

Living By Faith

"The just shall live by faith." (Romans 1:17)

George Muller once wrote, "The beginning of anxiety is the end of faith, and the beginning of true faith is the end of anxiety." Every day we encounter people who are hurried and worried with lines of concern upon their faces often revealing their secret thoughts.

Some of this worry is warranted by difficult circumstances; much of it is not. Much of it has to do with potential future events that will never take place.

Sadly, our lack of faith often paralyzes us. Out of fear, we fail to speak, to decide, to act, to change. G. K. Chesterton once defined courage as "a strong desire to live, taking the form of a readiness to die."

Real faith is demonstrated by actions, not by words. Howard Hendricks once said, "There is no such thing as a correspondence course in swimming." You have to jump into the pool. You have to take the risk. You must have the kind of faith that is demonstrated by action.

Are your fears holding you hostage today? Are you bound by anxiety? Why not take that first step toward your dream? The Enemy wants to sideline you with fear. But God wants you to live by faith and get into the game.
