Spearman Swimming Pool To Open

The City of Spearman has announced that the Spearman Swimming Pool's 2001 Season will begin on Monday, May 28th. Hours will be Monday-Saturday from 1:00-5:00 p.m. and Sunday from 2:00-5:00 p.m. The cost for children up to 12 years old will be \$1.00, 13 years and older will be \$1.50. A season pass for children up to 12 years of age is \$40.50, and a season pass for children 13 years of age and older is \$60.75. Passes are rated 50¢ less each day for 12 and under, and 75¢ less each day for 13 and older, and are available through June 30th. The swimming pool is available for rent for \$50.00, with a two hour minimum. Family night will be held again on Thursday nights from 7:00-10:00 p.m. The pool will close for the season on August 17th.

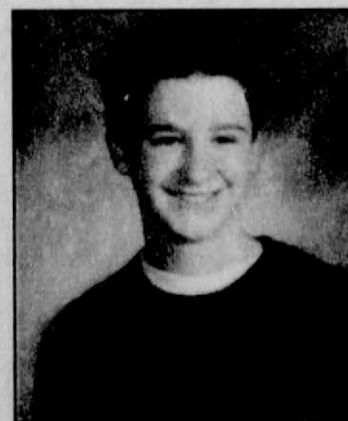

Blowin' In The Wind

The Challenge will be accepted. The Showtime Car Club has finished restoration of the Challenge 27 windmill, and it will be erected in the Windmill Park as soon as K & K Pipeline Construction of White Deer can be scheduled in Spearman. Although restored by the car club, the Challenge will be the property of the Southwest Pioneer Windmill Association and will be a very visible landmark in the Windmill Park.

There is a possibility that the mill will be erected on Friday, May 25. KRDF will be informed when the mill is to be set up. I believe that it will be worth the time to see this mill set up. Location of the mill will be in the south central part of the park.

The Challenge is a twelve-foot mill on a 35-foot tower. The mill will stand about 45 feet to the top of its galvanized bonnet. Top of the wheel will be approximately 50 feet in the air. K & K Pipeline Construction has a large industrial-sized crane that will be required to lift the tall and heavy mill and tower into place in the Windmill

Park. K & K is from White Deer, and strangely enough, the Challenge 27 is from a ranch a few miles north of White Deer.

In other SPWA notes, the windmill board met on Monday of last week and heard reports from the landscape and convention committees.

The landscape committee is going to develop plans for the Windmill Park that will complement the mills now there and future mills to be erected. Plans now are in the formulation stage with such features as drip irrigation, walking paths, entrance way, parking, etc. to be incorporated into the plan.

The convention committee is presently getting together items that will be a part of the SPWA's presentation at Comstock, Nebraska, June of 2001, that is expected to culminate in a decision by the Windmills' Trade Fair to come to Spearman in June, 2002.

The Dempster Model 11 at First State Bank that was damaged in the windstorm several weeks ago was taken down to reunite the engine and its wheel only to find

there was severe internal damage, and the head will need rebuilding. That rebuilding process is under-

way, and, hopefully, the Dempster will be back bank side before long.

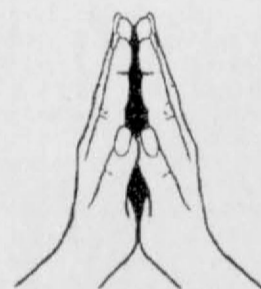

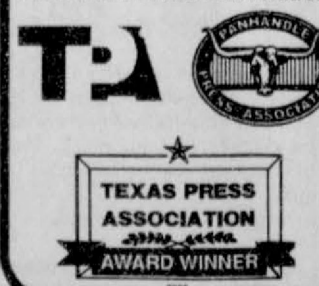

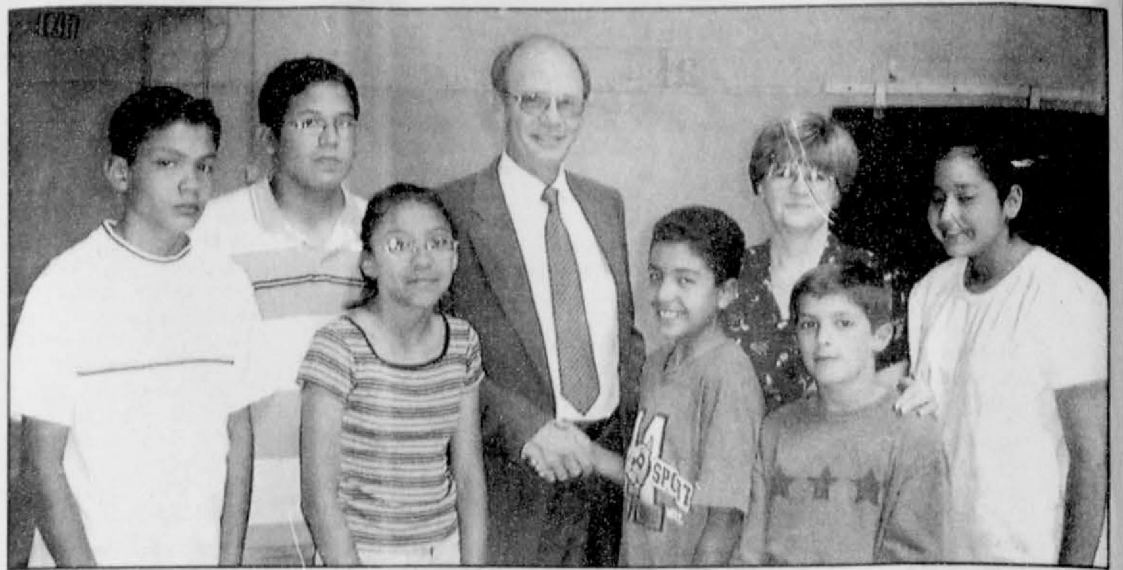
Son Clint, also a student at WTAMU, is to be married on June 8th. His studies and marriage plans keep him busy.

Audrey Winegarner. The Outstanding Lynx award went to Kevin Beedy.

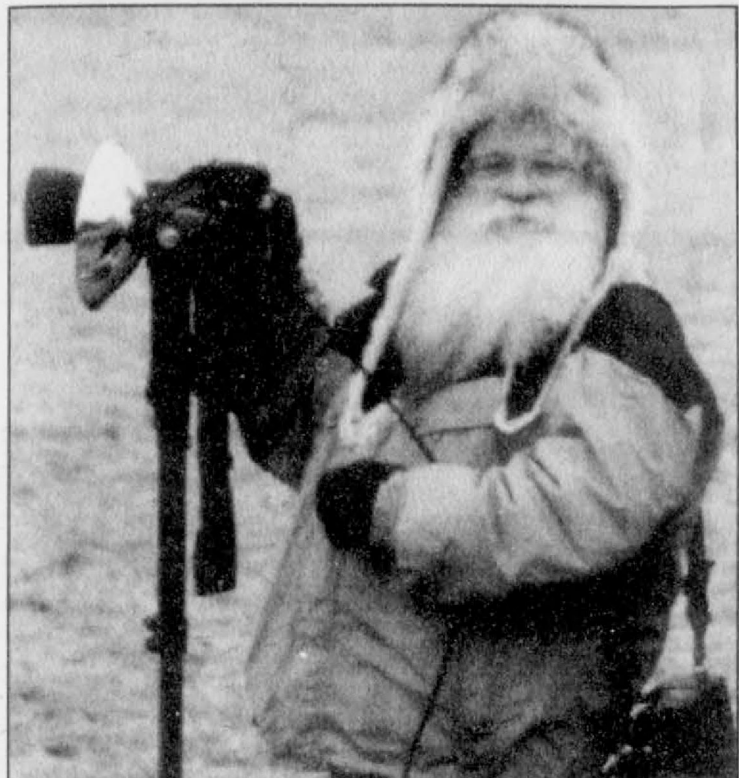

David & Nona Payne Foundation Awards Grant To Public Radio

The Board of Trustees of the David D. and Nona S. Payne Foundation, Inc. has approved a grant of \$15,000 to High Plains Public Radio.

The award is specified to be used to construct a new 100,000 watt noncommercial FM transmitter which will extend the broadcast area of the radio station into the northeast Texas Panhandle area. The grant from the Pampa based foundation was announced on April 19. The funds will be used for the purchase of the required broadcast equipment, including construction of an 800 foot tower to be located approximately 25 miles south and west of Perryton.

The project has a total budget of \$712,000, and more than 90% of that total has been raised, according to Skip Mancini, Project Director. "The David and Nona Payne Foundation award is so important because it puts us into the final 10% of funds to be raised to complete the project," Mancini recently told representatives of six area fundraising groups. The committees are located in Spearman, Perryton, Canadian, Miami, Pampa, and Borger, and have been engaged in a capital campaign that began in mid-January. Campaign coordinators hope to complete the fund raising portion of the project during the month of May, in order to stay on a projected timeline of providing on-air service by early 2002.

The capital campaign committees are requesting funds from individuals and businesses, as well as other local foundation and corporate sources, in the coverage area. Contributions to the capital campaign are tax deductible, can be pledged over a period of time, and will include a first-year membership to High Plains Public Radio. Area residents can hear a sample of HPPR programming on

CD and pick-up information on the planned station at local libraries and chamber of commerce buildings in the service area. They can also listen to actual broadcasts at 94.9 and 91.3 FM when in the immediate Amarillo area. Brochures, coverage maps and other information about the project can also be received by contacting High Plains Public Radio and the Top O' Texas Public Radio Project at 1-800-678-7444.

The new station will provide service to approximately 106,000 residents of 9 counties of the Northeast Texas Panhandle including Carson, Gray, Hansford, Hemphill, Hutchinson, Lipscomb, Roberts, Ochiltree, and Wheeler counties. Programming will include in-depth news, classical, jazz and folk music, and coverage of regional events and issues. It will broadcast 24 hours a day at 89.5 FM from the centrally located tower. High Plains Public Radio is a non-commercial service, supported largely by listener memberships. It is a full member of National Public Radio, and carries

award winning news and entertainment programs such as All Things Considered, Morning Edition and a Prairie Home Companion. High Plains Public Radio currently serves Western Kansas, portions of Southeastern Colorado and the Oklahoma Panhandle, and Amarillo.

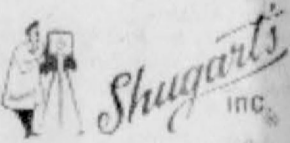
