Post Office Hosts Celebration

May 26, 1999 is the first day the Celebrate The Century - 1950's Commemorative Stamp souvenir sheet will be issued. To commemorate the event, the Spearman Post Office will offer a pictorial cancellation on that day.

People attending the event may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary Celebrate The Century - 1950's Station located in front of the Spearman Post Office. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. The pictorial cancellation is available only for May 26th, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date (the cancellation device will be sent in for destruction at that time). Items submitted for cancellation must bear at least the minimum First-Class postage (33 centers per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in the envelope for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to:

The person to guess the total dollar value of the stamps contained in the display without going over will win a Celebrate The Century T-Shirt. In 1967, Cates Men and Boys Wear moved to its present location, 221 S. Main Street, and in 1980, they bought old bank build-



While the Lions Club is serving hamburgers from 11:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. at the Post Office, the Retail Merchants will be selling Coke Floats. "Elvis" will provide the entertainment.

Anyone wishing to participate in the 1950's dress-up contest should make an appearance at the Post Office between 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. as the judging will be held during that time. Certificates of \$10, \$15 and \$10 in Hansford Bucks will be awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners.

Also at 11:00 a.m. there will be a stilts contest, stilts will be provided.
