Lynx Capture Regional Title

The Spearman Lynx head to the Quarterfinals after defeating the Seagraves Lions last Friday night, November 27, 1998. This hard earned victory insures the 1998-99 Lynx of yet another page in Texas high school football history.

It took three overtimes for the Lynx to defeat the Seagraves team. But when it was all said and done, the Lynx walked away with a 27-21 win.

This victory brought the Lynx a Regional Championship and the first 13-0 season in Lynx history.

The Globe-News called the Lynx the "Cardiac Kids" and anyone who has watched the three post season games can certainly understand why.

During the fourth quarter, Spearman fans were anxious as the Lynx trailed, 14-7. Then, with 7:36 left in the game, Carlos Hernandez broke free on a 52-yard touchdown gallop, tying the score at 14.







She married Delbert Balzer in Spearman in 1992







•The patient lives at home with his mother, father, and pet turtle, who is presently enrolled in day care three times a week.


•Bleeding started in the rectal area and continued all the way to Los Angeles.


50th Anniversary Celebration

The Bob Meek home, located at 622 South Haney, was built in 1928 by the Pickering Lumber Company of Spearman for Walter and Bernice Beck. The remarks found in the Abstract call for "a one-story frame, stucco residence, 28x44 ft. with front and back porches, and terraces, shingle roof, hard wood floors, sheet rocked and finished inside" for a total cost of \$3,910.00. In 1931, this home was sold to two McClellan brothers, Lee and Bill, and was subsequently occupied by their parents, Lee S. and Lizzie McClellan. After Lizzie's death, the home was the residence of R.L. (Lee) and Vera Beth McClellan until it became necessary to have a home with wheel-chair accessible space for Mrs. McClellan and they built a new home across the street. On April 13, 1967, Bob and Sheryl purchased the home.

The Meeks have been remodeling their home for several years, beginning in 1986. The second phase was in 1994 and the third phase has just recently been completed. It has been very important that the home retain its original design and personality. The Meeks have been intent on using salvage from each part of the remodel to use in any new structure being built. Sheryl has made it her mission to use old doors, old hardware, old cabinets, etc. in a way that will make the home interesting as it retains its history.

Sheryl says, "It's strange but true, all of this happened because I wanted more room in my little kitchen for everyone to sit around the table for games and conversation. What an experience this has been!"






