



Ochiltree County Sheriff Terry Bouchard said he received a complaint Monday that the man attempted to pull a child into his residence. Bouchard said two small children were playing in the back yard of the apartment building where the man lives. The man allegedly contacted the children and one ran to get their mother, who was nearby, Bouchard said. The mother told police that when she went to investigate, the suspect had the child by one arm. The mother grabbed the child and called the sheriff's office, Bouchard said.

The suspect was arrested on a charge of aggravated kidnapping and remains in jail today, Bouchard said.

He said the suspect, who has not yet been arraigned, was released from prison about three years ago after having served about 20 years for a sex offense.

Texas Crop & Weather



Doggett called the state's lawsuit "political theater" and said that all Gov. Rick Perry had to do to get the money was sign the funding application as written. Texas' application required the governor to assure that the federal money could only be spent to employ and pay teachers.

In addition to Abbott, Texas' legal challenge also names Gov. Perry, Lt. Gov. David Dewhurst, House Speaker Joe Straus, Education Commissioner Robert Scott and the State of Texas as petitioners.

Meanwhile, Perry is supporting legislation filed by U.S. Sen. Kay Bailey Hutchison and U.S. Rep. Michael Burgess, Lewisville, that would repeal Doggett's amendment. If Congress passes the legislation, it may be unnecessary for the state to proceed with the legal challenge.





Words from Faith & Grace

How can we find God in suffering as well as on the

mountain top of faith? We study Habakkuk 1: 1-2: 4 Psalm 37: 1-9, 2 Timothy 1: 1-14, and Luke 17: 5-10. The prophet Habakkuk struggles with the idea that God has shown him that the 'chosen people' have done evil and are about to be defeated by an even more evil people. The answer is found in loving God, not just in

loving the blessings that God gives. The theme is, "the righteous shall live by faith". So when the law becomes slack and justice never prevails, the wicked surround the righteous and justice becomes perverted. The Hebrew word "mishpat" means both 'justice' and 'judgment' God's people have become so corrupt that their 'judgment' is no longer 'justice'. Habakkuk is told to write the words of the vision on a tablet. This means that the promise God is giving is preserved that the people my read it and be convicted of their evil deeds yet the faithful will be sustained by this same writing as they await the fulfillment of God's promise. In good times and in bad times, the righteous, those who live by faith, are sustained by God's word.

The Psalmist sings a wisdom song. It is a song of an older man who has become wiser with age. The Psalmist does not sing as in a 1980's song, "Don't worry, be happy" rather the Psalmist sings, "Don't worry, Trust in God". The righteous live by faith.

Paul leaves his "testament" to Timothy as he prepares to die for the sake of the gospel. Paul reminds Timothy that he is the product of a family of faith which is dedicated to God. Paul reminds Timothy that Paul has laid his hands on Timothy just as Moses laid his hands on Joshua to indicate his succession to leadership. Timothy is to carry on the gospel even to the point that the adversary embraces Jesus Christ. Finally, Paul reminds Timothy that there is eternal glory for the believer who is faithful. The righteous live by faith.

Jesus has previously told his disciples to beware of becoming a stumbling block for the young. Jesus has told them that the disciple life is hard. The disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith. Instead, Jesus tells them that if they had faith the size of a mustard seed they could say to a mulberry tree, be uprooted and planted in the sea, and it would obey. He then tells them that a slave is not 'thanked' for doing what is commanded. This seems harsh, but it teaches us that we cannot put God in our debt. We are not 'earning' our salvation. By God's grace, Jesus died for our sins upon a cross, so that by faith in Him we are 'righteous' [in a right relationship with God]. Dear Christian, we live by faith whether in good times or in bad, whether in adulation or persecution. It is the love of God which sustains us as we live our disciple life in faith.

May the Holy Spirit keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus that you may be made "righteous" by your

I, as well as other people in the Spearman, Gruver, and Morse communities, have close ties with people living in the Rocky Ford and La Junta, Colorado, area. I was born and raised there. I am sure others, like myself, have heard from very reliable sources an account of what happened at Rocky Ford that is different from what was reported. People who were close to the incident tell a much different version than the original news release. Yes, David Johnson did talk to the Rocky Ford woman, but he did not threaten the woman or the children and he did not take the woman hostage. These details may seem of little importance to some and do not change the final outcome of this very tragic incident, but to me make a difference!

I pray God will help us to be slow to judge, yet quick to help share the burden of another's heavy load. Please continue to pray that God will comfort and give strength to this family as they try to go on with their life!





The Texas Tech newspaper started in 1925 after the founding of Texas Technological College in 1923. In 1965, the name changed to The University Daily and then changed again to its current name The Daily Toreador in

The publication is available in print, e-mail, and web formats (www.dailytoreador.com).

Although two faculty advisers watch over the operations of the newspaper, the dayto-day decisions for the newspaper rest on the student staff. The advisers choose not to restrict the content that is placed in the paper, but instead make suggestions and give advice to the editorial board.

The newspaper prints Monday-Friday, and has around 2,000 to 5,000 unique visitors per day to its Web site, continually making it one of the top-25 read college news-
