After attending classes in Vemon, Sargent said he was able to market some e raian and make more money than if he hadn't had the class.
"Taking the class is like any "Aaking the class is slike any other tool," he said. "You have to leam
use it and once ou use it, there's always a chance of upside profit. It was worth the price of the class."
With markets so volatie
With markets so volatile, Sargent said he wanted a way to lock in prices because they change so rapidly. By taking the class, not only did he get to hear experrs on the futures market, but
