Beedy Advances To State

All three Spearman tennis players advanced to quarter-finals in the regional tennis tournament.

Kevin Beedy won his first match 6-0, 6-0 against Kuykendall of Big Lake

Adam Cherry split sets with Thompson of Abernathy by a score of 6-4, 1-6, 6-3 to advance to the next round.

Sally Pittman also advanced by beating Siegentheder of Big Lake by a score of 6-3,6-2.

Following the quarter-final round, Spearman had only one player advancing to the semi-final round. Kevin Beedy defeated Hunter from Wellington 6-2, 6-2, earning a spot in the semi-finals and one step closer to a trip to the state tournament in Austin.

Adam Cherry lost a tough match to Raindl from Tahoka 6-2, 6-4. Adam did a great job this year, especially since this was his first year to play tennis.

Sally Pittman also lost a hard fought match to Goble from Ozona 6-3, 6-1. Sally has played hard all year and did a great job!

Kevin Beedy played Derek Glenn from Wall at 10:00 o'clock Thursday morning and had a very tough match. Beedy ended up splitting sets with Glenn and winning 6-1, 3-6, 6-4.

Beedy won the regional tournament by defeating Randy Gardea of Tornillo by the score of 6-4, 6-4 in the finals on Thursday afternoon. This earns Kevin a trip to the state tournament in Austin beginning

Kevin Beedy was the #1 seed in Abilene. His semi-final and final match were very close, but he maintained his composure. In the finals, he came back from 2-4 in the second set to win the championship.

Kevin has put a lot of time and energy into tennis over the last several years and now it is paying off. Kevin will play in the State Tournament in Austin on May 8-9.

Sally Pittman advanced to the quarter-finals, then lost to the #4 seed. This was Sally's third year in a row to play in the regional tournament. She finished the season at 10-4. Sally is just a junior, so she will have another shot in the playoffs next year.

The Lynxettes went into the final of the regional track meet at Abilene knowing they had to run well in order to win the team championship and that is exactly what they did. They put it all together when they had to and walked off with the Regional Championship trophy. Until someone corrects me, this is the first time Spearman has won the team track championship at regional in the history of Spearman High School!

The Lynxettes won the sprint relay, 800 meter relay, and were second in the mile relay. Brooke Lesly also won the 300 hurdles, and Jenn Schnell won the discus.

Spearman has qualified in five events for the state track meet in

Austin May 12th and 13th. Cindy Goodman also pla

Cindy Goodman also placed 4th in the 200 meter dash. Spearman won the meet with 86 points followed by a distant second from Hamlin with 59 points. Stephanie Bynum became sick after the 800 relay and had to scratch out of the 400 meter dash, so she could possibly run in the mile relay. Brooke Lesly also had just ran the 300 hurdles, and she had to turn around and run her leg of the mile relay after just 30 minutes of rest.

And run they did! They all ran their hearts out and came in second behind Hamlin to qualify for state. In the 800 relay, Bynum took the baton on the anchor leg in third place. It looked like Spearman was not going to finish in the top two,

but Stephanie ran the best leg I have seen her run all year. She not only finished in the top two, she finished first! That was the best relay I have seen all year! Brooke Lesly was in 4th or 5th place about halfway through the 300 hurdles. I didn't think she had a chance, but she just found another gear and she ended up winning first place.

The Lynxettes have a very legitimate shot at winning the state championship, and I hope you will all make an effort to go to Austin and support
