Cline Sentenced to 9 Years

Editor's Note: The following is a transcript of a letter received from District Attorney Clay

Last Thursday evening a Hansford County Jury sentenced Grady Patrick Cline, 27, to 9 years in prison for Possession, with Intent to Deliver, of a Controlled Substance. The jury also assessed a \$10,000 fine. The range of punishment was 2 to 20 years, with the possibility of probation. The State recommended to the jury that they sentence him to 20 years in

On behalf of the State, the jury heard testimony from the following persons:

Spearman Police Officer Ed Mayfield - Mayfield began surveillance on Cline's barn in Spearman in August 2002.
*Mayfield suspected that Cline and Gavin Crum were manufacturing Methamphetamine at the barn, as well as selling Meth. In October, this office prepared a search and arrest warrant for Cline and Crum. On October 9. 2002 officers of the Hansford County Sheriff's Department, Spearman Police Department, and Department of Public Safety - Narcotics Division executed the search warrant at the barn. Both Cline and Crum were arrested. cline and Crum showed Mayfield and other officers where the chemicals and devices were located in the barn to manufacture Meth.

DPS Officer Bill Tucker Cline was arrested outside the barn in his vehicle. Nine grams of Meth was found in the vehicle along with two firearms.

Adrian Watts - She assisted Crum in the manufacturing of Meth at Cline's barn beginning

in the Spring of 2002. Cline was usually present during the Manufacturing process that occurred approximately 3 times a week. Cline provided Crum with chemicals and money to manufacture. Meth. Cline was manufacture Meth. Cline was selling and giving Meth from the barn to numerous people.

She further testified that as early as 1996, when she was 16 year sold, Cline would give and sell her Meth, from his-business B&B Farm Industries in

Spearman. Gavin Crum - He and Cline - first made Meth in 2001, at a hanger leased by Crum's family in Hansford County. Beginning in the Spring 2002, he and cline began manufacturing Meth at Cline's barn. Cline's primary role was providing moneys and chemicals. Cline was selling and giving Meth from the barn

to numerous persons.

He further testified that as early as 1997, Cline would give and sell him Meth, from B&B. (Note: Crum received a 7-year prison sentence of his role. He is currently serving that sentence.) Jennifer Hughes Lozano and Grady were boyfriend and girlfriend from 1996 to 1998. She and Grady became heavy users of the drug beginning the summer of 1997. Soon afterward, Grady began selling Meth to a number of persons in Hansford County. She accompanied him on trips to Amarillo where he would get as much as half a pound of Meth at a time. She also handled thousands of dollars from drug sales.

Amanda Adams Cassady -Cline sold and gave her Meth beginning when she was 14 or years of age in 1997. Cline and her would often ride around alone in his pickup in the early morning hours after they both

used the drug. She received Meth from Cline on a regular basis until she was 17 years of

Ashley Healey - She was with Amanda on occasions when Amanda would receive Meth from Cline. When Healey was 16, Cline gave her Meth at B&B and watched her as she snorted the drug

Clint Sasser - Began receiving the drug from Cline beginning in 1997. He accompanied Cline to Amarillo to purchase Meth. On one occasion he observed Cline in possession of Meth at B&B, in the amount "enough to fill two coffee cups." He saw Cline in possession of money from the sales of Meth, on several occasions, in the amount of \$3,000. Cline would sell Meth to truck drivers in the early morning hours from B&B.

Bart Baker - Bought Meth from Cline beginning in 1997. he received the drug from Cline the day before Cline was arrest-

Mark Brown - He also received the drug from Cline. On one occasion Brown saw Cline in possession of approximately 5 pounds of Meth at B&B. Cline showed him a Meth Lab at Cline's barn before Crum was involved. Cline stated that they were manufacturing 200 grams at that time.

John Kenny - He also received the drug from Cline. Furthermore, about two weeks prior to trial, Cline showed him some recorded testimony heard

by the grand jury that indicted Cline. (Note: The Texas Code of Criminal Procedure prohibits a Defendant from disclosing

Grand Jury testimony.)

Reverend Patrick Six - About two weeks prior to trial, Cline appeared before the congregation of the First Baptist Church of Spearman. Cline read from a prepared statement. At the church, Cline stated in part, that he had been involved with he had been involved with Meth, but only as a user, and he had never given or sold the drug to children.

to children.

On behalf of the Defendant, the jury heard testimony from the following persons as to good behavior of Cline since his arrest, and/or that he should be granted probation:

Marilyn Cline, Sandy Pearson, Mike Pearson, Bob Pearson, Richard Trantham, Patrick Six, Joey Neal, Probation Officer Dianna Wooster and Jim Shirley.

At the beginning of the trial, Cline pled guilty to Possession, with Intent to Deliver, of Methamphetamine. Therefore, the jury only had to determine punishment. The jury deliberated for four-and-a-half hours before rejecting probation, and returning a prison sentence.

Cline is to appear in Court at 10 a.m. on September 23, 2002 for entry of the judgement. At that time it is expected that Cline will waive his right of appeal, and begin his prison sentence.

Constitutional Amendment Election Results

Below are the results from the Constitutional Amendment held Election Saturday, September 13, 2003.

All propositions passed. The first numbers are state results and the numbers in parenthesis are Hansford County results.

Prop. 1 - HJR 68, Section 1: authorizes the Veterans' Land Board to use excess receipts in the Veterans' Land and Veterans' Housing Assistance funds for Housing Assistance funds for payment of revenue bonds, and use excess assets in those funds to provide veterans homes. In

to provide veterans homes. In Favor - 1,126,404 (339), Against - 256,544 (90)

Prop. 2 - HJR 51: expands from six months to two years the period in which the former owner of a mineral interest that was sold for unpaid property taxes may buy back the mineral interest. In Favor - 828,955 (264), Against - 499,112 (163)

Prop. 3 - HJR 55: authorizes the legislature to exempt from

the legislature to exempt from taxation land owned by a reli-gious organization that is leased for use as a school or that will be used to expand or construct a place of religious worship that

place of religious worship that yields no revenue. In Favor - 729,162 (223), Against - 649,683 (203)

Prop. 4 - SJR 30: authorizes the legislature to allow conservation and reclamation districts to use taxes to develop and finance certain parks and recreation facilities. Also, the amendment would authorize the legislature to allow local elections for the issuance of bonds to improve and maintain parks and improve and maintain parks and recreational facilities in the Tarrant Regional Water District or a conservation and reclamaor a conservation and reclamation district located in whole or in part in Bastrop, Bexar, Brazoria, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Montgomery, Tarrant, Travis, Waller or Williamson County. In Favor - 745,658 (198), Against - 575,345 (213)

Prop. 5 - SJR 25: authorizes the legislature to exempt from

the legislature to exempt from all property taxes certain tangible personal property, which could include a travel trailer not substantially affixed to real estate and not used as a residential dwelling. In Favor 845,021 (304), Against

510,345 (131)

* Prop. 6 - HJR 23: authorizes a qualified homeowner to refinance a home equity loan with reverse mortgage loan. In Favor - 957,468 (285), Agaiist - 392,547 (128)
Prop. 7 - HJR 44: reduces the

number of persons who make up the jury in a district court criminal misdemeanor case from twelve to six. **In Favor** - 1,031,773 (310), Against - 350,082 (123)

Prop. 8 - HJR 62: authorizes the legislature to permit a person to assume office without an election if the person is the only candidate to qualify in an election for that office and the election is required by the Texas Constitution. This proposition applies to state and local political subdivisions, whereas Proposition 18 applies only to local political subdivisions. In Favor - 780,252 (257), Against 603,667 (184)

Prop. 9 HJR 68, Section 2 redefines the composition of the permanent and available school funds by requiring during the next two fiscal years, and authorizing thereafter, annual distributions to the available school fund of a percentage of any increase in the value of the permanent school fund's total investment assets. In Favor -655,318 (171), Against - 647,274 (233)

Prop. 10 - HJR 61: authorizes municipalities to donate surplus fire fighting equipment, supplies, or materials to the Texas Forest Service, which would be authorized to distribute based on need the equipment to rural

Prop. 11 - HJR 85: authorizes the legislature to regulate the operation of wineries in Texas, regardless of whether a winery regardless of whether a winery is located in an area in which the sale of wine has been authorized by local option election. In Favor - 850,941 (251), Against - 512,373 (178)

Prop. 12 - HJR 3: immediately authorizes the Legislature to limit non-economic damages.

limit non-economic damages assessed against a provider of medical or health care and, after January 1, 2005, to limit awards in all other types of cases. In Favor - 750,810 (346), Against 717,805 (111)

Prop. 13 - HJR 16: authorizes a county, city, town, and junior college district to freeze propercollege district to freeze property taxes on a residential homestead of a person who is disabled or aged 65 or older. In Favor - 1,125,928 (363), Against - 263,773 (78)

Prop. 14 - HJR 28: authorizes the Texas Department of Transportation to issue notes or borrow money to fund highway improvement projects. The

improvement projects. The terms of the notes or loans may not exceed two years. In Favor - 809,929 (213), Against -516,834 (203)

Prop. 15 - HJR 54: prohibits a local retirement system and the political subdivision that political subdivision that finances the retirement system from reducing or otherwise impairing certain accrued benefits under the local retirement system. In Favor - 963,307 (271), Against - 383,238 (145)

Prop. 16 - SJR 42: amends the

Texas Constitution to allow home equity lines of credit and allow refinancing of a home equity loan with a reverse mort-

equity loan with a reverse mortgage loan. In Favor - 861,090 (243), Against - 455,053 (165)

Prop. 17 - HJR 21: prohibits an increase in school property taxes on residence homesteads of disabled persons. In Favor - 1,062,532 (337), Against - 304,528 (90)

Prop. 18 - HJR 59: authorizes

Prop. 18 - HJR 59: authorizes the legislature to permit a person to assume an office of a political subdivision without an election if the person is the only candidate to qualify in an election for that office and the election is required by the Texas
Constitution. This proposition
applies only to local political
subdivisions, whereas Proposition 8 applies to state and local political subdivisions. In Favor - 719,482 (252), Against - 636,077 (172)

Prop. 19 - SJR 45: repeals the legislature's authority to create rural fire prevention districts. Effective September 1, 2003, all existing rural fire prevention districts will convert to emergency services districts In gency services districts. In Favor - 758,429 (250), Against

532,505 (158) Prop. 20 - SJR 55: authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds in a total amount not to exceed \$250 million that will be used to provide loans for economic development projects that benefit defense-related communities in Texas. In Favor

Prop. 21 - SJR 19: authorizes current and retired faculty members of a public institution of higher education to receive compensation for service as a member of the governing body of a water district. In Favor 692,112 (172), Against 630,528 (234)
Prop. 22 - HJR 84: authorizes

the appointment of a temporary replacement officer to serve on behalf of a state, district, or local public officer who is called into active military duty for longer than 30 days. In Favor - 1,067,945 (345), Against - 292,691 (88)







Chapter 41 - Wealth Equalization Election Information

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Q. What is this election about?

A. When a school district reaches a point when their value per student is too high, the state requires the school district to have a Chapter 41 Wealth Equalization election. We will be required to send part of our local funding away. The election will decide how that is to take place.

Q. Is this part of the school funding plan called "Robin

A. Yes, we have been given the title of a Chapter 41 Wealthy school district.

Q. I thought the district had a lot less money this year. Why are we having to send money away?

A. The recapture is calculated on prior year's property value with current year's "Weighted Average Daily Attendance" or WADA. Our 2002-2003 values with a projected 2003-2004 WADA of 740 triggered our Chapter 41 status.

Q. How much will we have to send away?

A. How much we have to send away depends on what our WADA is for the end of the 2003-2004 school year. The state is predicting our WADA to be about 740. If that is true, we will have to send away about \$90,000 at the end of the year. Our enrollment is up at this time, and our WADA could be as high as 770. If that is the case, we may not have to send anything.

Q. What are we supposed to vote for? A. On the ballot you will have the following statements:

FOR or AGAINST

Authorizing the board of trustees of the Gruver School district to educate students of other school districts and/or to purchase attendance from the state with local tax revenues.

Q. If I vote "FOR" what will that mean?

A. Voting "FOR" will mean you want local control of where your money goes - to the state or another district.

Q. What if the "AGAINST" motion carries? A. The Commissioner of Education for the State of Texas

will make the final decision. His choices are to force Gruver

1. Consolidate Gruver ISD with another school district.

2. Detach property

3. Purchase attendance credits from the state. 4. Contract to educate non-resident students from a partner district.

5. Consolidate tax bases with another school district.

Q. Will this cause my taxes to go up?

A. No. Your taxes can not exceed a rate of \$1.50 per \$100 in property value.



Texhoma the ball on the Gruver 12 yard line. With fourth and one on the Gruver one-yard line, a jarring tack-





"The Last Supper" Quilt On Display At Bits & Pieces Quilt Show

The people of the Oklahoma Panhandle and the surrounding area will have a superbly rare opportunity at the Texas County Activity Center on Saturday, September 27, 2003 as Dr. Donald E. Locke, DDS, of Waxahachie, TX displays his original quilted work of art, *The Last Supper*.

Dr. Locke created this 5.6 feet by 15.25 feet amazing reproduction of Leonardo da Vinci's famous painting that can be found on a wall of the Santa Maria delle Grazie, a Domincan cloister in Milan,

The Supper was made with the help of a computer generated image of Leonardo's masterpiece. A picture of da Vincis Last Supper was enlarged many times over until blocks of color (pixels) appeared. A print out of these pixels became the template that helped Don to determine the color placement of fabric needed. The fabric was cut to size, placed in baggies, and filed by color.

and filed by color.

A flannel wall in his studio was used to arrange the one inch squares of fabric into large areas of the quilt. The columns of squares were then numbered and taken to his Singer feather-weight sewing machine and sewn together. These columns were soon attached to others. Many columns were needed before an image could be seen. The large sections would be completed and set aside so that the process could repeat itself.

After two and one half years of work, piecing of *The Supper* was completed in August of

Joy Press of Godley, TX. hand dyed the fabric used for the back of the quilt. Then Linda Taylor of Melissa TX. accepted the challenge to machine quilt the top. It took Linda three weeks to quilt *The Supper*, the longest she has ever worked on a quilt. It had to be loaded and quilted sideways because it is longer than the quilting machine table.

It was the most challenging project she has ever worked on because when you are close to the quilt, it is hard to see the figures. She had to count the squares, like counted cross-stitch to see where she was quilting. She took it off the machine several times to hang it up and see what she had done.

The Bits 'n Pieces Quilt Show will be held on Saturday, September 27, 2003 at the Texas County Activity Center, 5th & Sunset Streets, in Guymon, Oklahoma.

The featured speaker will be Sharon Newman of Lubbock, Texas, a professional quilt appraiser, certified by American Quilter's Society, author, nationally known teacher and lecturer, fabric designer and former quilt shop owner. She will present a lecture entitled "200 Years of Quilterskips"

"200 Years of Quiltmaking."
In addition to the lecture, Ms. newman will offer 30-minute professional written quilt appraisals as well as 15-minute oral dating and pattern identification by appointment only on Friday afternoon, September 26th and Saturday during the quilt show. Appointments must be scheduled in advance.

250+ quilts will be exhibited with viewers choice awards given in each category. Preentry requested, however entries will be accepted without pre-entry status.






