

## Focus On The Family

QUESTION: Should parents ever force child to eat?

DR. DOBSON: No. I am no expert on nutrition, but I believe a normal child's appetite is governed by the amount of food he needs. He will get hungry when he needs nourishment

However, I do believe the parent should carefully guard that appetite, making sure he satisfies it with the foods his body requires. A bit of sugar in the afternoon can make him disinterested in his dinner. Or he may sit down at the table and fill his stomach with juice or one item on his plate.

Thus, it may be necessary to give him one kind of food at a time, beginning with iron-rich meat and other proteins, followed by less important items.

Once he is satisfied, I can see no value in forcing him to continue eating. Incidentally, the parent should know that a child's appetite often drops off rapidly between 2 and 3 years of age. This occurs because his time of maximum growth rate has subsided, and his need for food is reduced.
