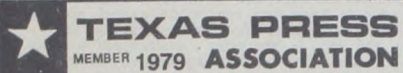

#### Address Listing Starts for 1980 National Census

Census Bureau address compiling operations for the 1980 census have begun in Texas from an office located in Dallas, said Julian Moseley, office manager. Temporary workers are being hired now to begin putting together lists of addresses from which mailing labels will be prepared for use on the 1980 census questionnaires. They will be mailed to each of some 80 million households nationwide in late March 1980. Census Day is April 1, 1980.

Mr. Moseley said the address collection phase of the census operation will take several months to complete. Also involved are checks of the lists to make sure all area dwelling addresses are included.

Census workers will drive or walk thousands of miles of streets and roads asking at each household for a correct mailing address. These address lists play a vital role in taking an accurate census since they are used to record completed questionnaires returned by mail. Households which do not mail back a completed census-form within several weeks after Census Day in 1980 will receive a visit from a census taker who will interview householders for the information required on the questionnaire.

**1979 Tractor Pull At SW Farm Show Dated March 8-11**

FORT WORTH (Special) — Tractor and truck pulling will be at its roaring and rumbling best during the four-day Southwest Championship Tractor Pull, March 8 through 11 in the Tarrant County Convention Center arena.

R. B. Allen, executive vice president of the Southwest Hardware & Implement Association, said that the pull will be held in connection with the Southwest Farm Show which will feature over 250 thousand square feet of exhibits of farm and ranch machinery and supplies.

Allen said that the championship tractor pull will add two classes of 4-wheel drive trucks on Thursday and Friday nights along with regular classes of tractors all four nights.

The championship tractor pull will begin at 7 p.m. March 8, 9 and 10 and 6 p.m. on Sunday.

Classes included this year will be: Thursday, March 8, 5,500-lb. modified trucks, 10,000-lb. pro-stock, 5,000-lb. super stock; Friday, March 9, 6,000-lb. modified trucks, 5,000-lb. modified, 9,000-lb. super stock; Saturday, March 10, 12,000-lb. pro-stock, 9,000-lb. modified, 12,000-lb. super stock; Sunday, March 11, 7,000-lb. super stock, 7,000-lb. modified and 12,000-lb. open.

All seats are reserved for the four nights of pulling and tickets may be purchased from Amusement Ticket Service, P.O. Box 938, Fort Worth, Texas 76101 or by calling 817-335-5777.

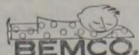

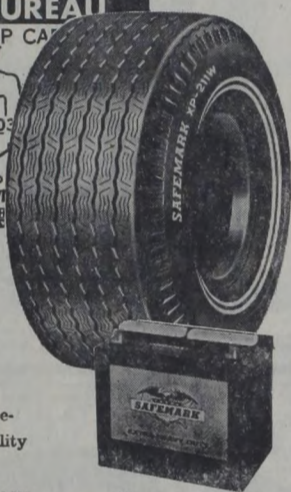

**Snakes Are Friends of Man**

Thank goodness for snakes. Those who suffer from herpetophobia — the fear of snakes — will be dubious, but the truth is that snakes are very helpful creatures, according to the current issue of Ranger Rick's Nature Magazine.

Because they eat rodents, insects, and other pests, both poisonous and harmless snakes are a special friend of the farmer, says the children's monthly published by the National Wildlife Federation.

All snake venoms are comprised of enzymes that attack a bitten victim's nerves, blood, or muscles. Scientists are now able to isolate some of these enzymes to fight disease.

Cobroxin, an enzyme from cobra venom, is a powerful painkiller for patients suffering from arthritis, cancer, or leprosy.

Venom from a snake called Russell's viper is used to treat hemophilia, a blood plasma defect that prevents normal clotting. On the other hand, says Ranger Rick, an enzyme from another viper's venom helps dissolve blood clots that can cause heart attacks and strokes.

While some poisonous snakes help fight disease — about 210 of the world's 2,600 species are poisonous — others help fight crime. Like watchsnakes. A gas station owner in Virginia employs a six-foot boa constrictor to patrol his station after hours. He hasn't had any trouble with prowlers lately.

And at a jewel exhibit in Stockholm, Sweden, three of the world's deadliest snakes were put inside the display case which held the "Star of Lanka," a gem then valued at \$429,000. No burglar alarms were needed.

**1978 Farm Census Reports Are Due**

Farmers and ranchers are reminded that the deadline of the 1978 Census of Agriculture report forms is February 15.

A large proportion of those who received forms nationwide already has mailed them back in postage paid envelopes, according to the Bureau of the Census, U.S. Department of Commerce, which is conducting the census. Those who have not done so are urged to return the forms by the deadline.

Bureau officials say they cannot extend the due dates for filing the forms except in individual cases where undue burden is involved, but they note that best estimates will be acceptable from operators lacking records.

Assistance also may be obtained from county officials who are prepared to answer questions which may arise regarding the form. These include agricultural agents, executive directors of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, supervisors in USDA's Soil Conservation Service, and Vocational agriculture instructors.

The Census Bureau is mailing follow-up letters asking prompt return of the forms, noting that cooperation is required by law, delay

sharply increases the costs, but, more important, a true picture of the Nation's agricultural industry cannot be achieved until the forms are in.

Tabulation of results for a state cannot start until virtually all the forms have been returned. Data for each of more than 3,000 counties will be published on a schedule calling for early release of county statistics beginning in October and continuing through March 1980, followed by publication of state and national data within the next two years.

A "Were You Counted?" publicity campaign has been launched by the Bureau in an effort to locate any farmer or rancher who may have been inadvertently missed in the census. 

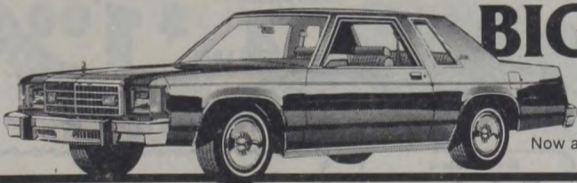
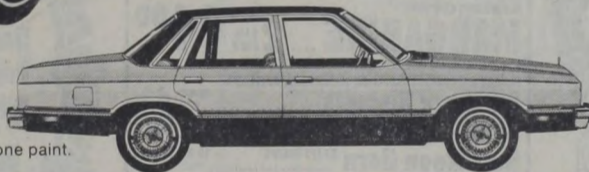
