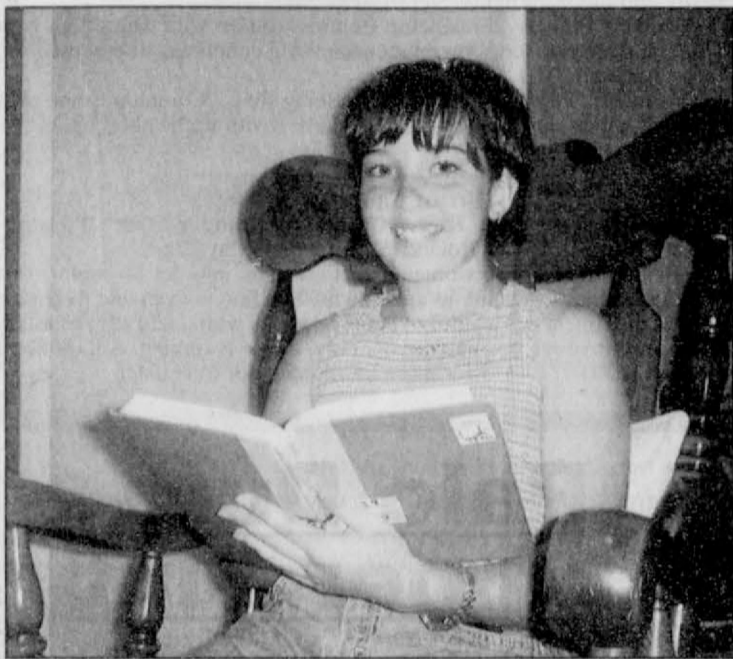

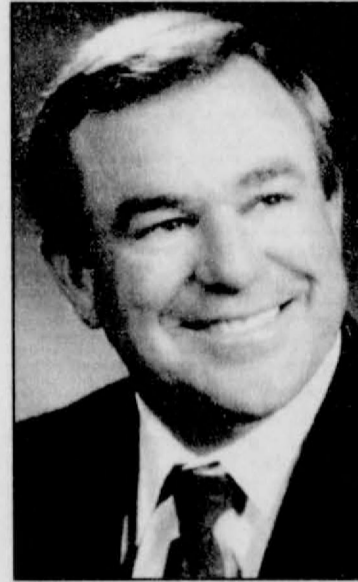
The award ceremony took place in Houston April 13th during the annual conference of the Texas Library Association.

Beasley/Mayhew Named Winners Of Scholarship Contest

The staff and Board of Directors of the North Plains Groundwater Conservation District are pleased to announce the winners of its 2000 Water Conservation essay contest.

First-place winner and the recipient of a four-year, \$4000 scholarship to the college of her choice is Tiffany C. Harris, the daughter of Robert and Beverly Harris of Sunray. She is a senior at Sunray High School.

Second-place winner and the recipient of a four-year, \$3000 scholarship to the college of her choice is Halee D. Beasley, the daughter of Ed and Jan Williamson and Jim Beasley. She is a senior at Spearman High School.

Third-place winner and the recipient of a four-year, \$2000 scholarship to the college of her choice is Annie G. Mayhew. She is the daughter of Roy and Debby Mayhew of Gruver, and she is a senior at Gruver High School.

This year, all three winners have announced their intentions to enroll at West Texas

A&M University for the Fall 2000 semester.

The subject of the essay contest was: "Why Is Water Conservation Important?" and the winners were selected by a panel of three judges. Sixty percent of the students' scores were based on the essays. Judging criteria included accuracy of information, originality, grammar, spelling, organization, and neatness. Forty percent of the students' scores were based on their academic records, extracurricular activities, community involvement, and future plans. Prizes are awarded for first (\$1,000 per year for 4 years), second (\$750 per year for 4 years), and third place (\$500 per year for 4 years). The scholarship amounts are renewable as long as a minimum GPA of 2.75 and 12 course hours per semester are maintained. All high school students residing within the North Plains Water District were eligible to participate in the contest. The deadline for entering the essay contest was April 1.

North Plains Electric Offering Free Trip To Washington, DC

The Board of Directors of North Plains Electric Cooperative, Inc. has authorized the sponsorship of a speech contest among students attending school in the Cooperative's service area. Winners of the Government-In-Action Youth Tour contest, one boy and one girl, will be awarded an exciting 12-day, all expense paid trip to Washington, DC, June 15-27, 2000.

This contest is open to any boy or girl, age 14-19, who attends school (public, private, or home-taught) in the North Plains Electric Cooperative service area. Schools considered to be in NPEC's service area include: Booker, Canadian, Darrrouzett, Follett, Gruver, Higgins, Perryton, and Spearman. Each public school will have a preliminary contest and will send two contestants (one boy and one girl) to the final contest. All students from the entire service area who attend non-public schools (private or home-taught) will compete in one preliminary contest against each other and will be represented by two contestants (one boy and one girl) in the final contest.

Each contestant will be required to give a five to eight minute speech on the subject, "Rural Electrification - The Light of a New Era." After each presentation, a panel of judges will ask the contestant three

questions about North Plains Electric or rural electric cooperatives in general. Reference and study material will be furnished for each contestant.

The final contest will be held on Monday, May 22, 2000, in the "Willie Room" of North Plains Electric in Perryton.

The winners of North Plains Electric's speech contest will travel to Irving, TX on June 15th. There, they will join other young people from Texas who have won similar contests for the chartered bus trip to Washington, DC. While in Washington, they will meet other youth from all over the United States and visit many scenic and historic places, including the White House, U.S. Capitol, National Archives, Smithsonian Institute, Library of Congress, Arlington National Cemetery, and Mount Vernon, just to mention a few. Tour participants will also meet with and view their congressmen and senators in action.

Hansford Hospital To Receive Funds

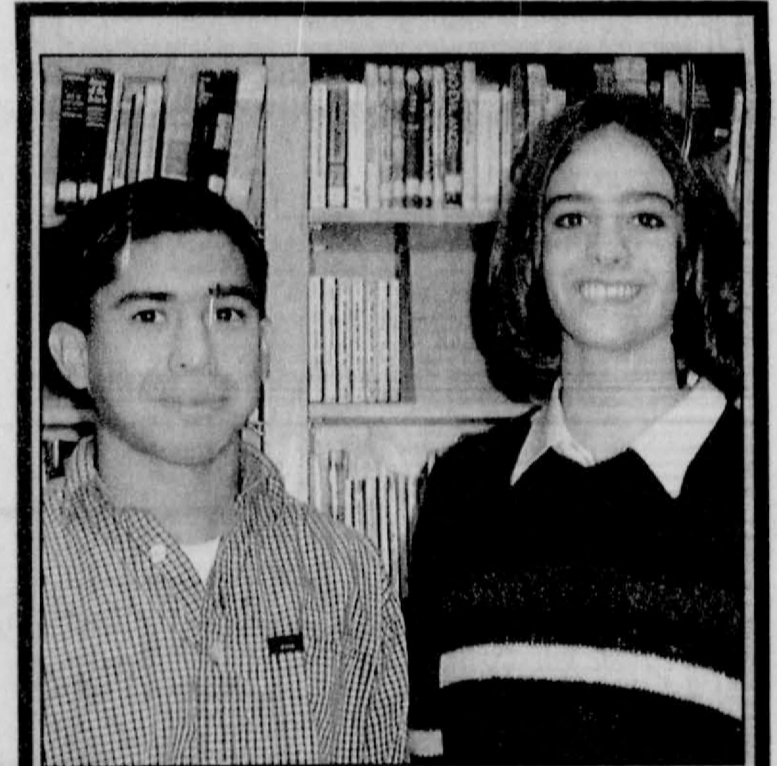
Texas Comptroller Carole Keeton Rylander is sending \$100 million this week from the Texas tobacco settlement to 288 Texas cities, counties and hospital districts to help offset costs of providing indigent health care.

The check amounts were determined by a formula, established by the Texas Department of Health, based on the amount spent on unreimbursed indigent health care in the previous year.

The funds are from the \$2.28 billion Texas tobacco settlement reached in 1998, and are separate from the \$15.3 billion settlement between tobacco companies and the state. An initial \$450 million was set aside for payments in 1999-2001. The 1999 payment totaled \$300 million.

Under the terms of the settlement agreement, the Comptroller's office will distribute \$50 million in April 2001. The remaining \$1.8 billion was set aside in an untouchable fund, with interest to be distributed annually beginning next year.

In the 2000 Tobacco Settlement Payments for Indigent Health Care, Hansford Hospital District will receive \$95,265.73.
