"Give me neither poverty nor riches, but give me only my daily bread. Otherwise, I may have too much and disown you and say, 'Who is the LORD?' Or I may become poor and steal, and so dishonor the name of my God." (Prov. 30:8)

John D. Rockefeller was once asked, "How much money does a man really need in order to be satisfied?" Displaying a keen understanding of our greedy human nature, he replied, "Just one more dollar."

The Enemy tries to convince us that the lack of money s the root of our problems. He says, "If you just had more, you could do more and be more and live more." In fact, according to the Bible, it is not the lack of money, but the love of money that often lies at the root of our misery. (1 Tim. 6:10)
