Jameson Named Heritage Days Queen



Mabel Jameson was born in Hutchinson County Texas on January 25, 1909 to L.G. & Hattie Andrews. Mabel's maternal grandparents were Samuel and Rebecca Sheets and paternal grandparents were Robert and Thursa Andrews.

Being born in the middle of nine children and having been given the name Minnie Mabel Andrews, her stature reflects her first name. She may be "Minnie" but she has lead a mighty life in her 91 years. There were seven girls and two boys in her immediate family. Those gone before her along with her parents and grandparents are Bessie, Lloyd, Elsie, Viola and J.D. Those still living here in Spearman are Myrtle DeArmond, Dora Womble, Lola Newcomb and Mabel.

Mabel began her school career at the Holt Community School arriving each day by horse and buggy. In 1917 the family moved to Colorado where she attended a country school near Springfield for three or four years, walking about two miles each way to get her education. There her father farmed and raised cattle to support his family. In 1922 the family returned to Spearman, where her father ran a drey line which consisted of a horse and wagon on which he hauled freight. He met the train at the depot and hauled whatever type of cargo needed to be delivered.


Mabel met a young handsome red-headed man named Leonard Jameson and they were married on October 8, 1927. They again resided in the Holt Community where Leonard was employed at the Phillips Booster Station and also farmed during the "Dust Bowl" days. Their marriage was blessed by the birth of their only child, a red-headed son named Neal on September 22, 1940.

In 1945 the Jamesons moved into Spearman where Leonard worked for Bill McClellan Chevrolet. He also owned the Western Auto and ir 1954, partnered with Erlis Pittman, bought what became Jameson Chevrolet. Meanwhile Mabel was receptionist for Dr. Hackley for six or seven years. Mabel was then employed by Orville & Colene Brummett at the Rexall Drug Store for 11 years before retiring.

She has seen many changes in her 91 years here on earth and has had her share of sorrow. Her son, Neal passed away in May of 1971 and her marriage partner of 66 years, Leonard, died on December 8, 1993.

Mabel has been a member of the First United Methodist Church since 1946 where she taught Sunday School and is still an active member of the 8:30 worship service. She is a member of the Golden Spread Senior Citizens Center where she is active in creating those lovely quilts which are given away each year. Mabel was a Charter Member of the Business & Professional Women, a former member of the Flower Club and wa once an avid bridge player. The "Andrews Sisters" still have a card game going every Sunday afternoon in one of their homes. Her hobbies include quilting, assorted crafts and she is a collector of "mini" pitchers.



The program was presented by Connie Gammill, entitled "Not


The Do & Draw Contest ended. It was a four-month contest, and the winner was Louise Heddins. Louise Evans won for the month of May. They were each presented with a
