## CED sends tax bill to county taxpayers


#### Abstract

Hansford County taxpayers in the Spearman, Gruver and Pringle Spearman, Gruver and Pringle- Morse school districts will pay ap proximately $\$ 4.28$ million in 20 . The newly-created multi-county district set its tax rate Thursday night to raise $\$ \$ 1$ million in school funding. These figures are reported by the three superintendents of the school districts in Hansford County. These districts, plus 10 others in five north districts, plus 10 others in five north panhandle counties, make up CED It was reported that the 13 board members of CED 20 met Thursday members of CED 20 met Thursday night, Sept. 5, at the Dumas High School library. At the meeting the voted to adopt a property tax rate for the CED of 78 cents per $\$ 100$ valuathe CED of 78 cents per $\$ 100$ valuarate, this property tax rate shoul raise the $\$ 10$ million mandated by Senate Bill 351 to finance public

would like to take this opportunity to reply to some of those comments.
Mel has said that no fish are caught at Lake Mereditity during summer months. In reality, more han niloon game fish were caught
and retained by anglers from July 1 parest favorably. That harvest comcount releaseed fish
Mel alsoasesid striped bass should b. stocked to create bood summer
fishing. Stripers would have to men fishing. Stripers would have to compete with white bass, waileye and
crappie, which sustain their own
numbers through reproduction and are the mots popular species at Meredith. Stripers have to be stocked
every year at considerable expense every year at consderabbe expense
to frishermen, and for every pound of
striped bass established in the lake there would be one less pound of our other predator fish. Also,
sophisticated equipment is the norm for striper anglers - most successful fishing trips involve guides, so the average fisherman would benefit lit tle from introducing stripers.
Mel said fishermen should Mel said fishermen should go to Lake Meredith because they have better fishing. That recommendation will hardly help tourism in the
Panhandle. Texas stocks more fish Panhandie. Texas stocks more essh compares favorably with the states mentioned. New Mexico stocks no
black bass in any of their lakes and does not stock striped bass or hybrid
triped bass in the lakes on the Canadian River.
