
The National Youth Leadership Forum on Medicine is dedicated to helping prepare our nation's most promising future physicians for the

TDLR sets meeting for barbers/cosmetologists

William Kuntz, executive director of the Texas Department of icensing and Regulation (TDLR), and Brian Francis, TDLR's deputy executive director, will conduct a town hall meeting in Amarillo for Panhandle residents who are involved in the barber and cosmetology professions to acquaint them with the agency and solicit information that will help shape the future of barber and cosmetology regulation in Texas.

"The barbering and cosmetology professions are about to undergo their most significant change in decades and we want everyone involved to have a voice in the future of their professions," Kuntz said. "TDLR is committed to working with the members of these professions to ensure that our regulations are fair and reasonable and based on common sense.

The meeting will be on Monday, August 22, at the Education Service Center, Panhandle Conference Room, 5800 Bell Street, in Amarillo. To ensure that all interested individuals have the opportunity to participate, TDLR will conduct two sessions:


9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. - Barbering Schools and Shop Owners and Cosmetology Schools and Shop Owners;

1 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. - Barbers, cosmetologists and specialty licensees, such as manicure specialists, facial specialists, hair weaving/braiding specialists and shampoo specialists.

Senate Bill 411, which was passed by the 79th Texas Legislature and igned by Governor Rick Perry on June 18, transferred regulation of the cosmetology and barbering professions to TDLR, effective September 1 2005

The town hall meeting will allow barbers and cosmetologists to become acquainted with TDLR and agency leadership. It also will provide an opportunity for barbers and cosmetologists to voice concerns and offer suggestions related to the rules and regulatory efforts affecting their professions. It will help TDLR to gain a better understanding of how the barbering and cosmetology professions work so that the agency can be better prepared to provide services when the programs are transferred.





Words from Faith & Grace

Last week we learned several lessons, one was that we are saved not because of our nationality, not because of our family, not because of our ancestors; we are saved because we have been led by the Spirit to accept God's grace.

This weeks lessons are found in Isaiah 51:1-11, Psalm 138, Romans 2:1-8, and Matthew 15:13-20. Isaiah celebrates those who love the Lord and who have the faith of Abraham; he rejoices that God's salvation is at work, and the remnant of the Lord shall return. The Psalmist praises God for his empowering spirit and His enduring love.

Paul exhorts us to "present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God ... ". Paul is saying that those things which we deem religious, church attendance, helping the poor, singing hymns, are all external acts that are seen by others, the sacrifice of self is internal and seen by God. It is this internal sacrifice that allows us to do our daily ministry in our work-a-day lives. A great failing for a believer is to only have 'religion" on Sunday; your ministry is what you do Monday through Saturday.

Matthew shows Jesus preparing to return to Jerusalem to his death and Three things in life that may never be lost: eaving Jewish territory to be alone with his disciples near Caesarea 1. Peace Phillipi. This area was sacred to the followers of Baal, the storm god. Caesarea Phillipi, a Roman town, had great temples, one dedicated to worship of Caesar. The head waters of the Jordan are also located here. 2. Hope Against this backdrop, Jesus asks, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?". The answers--John the Baptist, Elijah, Jeremiah. 





Texas crop and weather report



Rain and cool temperatures are benefiting the corn crop, which is rated mostly fair to good. Insect and mite pests have declined across the area. Cotton is rated mostly fair to good; rain benefited the dryland crop. Insect pest activity is light Peanuts are rated poor to good. The rain may have come too late to help the dryland peanut crop. No disease or insect pest problems were reported. Sorghum is rated mostly fair to good. Some increases in greenbugs have been reported. Soybeans are rated fair to good with no insect problems. Rangeland conditions are fair to good. Rain will benefit late summer grass growth. Cattle are rated in good condition.

However, if you participate in any of the programs listed above, including LIHEAP or Section 8 housing or believe your household income is at or below 125% of the federal poverty guidelines, and you are not receiving the Lifeline reductions, contact the Low Income Discount Administrator (LIDA) at 1-866-454-8387. You will be asked to provide proof of your eligibility by submitting a document to verify participation in one of the programs listed above. Benefits will take effect after proof of eligibility is received.
- How do I continue to receive Lifeline benefits? You will be required to re-certify and send in proof of your eligibility by providing a copy of a document that you participate in any of the programs listed above. Your benefits will be discontinued when you no longer meet eligibility requirements or when proof of eligibility is not received.
- Other useful information: There are other options that can help you save money, including free toll blocking and waived deposit with toll blocking.

Link-Up helps households pay the installation charge for telephone service. This program pays some of the cost of installing local service in your home, but Link-Up does not cover the cost of wiring inside your home.

- How much will I save by using Link-Up? Link-Up will pay 50% of your installation charges or \$30.00, whichever is less.
- How do I know if I am eligible? If you qualify for Lifeline, you also qualify for Link-Up. You must provide proof of eligibility before the service can be activated.
- Does Link-Up have any restrictions? Link-Up support is only available to offset the costs of activating telephone services or moving services to a new location.
- How do I apply for Link-Up? To apply for Link-Up you will follow the same application process as Lifeline and the same proof of eligibility as Lifeline. You must re-certify annually.




