ORDIN ANCE NO. 23.
An Qrdinance declaring the streete and avenues of Amarillo to be public thorough fares and providing for the working and ifmprovement of the same.
Section 1. Be it ordained by the city council of the City of Amarillo: That the several streets and avenues of the City of Amarillo be and the same are hereby deelared to be public thorougfares and shall be worked and improved as hereinafter provided.

Section 2. All male persons between the agns of elghteen and forty-five years shall be liable, and it is hereby made their duty to work on, repair and cleall out the streets and avenues of this city under the movisions of this Ordinance, except ministers of the gospel a the active discharge of their ministerial duties and invalids who shall be exempt. But no person shall be compelled to work oft any street or avenue who has not been residing in this city for the space of fifteen days immediately preceding such summons.
Section 3. Any person li able to street work duty, and who has been summoned to slich duty, shall have the privi leges to futuish an able-bodied substitute to work in his place which substitute shall be accepted by the street committee if he is capable of performing a reasonable amount of work; otherwise he shall not be accepted. Every person liable to work on the streets and avAnues by paying to the street committee at any time beiore the day appointed to work on the streets and avenues, the sum of one dollar for each day that he is summoned to work, shall be exempt from working for each day paid for and also exempt from any penalty for failure to work for the time for which te has paid
Section.4. Each person sum moned to work on a street or avende shall take with him an ax, hoe, pick, spade or such fool as he is desired and direc ted by the street committee or if he have no such lool as he is desired and directed by The street committee to take with him he shall take such wther suitable tool as he may have.
Section 5. It shall be the duty of each street hand to perform his duties as such in accordance with the directions of the street commitree or any member tnereof, and a day's work within the meaning of this ordinance shath be. eight hours efficient service when -aid service is voluntarily per formed. And fituemson, slall he compelled to work on any street or arenue of this eaty
more than five days in each year.
Section 6. That the street committee is hereby constituted supervisors of the streets and avenues in this city, and they shall supervise sa streets and avenues as oft, as may be necessary, and she
receive as compensation ther fur dollars per day for the time actually employed in the discharge of ther dutie to be paid out of the nere fund of the city; provided, that no member of said committee shall receive pay for more than ten days in each year The street committee shall also make a report to the first regular meeting of the city council held in the year, said report to be made under oath and to state-

1. The condition of all streets and avenues in the city.
. The condition of all culverte gutters and bridges;
2. The amount of money remaining on hand subject 10 be expended upon the streets and avenues.
Said report shall be spread upon the minutes of the council, to be considered in improving the streets and avenues and determing the amount of taxes to be levied therefor.
Section 7. The general laws of tois state defining the pow. ers and prescribing the duties of road overseers, in so far as the same are applicable, shall apply to and govern the street committee in the performance of their duties as supervisors of the streets and avenues of this city, where such powers and duties are not otherwise defined by this or any other ordinance of the city.
Section 8. If any person iable under this ordinance to work upon the streets and avenues of this city shall wilfully fail or refuse to attend, either by person or by able and coimpetent substitute, at the time and place designated by the street committee, after being legally summoned, or shall fail, on or before the day for whrch be is summoned to attend, to pay to such street committee the sum of one dollar per day for each day he may have been notified to work on the streets and avenues, or, having attended, shall fail to perform any duty required of him by this ordinance and such street committee, he shall be fined in any sum not less than one nor mure than ten dollars Section 9. This ordinaner shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
