

Family gatherings. Tokens of thanks and gifts of joy. Food overflowing the tables. Logs crackling softly in the distance. Holidays trigger happy memories with every sight and sound. But it is precisely at these happy times when the loss of a loved one can be feit the strongest. If s a time to remember what is missing.

'Rather than being times of family togetherness, sharng and thanksgiving, the holidays can bring feelings of sadness, loss and emptiness for many people who have experienced death," according to Dr. Alan Wolfelt, noted author and grief educator.

"Since love does not end with death, holidays can enew this sense of personal grief, a feeling of loss unlike that experienced in the routine of daily living. And, though society encourages everyone to join in the holiday spirit, it can be hard, as memories of the one who has died come rushing back with full force.

In addition to clergy, many people turn to their community funeral home director for information on coping with grief. Funeral directors continue their services beyond the uneral itself and are an excellent resource for books, free pamphlets, seminars, workshops and special programs around the holidays.

No simple guidelines exist to take away hurt, but some hings can be done to help people better cope with grief during this joyful, yet painful, time of year.

Healing is a personal experience that takes time. So, be tolerant and compassionate with yourself as you continue to heal.

Dr. Wolfelt serves as director of the Center for Loss and ife Transition in Fort Collins, CO, and has authored several books on understanding and coping with grief.

We might not be able to end hunger in the world today, but in God's name, let us not forget.





Spearman traveled to Plainview Spearman traveled to Plainview on a beautiful night for football to take on the Pied Pipers of Hamlin in the area game of the high school playoffs. Spearman has been no stranger to the playoffs the last few years and that experience paid off Friday night. The Lynx found out early that they could run right at Hamlin and that is what they did as they won the game 29-17. On 4th down, Brock ran off tackle for a first down at the 1 yard line. Aaron Winegarner ran a bootleg around the left end on the next play for the touchdown with 4:06 left in the first quarter. Teddie Whitefield's PAT kick was good and the Lynx led 7-0.

Hamlin started their drive on their own 26. On 3rd and 10, Homer Munoz put the pressure on the QB and caused him to throw an incomplete pass and the Pipers had to punt. Spearman started on their own 49 after a short punt. The Lynx continued to grind it out on the ground. After all they were making 4 to 8 yards a carry so they didn't have to worry about going to the passing game. They drove down to the Hamlin 10 with a first and goal. Winegarner was sacked

for a big loss on 2nd and 7 back to the 18 yard line. Hamlin stopped the Lynx on 3rd and long, and the Lynx settled for a 28 yard field goal by Teddie Whitefield. That made the score 10-0 with 8:35 left in the first half.

The Pied Pipers started their next possession on their own 26 after being tackled by Edward Vasquez. Vasquez has done a great job on the kickoff because he is in on almost every tackle on the kickoffs. Hamlin could not move the ball and went 3 and out and had to punt back to the Lynx. Spearman could not move the ball on this drive and had to give the ball back to the Pipers.

The half ended with the score 10-3 in favor of the Lynx.

Both teams could not move the ball on their next possessions and they exchanged punts. Hamlin started this drive on their own 19 yard line with :44 left in the third quarter. On the first play from scrimmage, the Pipers fumbled and Brock was there for the recovery at the Hamlin 24. Few plays later, Barber ran to the 1 yard line for a first down. Brock dove over the line on the next play for the TD with 10:13 left in the game. The PAT failed and the Lynx led 23-3.







At best, these ducks are uncommon in the Panhandle other seasons, but in the winter they are irregular, meaning not recorded every year but they may occur in numbers. It and the painted and indigo bunting are at the top of my list of "hope to see" birds.

Helen Fisher seems to think I should know what has happened to her house finches. Ours are gone, too, but I have a theory after reading Flavil Ayers letter in last week's paper. They are going where they are fed. They like sunflower seeds, with black ones first choice. Do you have a feeder out, Helen? I don't. Around 1 940 these pretty little

birds were being trapped in the West and sent to New York and sold as "Hollywood finches" to

live the rest of their lives in cages. This illegal practice was stopped by government agents. All native American species are protected by the Migratory Bird Treaty that bans their capture and sale.


