

In Pentecost we celebrate the sending of the Holy Spirit. Yet, we know that Christianity is not an emotional experience; it is a way of life. There are times when we feel the awesome power of God; yet we are not called to an experience of the inner being. Christianity must be our life.

Our lessons are Psalm 89, Jeremiah 28:5-9, Romans 6:12-23 and Matthew 10: 37-42. The Psalmist sings of God's power and "mighty arm," but David recalls the promises God has made to him, and laments the woes that surround him; yet, he blesses the name of the Lord.

Jeremiah listens to a false prophet of peace and counters him that the test of a prophet is when his prediction comes true.

Paul continues his description of the new life in Christ by reminding us that we are no longer under the dominion of sin, but we are under the dominion of grace. We have been freed from slavery to sin and made slaves to the Love of God which gives us eternal life.

Jesus further said that "whoever gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones in the name of a disciple-truly I tell you, none of these will lose their reward"

Texas crop and weather report

The following specific livestock, crop and weather conditions were eported by Panhandle Extension directors: Soil moisture is very short to surplus with most areas reporting adequate to surplus. Temperatures were below average, but warmed to above normal by the week's end. Except for the southeast portion, the entire region received heavy rains and some hail. Corn is rated mostly good; no pest problems have been reported. Cotton suffered from cool, cloudy weather and hail, as well as wind and thrips. Cotton is rated mostly fair to good. Peanuts are rated mostly good with no major insect or disease problems. Sorghum planting is about 80 percent complete; planting has been postponed until fields dry. Soybeans are rated mostly good.
