They are patrons of the outdoor musical, Texas. They are sponsors for the Circle of Friends for the Don & Sybil Harrington Cancer Center. Locally they support the Spearman and Gruver Fire Departments, The Stationmaster's House Museum, the Church of Christ Children's Home, the Hansford Hospice, the Golden Spread Senior Center and the empty stocking fund for Hansford Manor. They buy ads for the Spearman, Gruver, & Pringle-Morse yearbooks and for the area football and basketball books.

They have pastured cattle for the benefit of the O'Loughlin Center, bought the "floor" at the Hansford Stock Show and donated acreage for hunting to the Rotary Club's annual pheasant hunt. They were probably the only members the Gruver PTA has ever had with a Spearman address. These two were instrumental in furnishing and installing the pew racks for

The Archers have lived in Hansford County for a combined total of 142 years. Carl was born here, and Peggy got here as fast as she could! They have built a home, a business, but mostly a life here.

Carl grew up in a family of 5 boys. Both of his parents came to Hansford County in their very early years. His mother in a

Their business, Speartex Grain Co., employs about 30 people, but in the past their employees have numbered over 60. Mr. Archer has served on the scholarship committee for Spearman High School and has, in fact, given two \$500 scholarships to deserving students for several years.

Many years ago when the Adobe Walls Boy Scout Council needed tents for their scouts, this fellow was more than happy to give them the money for them - provided the Spearman boys got first shot at using them. The Pampa council really wanted to check out the tents to area scouts

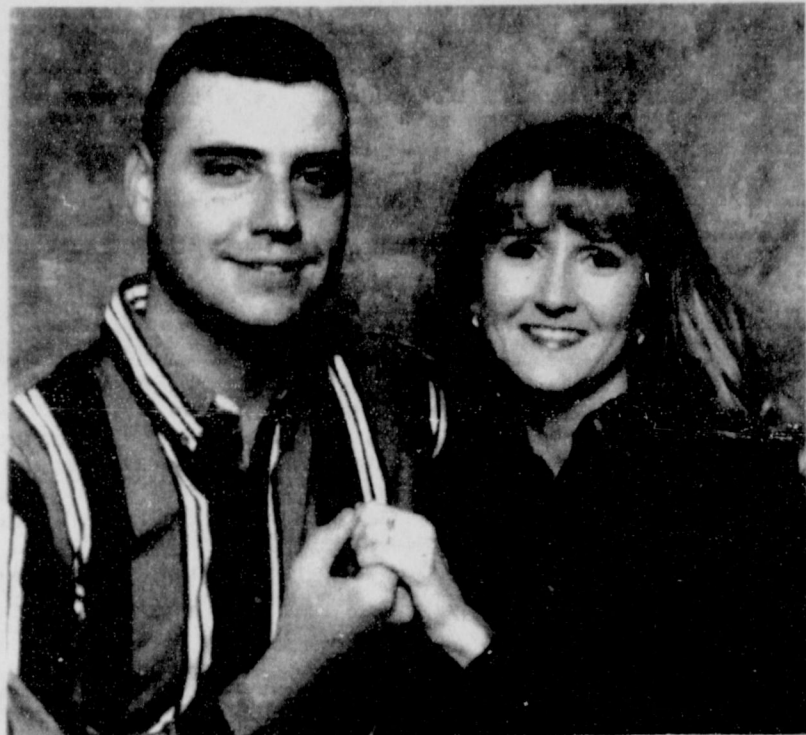


Engagement Announcement

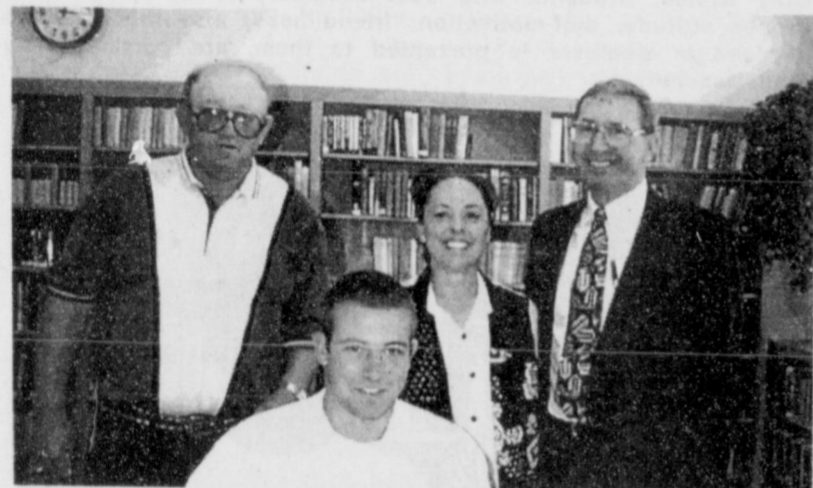

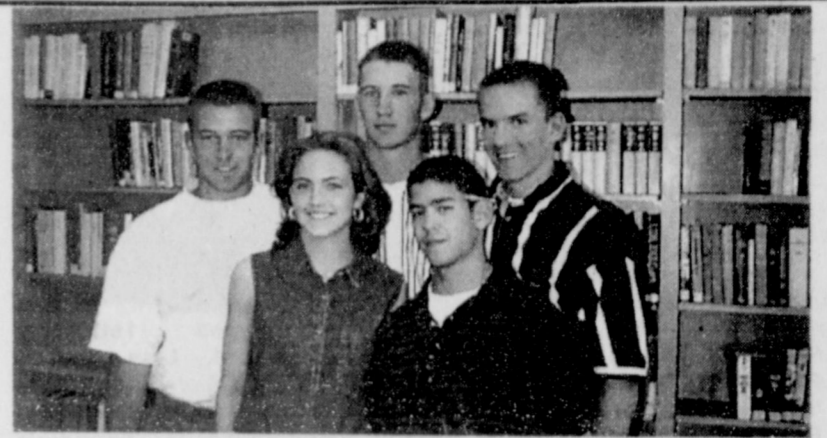

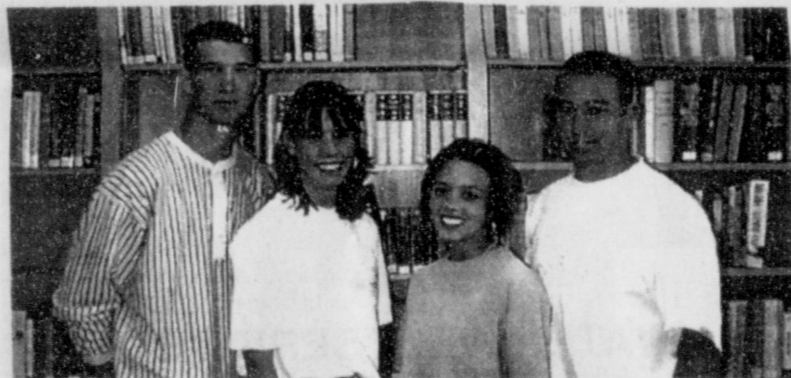

Extension News

by Peggy Winegarner, County Extension Agent

A typical child watches four hours of TV a day. If a child from age 2 through 12 devotes one hour of that time to watching informational and educational programs it would add 2,860 hours of useful learning or equivalent time of two years spent in school.

The goal of local FCE clubs, as well as FCE clubs state and nationwide, is for children to watch "better" not "more" TV.

By high school age, many children have spent more hours in front of the TV than in the classroom. It has been estimated that during the school years, children will witness up to 87,000 acts of violence on TV. Uncontrolled TV viewing by children can be linked to increased violent and aggressive behavior, obesity and poor academic results.

Whenever possible, watch TV with your child and question the use of violence. Talking together

as a family about TV programs and advertisements can provide opportunities to discuss your values.

Television is the third educational institution -- after school and home. For this reason, FCE clubs are encouraging parents to enforce a "first hour rule". The first hour of viewing must be positive and high quality. Reading the TV guide can help you choose suitable programs. Find programs that educate, inform, enlighten or inspire.

If you are concerned about the amount of violence and want to see a change for better programs, write to your congressman, senator, the Federal Communications Commission, and advertising sponsors, expressing what you see as violent and nonviolent. Only 5% or fewer of U.S. parents express to program sources their disapproval of programming to children.

Your voice can make a difference. Put television to work for your children.
