the Library."

Based on the fact that 50 percent of an infant's brain growth occurs by the age of 6 months, "Ready for Life" will be for children from newborn up to the age of 2. Parents must attend with the child.

"Ready for Life" will be very informal, with board books for parents to read to their children as well as group activities and information on vaccinations, health care and day care. The program is scheduled for Saturdays from 9:30 a.m. to 10:15 a.m.

The regular "Storytime," for children ages 3 to 6, is now scheduled for Saturdays from 10:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Parents are encouraged to attend, but this is not a requirement.

"Saturday Afternoon at the Library" is designed for all elementary-school students and is scheduled for 1 p.m. to 1:45 p.m. It will feature reading and craft projects.

need the bill finished in the Senate immediately and we need a conference committee to approve a final bill before the Christmas recess," he said.

"It is clear that opponents of the farm bill are stalling and using procedural delays," Stallman asserted. "The House, made up of 435 members, completed its farm bill in three days and considered 45 amendments. In contrast, the Senate has debated the farm bill for all or part of nine days, without an end in sight. With cloture, there would have been ample time for opponents to offer their amendments."

With another cloture vote scheduled for Tuesday, Stallman said there still is an opportunity to get the farm bill on track.

"This cloture motion must pass. The House, which passed its farm bill in October, and the senators who have labored mightily to get this done, deserve it. Any senator who votes against cloture will

telling farmers they don't care if farmers suffer the consequences of no farm bill or one that is scaled back."

Earlier Friday, the Farmers Union, whose members are more likely to vote Democratic, said it was "appalled by the actions of some Republican members of the U.S. Senate to block progress toward the completion of the farm bill."

"The Senate's failure to pass a motion for cloture to

move debate forward is a major obstruction to finishing the farm bill this year," Swenson said. "Without a new farm bill, farmers and ranchers will have the smallest safety net ever for their 2002 crops."

Swenson also called on Farmers Union members to call senators who voted against cloture.

"The majority of the Senate voted for cloture and have indicated their desire to help rural America,"

Swenson said. "We are puzzled why senators who represent rural citizens and agriculture producers would try to impede this important legislation. Farmers and ranchers, and the organizations that represent them, should contact these senators and ask them why they voted to block completion of a much-needed farm bill."

Sens. Phil Gramm and Kay Bailey Hutchison were listed as opposing cloture.

of farmers and ranchers struggling to survive and turn a profit.

Some Republican senators have argued that the bill has so much extra baggage that it will not be easily conferenced with the House farm bill, which was passed in October through the concerted efforts of House Ag Committee Chairman Larry Combest and ranking member Charles Stenholm.

That argument rings slightly hollow as the primary Republican alternatives also have their own challenges to overcome in a conference committee.

Political gamesmanship is easy to spot and constituents, with the availability of live coverage of activities in Washington, will ultimately make the determination of who is serious and who is not.

Eighth-grade girls take three lopsided victories

The Dimmitt Bobbies seemed to stay lost in the "Woods" — meaning cousins Kasey and Brandi — when they visited the Muleshoe competition gym Dec. 3.

The Lady Mules' trapping full-court press created too many turnovers for the Bobbies, as Muleshoe pounded them 32-14.

When the Wood cousins snapped the trap shut on the press, the Bobbies would lose control of the ball, and the Lady Mules were scoring easy points.

Seven seconds into the game, Kasey Wood was fouled going for a layup off the opening tip. Connecting on a free throw gave the Lady Mules a lead they would never relinquish. Post-to-post passing proved rewarding as Madison Smith found Jenna Rasco for two points on the blocks.

Kasey Wood hit nothing but net from 20 feet on an in-bound play and Rasco dropped in a free throw to put the Lady Mules up 8-4 at the end of one period. Monica Posadas drove the lane to get the Lady Mule offense cranked in the second frame.

Smith made two from the baseline and Brandi Wood set up Kasey Wood with a pass as she cut through the defense like a Ginsu knife. Kasey Wood fed Rasco posting up on the block for a turn-around jump shot to push the Lady Mule advantage to 21-10 at halftime.

The Lady Mule defense completely shut down the Bobbies in the second half until only 3:37 remained in the game. Christie Reeves scored from the elbow on an in-bound play to complete the scoring for the Lady Mules.

Smith led the Lady Mules with nine points; Rasco and Kasey Wood added six points each. Brandi Wood made five, Posadas dropped in four and Reeves chipped in two for the Lady Mules.

In the Lady Mules' first game of the year, Muleshoe plucked the Lubbock Roosevelt Lady Eagles 35-9. Ashley Dickson and Brandi Wood each had seven points while Kasey Wood added six for the Lady Mules in the contest. Rasco made five, Posadas dropped in four and Trisha Robertson, Smith and Pacheco had two points each for the Lady Mules.

Next, the Lady Mules

set the Lady Pirates of Lubbock Cooper adrift, inundating them 36-10 in Muleshoe. Four points were the most the Lady Pirates could muster in any one period.

Kasey Wood had a three-pointer and 11 points for Muleshoe; Brandi Wood had a three and added 10 points. Dickson dropped in six points, Smith scored four, Reeves and Robertson made two points each and Lindsey Hall chipped in a point for Muleshoe.

The Lady Mules went on the road and skinned the Lady Wildcats in Littlefield with Brandi Wood scoring 15 points.

It's almost Christmas again. And I'm again struck by the fact that the venerable season in which we celebrate Christ's birth has about it a magnifying quality. Big trees, loads of lights, gifts galore, scrumptious feasts. Everything surrounding Christmas seems larger than life, magnified by festive light. That's true of Christmas joys. It's also true of Christmas sorrows.

I haven't really performed more funerals during Christmas than at other times. (I
