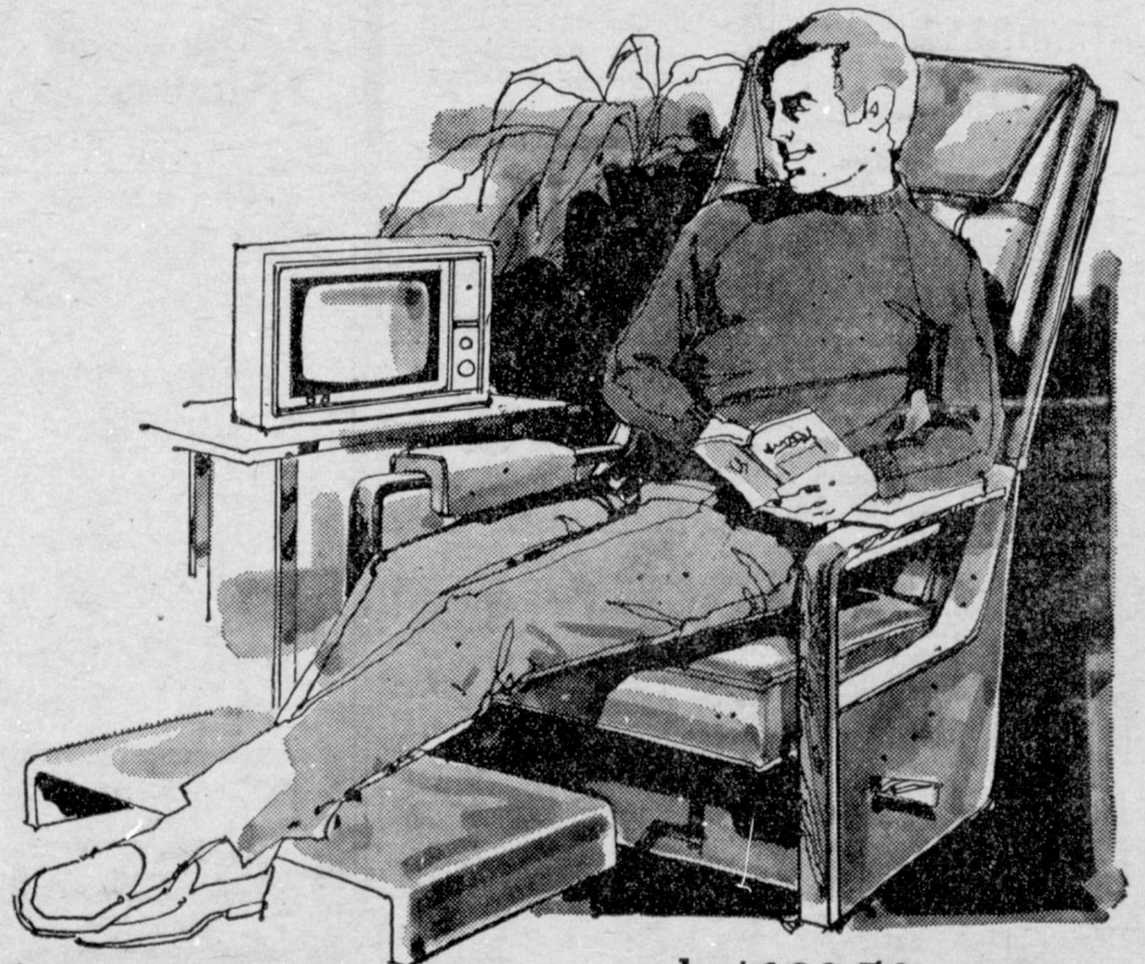

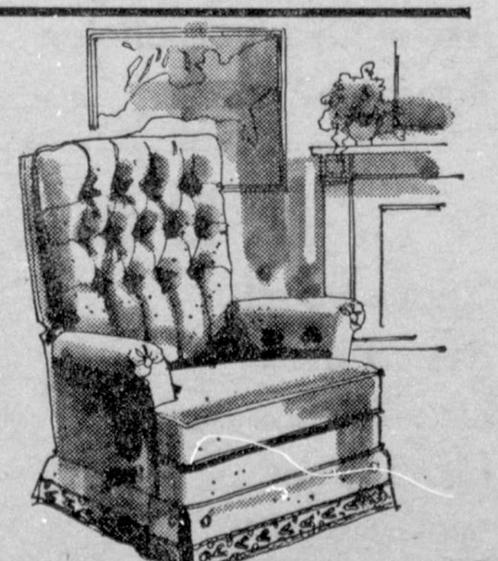

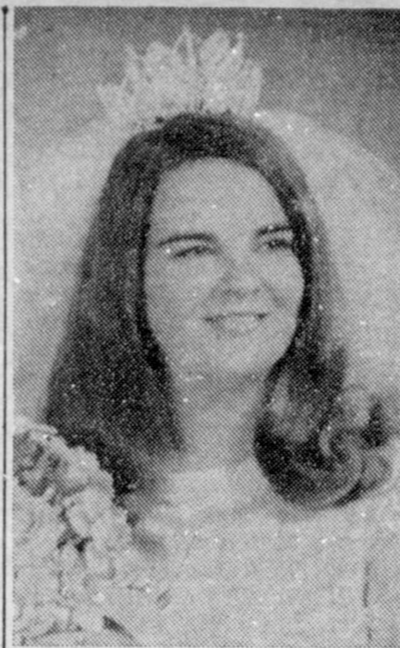

Save Stamps Says Sister Theresina

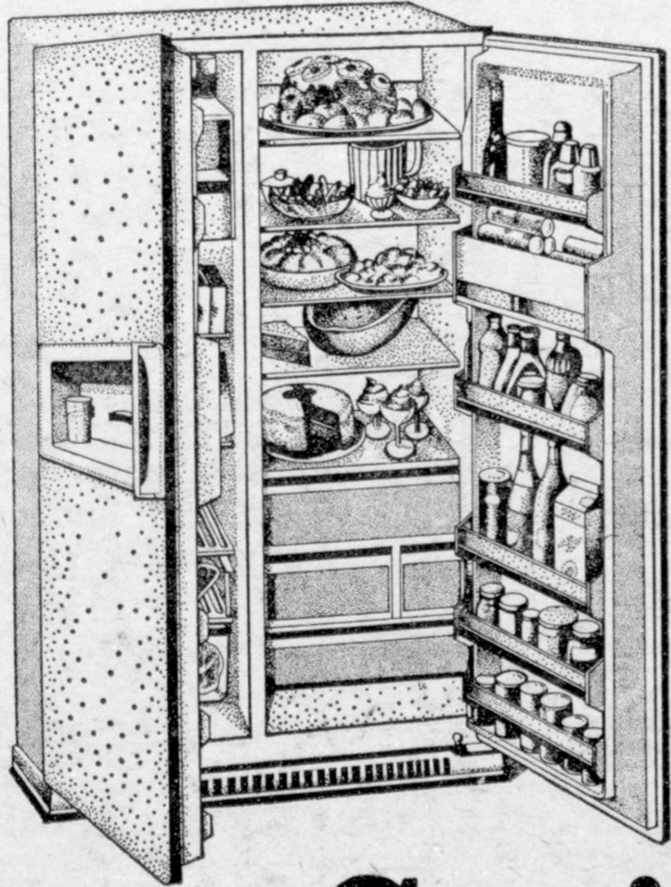

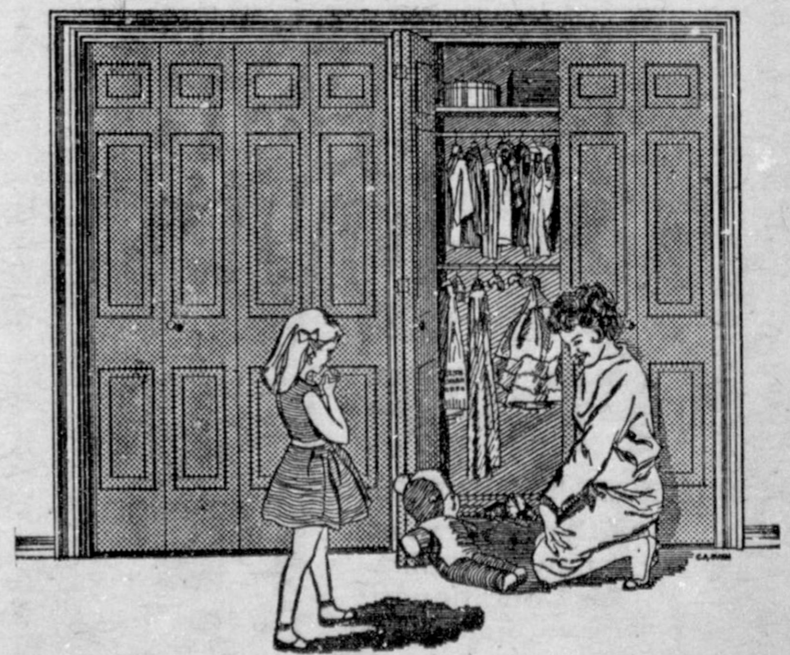
