This topic for the City Council Meeting was prompted by a recent meeting of the Spearman business eaders. This new tax has grea upportfrom city businesses. Man of the business leaders feel that this tax would be a way to help the conomy of Spearman, and in ef ect, keep the high quality of life in It was
Spearman has the onght up tha own sales tax in the area. Other owns such as Guymon, Hereford and Perryton have all benefite from an increase in local sales tax. Research is being done by th Chamber of Commerce to see wha teps are necessary in implementng this sales tax. The Chamber with increased sales taxes for infor mation.

City Council member, Charles tax increase for the past few years

If passed, this new tax would increase the current sales tax by $1 /$ to generate $\$ 80,000$ a year. In addition to increasing Spearman's funds, this tax would lower property taxes. The sales tax can be linked to a property reduction tax that would result in an
actual lowering of property taxes actual lowering of property taxes. In essence, cost for purchasinggoods and the city taxes themselves will lower the property taxes.
There are two statures that determine how the money produced from this sales tax would be spent. The first, is Section 4A. In this section, there would be five corpocity council. directors can be City Council mem bers. This section can be linked to a property reduction tax on an "all Additionall
Additionally, this section deals with a perpetual tax, and it would of Spearman wanted to end the tax

The second option is Section 4B It is this section that seemed to have more support from the City Council and those Spearman citizens present. This section allow
tion board, and three of these directors cannot be City Council members of employees of the city. The to this section on an "all or none" basis. would give the City of Spearman wore legal freedom on how to spend the collected money. It also allows for more flexibility in accommodating city businesses.
With this section, there are many
more options if the tax is more options if the tax is no longer
needed. A general election is one needed. A general election is one
way to end the tax increase. Anway to end the tax increase. An-
other choice is for the corporation other choice is for the corporation
directors to notify the State Compdirectors to notify the State Comp-
trollers Office to put the tax on hold. Also, with the Comptrollers Office, the tax can be "turned off and on" without the need of a general election each time. A final option would be to set time limit on the tax increase.
The City Council has decided to wait for more petitions and public reaction before taking any further
action. They are going to take steps action. They are going to take steps of the sales tax clear to the citizens of Spearman.

A decision on having the sale tax on this November's ballot will increase is passed, it will not take effect until October of 1996
