Ronnie Hess Tries To Top Brother's Distance Running

DENTON — Running track at North Texas State University, Ronnie Hess of Muenster competes not only with runners from other schools but also with the track record of his older brother Tom.

Ronnie describes Tom, who is now in the Army, as an "outstanding" runner. "I see if I can outdo him at comparable ages," Ronnie said, adding that he thinks he is doing "a little better" than his brother so far.

He said he has run the mile in 4:25 minutes, compared to his brother's time of 4:30 at the same age. He also said his brother won the North Texas Marathon twice.

Ronnie, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Ray Hess, placed fifth in the North Texas Marathon last year and second in the White-rock Marathon. He said he also hopes to compete in the national Indoor Conference meet this summer.

A sophomore, he has been at North Texas for three semesters. He previously attended Eastern New Mexico University on a scholarship. While there he lettered in cross-country.

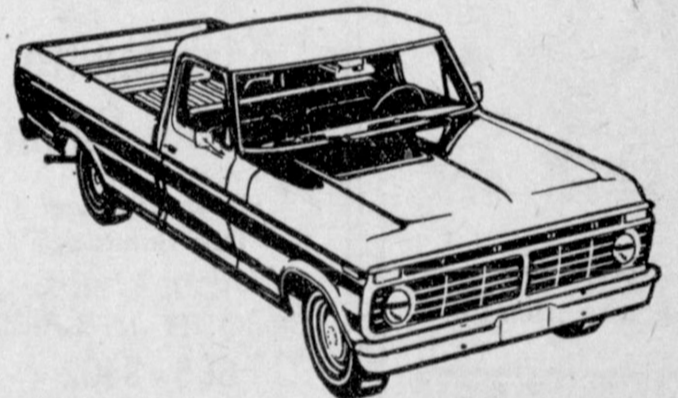
"But I always wanted to go here," he said. He is now in the steeplechase and the three- and six-mile run and expects to get another scholarship this fall.

He runs from three to five miles four or five mornings a week on his own, and he runs from 10 to 15 miles in the afternoons as part of the team workout.

"I think I'm in the best shape I've ever been in," he said, "but there's different competition from high school."

He said Tom is trying out for the Army track team and eventually wants to return to school for his master's degree and then go into coaching. Ronnie, who is a P.E. major and biology minor, plans to coach track after graduating from North Texas, probably at the high school or junior college level.

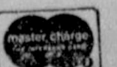

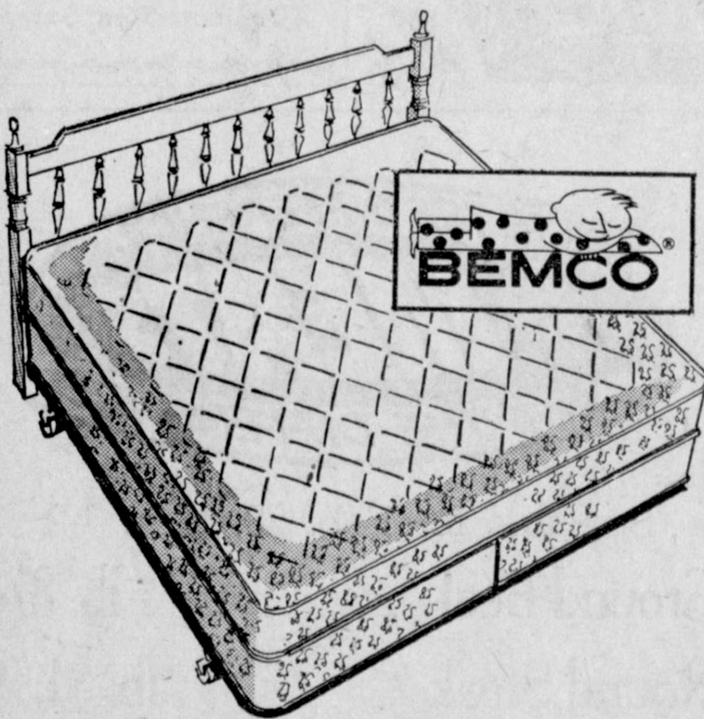

SS Office Asks For Prompt Notice Of Address Change

"Every day people come in to our office, or telephone us, because they haven't received their social security check," said Gus Jones of the Sherman Social Security Office. "Upon questioning, we are likely to find out that the person has moved recently and failed to notify us of the new address."

It is impossible to overemphasize the importance of promptly notifying the Social Security Administration, as well as the Post Office, of any change of address.

Notice can be given by mail, telephone, or in person at any social security office. The caller should be able to furnish his social security claim number (the social security number of the person on whose account he gets benefits) as well as his new address — which includes the zip code.

The Social Security Office in Sherman is located at 810 N. Travis. Their office hours are from 8:30 a.m. to 4:45 p.m., Monday through Friday.

A representative may be contacted in Gainesville each Tuesday and Thursday from 9:30 a.m. to 12 noon and 12:45 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Federal Building in Room 1-B.

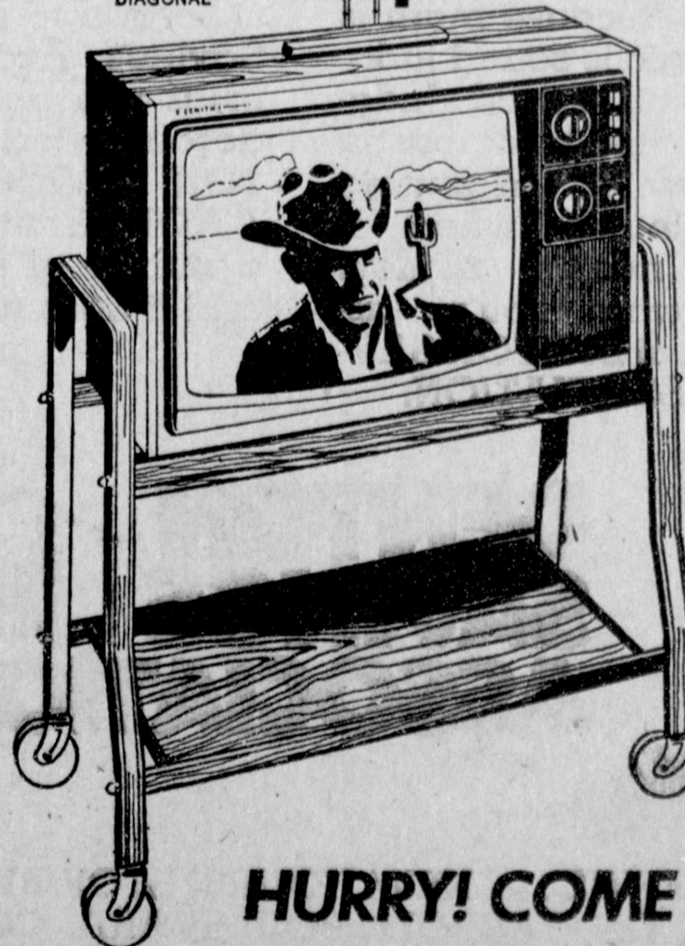
