New EMS Staff

The H&S EMS has appointed a new director and assistant director

The new director is Jeremy Thomas. Jeremy grew up in McLean, TX and has been a volunteer at McLean and Panhandle. He has also worked full-time as a paramedic for the City of Canyon and Rural Metro with over eight years of experience in EMS. Jeremy is a licensed paramedic as well as a Health Advanced Instructor/Examiner. He is also certified in Advanced Cardiac Life Support and Pediatric Advanced Life Support. Jeremy is a past recipient of the KVII Seven Who Care Award.

The new assistant director is Michelle Davis of Spearman. Michelle is a certified paramedic and an Advanced Coordinator Instructor/Examiner. She has been a volunteer for over 20 years.

Both Jeremy and Michelle are paid staff at Hansford County Hospital.

The Hospital, in partnership with Hansford County and the City of Spearman, has answered a call for full-time ambulance staff, after receiving a letter from H&S EMS. This letter stated that due to a lack of volunteers, ambulance transfers could not be guaranteed.

The Hospital Board appointed one of their board members along with the hospital administrator to a board consisting of the County Judge, the City Managers of Spearman and Gruver, and a Spearman City Councilman to address the staff shortages.

After several meetings, the board decided to recommend to the City of Spearman, County Commissioners, and the Hospital Board, to hire two paid paramedics to ensure staffing during 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

As you may have noticed, your community newspaper has undergone some major changes in the past year. What you may not know is that the changes that you have seen are much more than skin deep.

In the past year we have spent thousands of dollars updating our equipment and thousands of hours in study and research. We have done this to bring you the very best newspaper that we can produce.

We have updated and redesigned our production procedures and will continue to make changes in the coming year.

One major change that we are considering is a totally separate newspaper for Gruver. The Gruver Statesman was the Gruver newspaper until it was discontinued in 1988, after being purchased by a corporation. If the citizens and businesses of Gruver would support this effort through advertising and news submissions, we would try to begin publishing before school begins in the fall. Harletta Carthel has done a wonderful job with Gruver news and we anticipate that she would continue her work with this new publication.

Another of the many changes that has occurred is in the area of circulation. When we purchased the Reporter-Statesman, the paid circulation was less than 900 subscribers. Today, our circulation is over 1600. This means that businesses that advertise in this newspaper are getting almost twice the value that they were getting four years ago. While the cost of goods and services in other areas have increased, the cost of advertising to readers of this publication has dramatically decreased.

With the approach of the new millennium, we want to offer you more in the area of news, editorial and advertising than you have ever been offered in a community newspaper.

We also want to increase our circulation even more.

We are striving to take our circulation to over 2000 in the year 2000. But we need your help. We would like for you to consider giving Reporter-Statesman subscriptions as gifts to your out of town friends and relatives who have links to Hansford County. Many of them would like to kn what is happening back home.

From now until the turn of the century, for every new gift subscription you purchase for someone, we will sell you another six month gift subscription for 1¢. We hope that this 1¢ sale incentive will urge you to help your newspaper to continue growing.

Our subscription rates and news stand rates have remained the same for the past ten years. The price is likely to increase at the beginning of next year, but if you renew your subscription in 1999, you will still be able to receive the current rate.

Cathy and I are very thankful for those of you who have complimented and encouraged us in our struggles to bring you the kind of hometown newspaper that you deserve. With your help, that is just what we intend to do. Gary Smith, Publisher

Spearman's Lonestar Tumblin' Twisters boasts three 1999 Champions.



Haenischs To Move

Barry and Linda Haenisch will be moving to Merkel on Thursday, May 27. The former Gruver superintendent will be the superintendent of Merkel schools while Linda will be teaching at nearby Tye Elementary.

The Haenisch's daughter, Kayce, has just completed her first year of teaching at Merkel in TAAS Remediation (language arts). Son Kyle is a graduate assistant teaching English at Tarleton State University in Stephenville while working on his masters's degree.

The Haenisch family moved to Gruver in 1983 when Barry was hired as head football and boys track coach, and Linda was employed as a second grade teacher. Kyle entered Gruver junior high as a fifth grader, and Kayce began first grade.

During Haenisch's career at Gruver Schools, the 1984 Hound football team advanced to the quarterfinals in Class AA, and the Hound track team was the regional track champion and state runner-up. In 1986, the Hounds were the regional track and state track champions in Class A.

From 1986-87, Haenisch served as high school counselor. He became principal of Gruver High School in 1987. A position he held until 1992. Haenisch served a dual role as principal and football and track coach in 1991-92. In 1992, he was named superintendent of Gruver Schools. Two notable changes during Haenisch's leadership have been the air conditioning of Gruver Schools and the rise in TAAS and other measured tests scores.



Out At The Lake

Jim's picture is of Rodney McDowell of Gruver holding an 8 pound blue cat that he caught on a minnow on a crappie rig last Saturday. Rodney and his fishing partners caught 31 crappie, but only two were legalkeepers. One was 13 inches, however. With the water warming and beginning to clear, fishing is improving.

There were 8 RVs this weekend, and on Sunday, Jim counted 15 boats on the water at one time

Fishing is much better with numerous catfish and crappie being caught. Steve Bishop caught a 15 pound catfish. Randy Coombs had nice catches of crappie both Saturday and Sunday. Darrell Harvey had an 8 pound catfish and four crappie with the largest weighing 1.5 pounds. Last Monday, Red Byrd had a good catch.

Jeff Hawkins has brought another pair of squirrels to the Park, making at least 2 pairs now. The tame duck on the Kid's Pond has found a mate. A mallard drake has joined her, so we can hope for some ducklings. Marilyn Been reports the wine cups are beautiful around the playground equipment area.

Ada Joyce Stedje told me of her grandson, Tim Stedje, and Dr. Tom Latta seeing a rattlesnake swimming in the Lake. They were in a boat, and the snake was heading for land. I know there are water snakes very much at home in the water and that other snakes swim, but I don't know how a snake propels itself through the water without fins, arms, or legs.

Citizens in Gruver are reporting prairie dogs scouting out Gruver for new homes. Don Hudson reported one crossing main street, and then I heard T.J. Bergin, Archie Nelson, and Anna Beth Wood all remarked at seeing the fat little rodents in town. There is a prairie dog town just east of Gruver in the Guy Cooper pasture that is probably the spot where they are originating.

Amy and Daniel Harris, who live on the Palo Duro north of Morse, have spotted a Little Blue Heron on the creek. At first they thought they were seeing a young Great Blue Heron as they live both on their part of the creek and at the Lake, but with another look at it, they decided the slate body with the brown to purplish neck and head had to be a Little Blue Heron.

According to the Field Check List - Birds of the Texas Panhandle, these herons are irregular visitors, not seen every year, but sometimes in numbers. In the summer it is a vagrant - five records or less since 1950.


