In the second half of last Friday's night game (Gruver's Homecoming), Texhoma discovered that the "Men In Black" do not give up. It was a close game between Gruver and the Texhoma Red Devils. Everyone on the field and in the stands was focused on the game as tension was high on both sides.

The first quarter of the game was all Texhoma as Justin Ray scored on a 16-yard run, and Brian Clark caught a 14-yard touchdown pass from Mike Kibbe. After that, the Greyhounds made sure that Texhoma didn't score again.

Gruver came back in the third quarter as Brant Armes scored a touchdown for the Greyhounds on a 10-yard run. In the fourth quarter, T.J. McClure blocked a punt and recovered the ball in the

end zone, giving Gruver six more points, lowering Texhoma's lead to 14-13. However, Texhoma stopped the following two-point conversion attempt.

In the final minutes of the fourth quarter, Gruver received one last chance to score, and it all came down to a touchdown pass. It was not completed, but it was close.

The final score ended at 14-13, Texhoma on top. Both teams earned 11 first downs and punted five times. Texhoma was penalized 10 times, as Gruver came one under that number with 9. Gruver had 254 total offensive yards, and Texhoma had 207.

Even though Gruver didn't win, the Homecoming was great. Michael Jackson proposed to Anne Potts during the fourth quarter. (She said yes.) Everyone in Gruver congratulates them.

There will be no baseball program in the Gruver Independent Schools for the 1997-98 school year. This was the ruling of the Gruver Independent School board on Monday night, September 15, 1997.

Approximately seventy people, including a large number of boys and girls, who are interested in playing, attended the meeting.

I can see reasons for not having a baseball program as well as reasons for having one. What bothers me is the division among people and the pain that this issue has caused.

Although I have never written a word about this issue, it was reported to me by our Gruver editor, Harletta Carthel, who was present at the meeting, that a board member stated that, "the newspaper had ridiculed and pressured him." I telephoned the person in question and he stated that he had, "never made such a statement." Clearly, emotions are running high concerning this problem.

I understand why parents would want to have as many opportunities as possible for their children. It is also understandable that school board members would want to use the funds of the district as wisely as possible. What I do not understand is why there has apparently been no attempt to come to some kind of compromise. From my vantage point, I just see people who are not willing to find any kind of middle ground. I think that it is very likely that this division reflects a division in the community. It is very probably not just a handful of board members against the rest of the town.

But, if young men and women want to participate in a sport, then members of the community, local elected officials included, should help them in their efforts. If elected officials refuse to respond to the parents and children of the community, then there is a remedy. If we do not like the actions of the people we elect, then perhaps we should keep that in mind when we go to the polls.

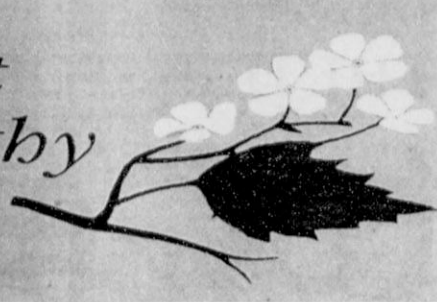

Focus On The Family

QUESTION: How can anxiety or emotional problems cause hyperactivity?
 DR. DOBSON: When adults are under severe stress or anxiety, their inner tension is typically expressed in the form of physical activity. An expectant father "paces the floor" or his hands may tremble. A basketball coach will race up and down the sidelines while the outcome of the game is in doubt. Another anxious person may sit quietly in a chair, but his fingernails will be chewed to the quick, or he will move his lower jaw slowly from side to side. My point is that tension increases the amount of bodily movement observed in adults.

How much more true that is of an immature child. He doesn't merely drum his fingers on a table when he is anxious; he tries to climb the curtains and walk on the ceiling.

QUESTION: How early can the problem be identified?
 DR. DOBSON: The severely hyperactive child can be recognized during early toddlerhood. In fact, he can't be ignored. By the time he is 30 months of age, he may have exhausted his mother, irritated his siblings and caused the grandparents to retire from baby-sitting duties. No family member is "uninvolved" with his problem. Instead of growing out of it, as the physician may promise, he continues to attack his world with the objective of disassembling it (at least until puberty).

grandchildren and great-grandchildren with reminiscing of bygone days.

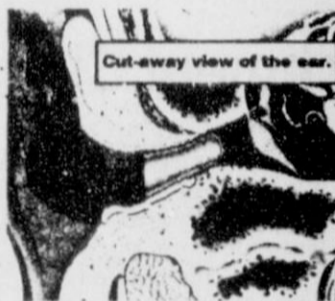
Olive Pendergraft had guests from Saturday to Tuesday last week.

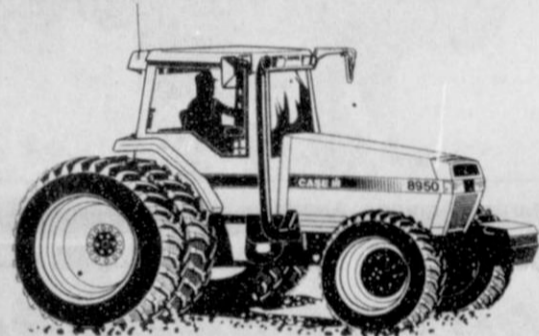

The Spearman Lynx totally dominated the Memphis Cyclones in their match-up at Lynx Stadium last Friday night. If the Lynx can stay healthy, this promises to be an exciting season.

Spearman had 21 first downs against the Cyclones, compared to Memphis' 10. The Lynx had 353 yards rushing and 81 yards passing, for a total of 434 yards, while holding the Cyclones to 140 yards. While Spearman held on to the ball well and did not have a fumble for the evening, the Cyclones fumbled four times. Three of the fumbles were recovered by the Lynx.

Aaron Winegarner, 160 pound sophomore quarterback, had a great night, passing for 89 yards

for three touchdowns, and rushing for 21 yards on three carries for one touchdown. Clancy Vanderburg, 190 pound junior guard, had the high-grade offense, completing 89% of his blocks. Brian Howell, 175 pound senior linebacker, had three unassisted tackles, eight assisted tackles, and one fumble recovery.

Winegarner, Vanderburg and Howell were named players of the week.

Michael Lusby and Aaron Witten also had outstanding stats, with Lusby carrying the ball 20 times for 150 yards, and Witten carrying 10 times for 120 yards. Dusty Barber had one carry for 34 yards, and Chuck Grayson had four carries for 20 yards. Lusby, Witten and Grayson all scored one touchdown each.

Clayton Wilkerson had two touchdown receptions on two catches for a total of 52 yards. Landon Miller had one catch for nine yards.

In the first two games of the season, the Lynx have averaged a total of 342 offensive yards per game, and 144 defensive yards per game.

The Lynx meet the Clarendon Broncos Friday night at 8:00 p.m. at the Lynx Stadium. This is Homecoming for the Lynx, with homecoming activities beginning at 7:30 p.m. The pep-rally will be held at 2:30 p.m. in the Varsity Gym. 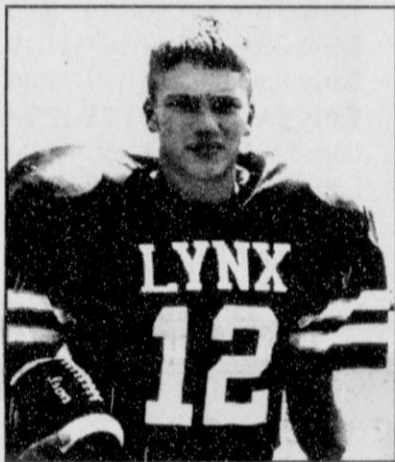

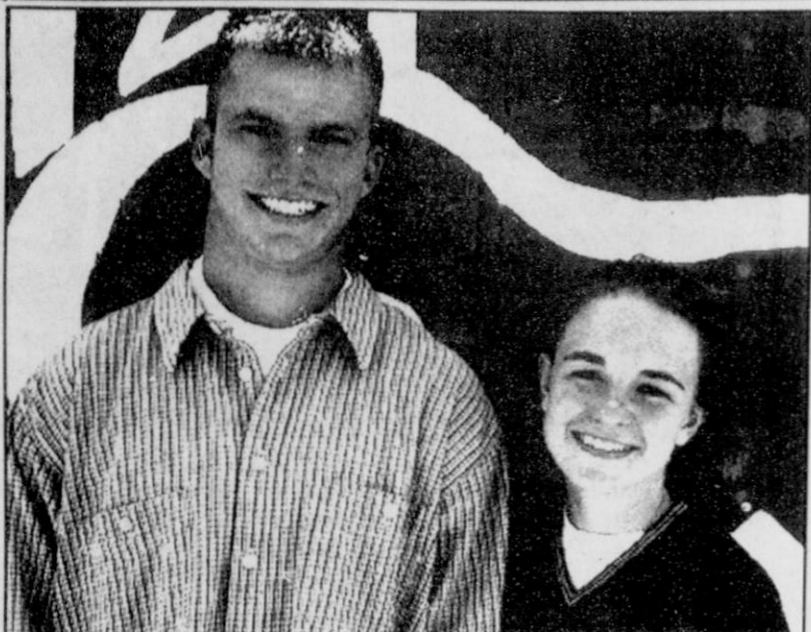

SISD Receives Grant for New Technology

Students and teachers of Spearman Independent School District will soon have additional access to resources and new technology made possible by money the district received through the TIF Grant.

The TIF Board released grants in the amount of \$25 million. In order to be considered for the grant, several steps had to be taken. First, schools had to apply and then form a collaborate effort. Of the sixty-five school districts that applied, only forty-six of them were eligible to apply for the grant. Of these forty-six school districts, forty-five met and formed a joint arrangement. Then, they filed an application with the Telecommunications Infrastructure Board for about \$7.9 million of the \$25 million available. The group received about \$6.1 million.

Locally, this grant means about \$200,000 for SISD that will be used for equipment and training. The first step of the plan will cover putting one computer in every core class and a computer in every class by January. Also, all the computers will have access to the internet. Changes and additions that have been made to accommodate this new technology include rewiring, staff training, and the purchase of printers.

With this addition of new technology, there comes a responsibility for both parents and students to know and follow the policy for the use of computers and networks that is included in the code of conduct issued to all students at the beginning of the school year.

P.I.E. Program Off To A Good Start

supply, water quality, flood control, or state participation from one category of use to another category to maximize the use of existing funds and relating to more efficient operation of the bond programs."

PROPOSITION NO. 8 ON THE BALLOT

House Joint Resolution 31 proposes a constitutional amendment which would authorize home equity lending, in which a loan could be secured by a lien against the borrower's homestead. The amendment would also establish several provisions providing for consumer protection in the home equity lending process.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment eliminating duplicate numbering in and certain obsolete provisions of the Texas Constitution."

PROPOSITION NO. 5 ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 19 proposes an amendment to allow the Supreme Court of Texas to hold sessions at any location in this state. Currently, the court is limited to holding sessions only at Austin, the seat of state government.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment authorizing the supreme court to sit to transact business at any location in this state."

PROPOSITION NO. 6 ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 39 proposes a constitutional amendment to repeal the current provision which provides that the board of the Texas Growth Fund may not invest money in a business unless the business has disclosed to the board whether it has any direct financial investment in or with South Africa or Namibia.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment allowing the Texas growth fund to continue to invest in businesses without requiring those businesses to disclose investments in South Africa or Namibia."

PROPOSITION NO. 7 ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 17 proposes a constitutional amendment to create the Texas Water Development Fund II as a fund separate and distinct from the Texas Water Development Fund. The amendment would authorize the Texas Water Development Board to administer the fund and issue general obligation bonds for purposes of the fund under guidelines set forth in the amendment.

The amendment would also allow the Board to use loan repayments coming into the fund after the end of the fiscal year to make bond debt service payments, and would provide certain conditions for the flow of funds for repayment of Texas agricultural water conservation bonds.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment relating to the authorization to the Texas Water Development Board to transfer existing bond authorizations for water

PROPOSITION NO. 1 ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 36 proposes a constitutional amendment to allow a person to hold the position of municipal judge in more than one municipality.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment to allow a person who holds the office of municipal court judge to hold at the same time more than one civil office for which the person receives compensation."

PROPOSITION NO. 2 ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 43 proposes a constitutional amendment to allow the legislature to limit the maximum annual increase in homestead appraisals for each year since the most recent tax appraisal. The amendment would also permit the legislature to allow the governing body of a school district to elect to apply the law providing for the transfer of the age-65-and-older school property tax freeze to the person's new homestead, if the move to the new residence homestead occurred before the law took effect.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment to authorize the Legislature to limit increases in the appraised value of residence homesteads for ad valorem taxation and to permit a school district to calculate the school property tax freeze applicable to the residence homestead of an elderly person or the surviving spouse of an elderly person in accordance with the law authorizing the transfer of the school property tax freeze to a different homestead regardless of whether that law was in effect at the time the person established the person's homestead."

PROPOSITION NO. 3 ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 45 proposes a constitutional amendment to allow the legislature to authorize counties, cities, towns, and other local taxing entities to grant exemptions or other forms of ad valorem tax relief on property on which approved water conservation initiatives have been implemented.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment to authorize the legislature to permit a taxing unit to grant an exemption or other relief from ad valorem taxes on property on which a water conservation initiative has been implemented."

PROPOSITION NO. 4 ON THE BALLOT

House Joint Resolution 104 proposes an

able over the last three fiscal years, excluding revenues constitutionally dedicated for purposes other than payment of state debt.

The term "additional state debt" does not include bonds that, although backed by the full faith and credit of the state, are reasonably expected to be paid from revenue sources other than the general revenue fund.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment limiting the amount of state debt payable from the general revenue fund."

PROPOSITION NO. 12 ON THE BALLOT

House Joint Resolution 55 proposes a constitutional amendment to provide that if the Texas Supreme Court does not act on a motion for a rehearing within 180 days of the motion's filing, the motion is denied.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment to establish a deadline for supreme court action on a motion for rehearing."

PROPOSITION NO. 13 ON THE BALLOT

House Joint Resolution 8 proposes a constitutional amendment to establish the Texas Tomorrow trust fund dedicated exclusively to the prepayment of tuition and fees for higher education. The amendment would guarantee that if there is not enough money during any fiscal year to pay the appropriate tuition and required fees, the needed money will be appropriated out of the first available money coming into the state treasury each fiscal year.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment to encourage persons to plan and save for young Texans' college education, to extend the full faith and credit of the state to protect the Texas tomorrow fund of the prepaid higher education tuition program, and to establish the Texas tomorrow fund as a constitutionally protected trust fund."

PROPOSITION NO. 14 ON THE BALLOT

House Joint Resolution 83 proposes a constitutional amendment to allow the legislature to set the official qualifications for constables.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment to allow the legislature to prescribe the qualifications of constables."
