Cattleman Gives One Last Gift

In life, legendary cattleman Marshall Cator was a man who treasured his privacy and hated attention like the dickens. Cator died at age 99 on

January 20, 2002. The old cowpuncher is probably smiling right now because he doesn't have to make a speech after officials at Cal Farley's Boys Ranch and Affiliates recently learned that Cator has left Boys Ranch a bit more than 14 sections of land in

Chris Storm, Boys Ranch chief executive officer and board chairman, said the Sunray rancher's gift to the kids was wonderful.

about 9,100 acres.

'This is a really generous gift from a man who understood that was expensive to take care of kids, and he's given us a gift that will enable us to take care of them a long time into the future," Storm said. "We assume the responsibility here for these young people without regard to ability to pay. Because we don't charge, we continue to meet needs through generous gifts like this.

Boys Ranch will enjoy surface and mineral rights to the property, Storm said

Cator never was much on try-

ing to grab attention.
"Marshall was a very quiet, generous man," said his cousin, Mary Cator Gardner of Sunray. 'He did care a great deal about the children and what they needed. He hoped he could help make a difference for them.

Homer Davis of Dalhart, Cator's friend and attorney for more than 50 years, recalled visits from Boys Ranch children to Cator on his birthdays.

"Marshall would just glow when he was around those kids; you could see the thrill on his face," he said. "Those were his

Cator was a lifelong bachelor. "He always said he was too busy for anything else," Gardner said. "Marshall had a good sense of humor; he could laugh at himself."

And his skills as a cattleman

are legendary. "He's the best heeler I've ever seen. There's some other boys that are awful good, but he's got to be the ultimate," his best friend, Kent Cartrite of Sunray, said in March 2000. "I learned pretty quick that if there were two draggers and Marshall was one of them, you got on the other side if you wanted to rest." Gardner said Cator's work

was his life. 'He cared about his cattle. You have to love it to be good at it, and he loved it," Gardner said. "And he took care of the land. He learned during the

Depression that you have to take care of your land for during the lean years

Publicly, Cator was a man who didn't mince words.

In 1995, Cator donated \$275,000 to build the 4,800-square-foot D.B. and Vina Hawpe Home at Cal Farley's Family Program campus near Borger. Borger.

The home was named after

Cator's late business associates with whom he had partnered since 1926.

"They started out with noth-

When asked to say a few words at the dedication ceremonies, Cator said, "I just hope the kids like it. I hope this makes the kids a good home,

and that's all I have to say."
Harold Courson, a member of the Boys Ranch board of directors, said Cator wrote another \$15,000 check to buy furniture for the home.

Courson said Cator had told him he wanted to furnish the house when he wrote the check to build the home. Courson informed him the estimate came to \$12,000 to \$15,000.

About a year later, when the home was nearing completion, Courson said Cator inquired about the furnishing costs

"I told Mr. Cator he'd done enough, but he insisted on furnishing the home," Courson said. "I told him it was \$3,000 to

\$4,000. That drew an instant reply. 'Mr. Cator said, 'You know

better than that," Courson said. Cator paid for all the furnishings, and Courson said he checked just about every brick, and he opened and shut every door to make sure they were set right and ensure his kids had themselves a fine home.

Courson fondly recalled another speech when Cator was honored with the Chester A. Reynolds Memorial Award during the National Cowboy Hall of Fame and Western Heritage Western Center's annual Heritage Awards on April 1,

2000, in Oklahoma City.
"There were 1,000 people there for a black-tie dinner, and Red Steagall did the presenta-tion," Courson said. "Marshall said, 'I really don't deserve this award, but I sure do want to thank you, and I guess that's all I have to say.' A thousand people stood up immediately and gave a five-minute standing ovation."

Cator's support of Boys Ranch went far before his mon-

etary support, Davis said.

"He'd take a steer there for slaughter," he said.

Cator always had time to attend the Boys Ranch Rodeo, Gardner said.

Born in a sod house on Palo Duro Creek near Morse in 1902, Cator lived near Sunray, about

20 miles west of where he was

Cator's uncles, James and Bob Cator, were sent in 1871 to strike it rich farming in Kansas by their father, John Bertie Cator, administrator of the Port of Hull, England.

Finding farming different in Kansas than in England, the became brothers hunters, a profession they continued until 1877. The next year they began ranching along North Palo Duro Creek in Hansford County. They built a house and started a store they called the Zulu Stockade because they considered their territory as wild as the Zululand

of Africa Marshall Cator's father, Bert O. Cator, arrived at Zulu Stockade in 1879. Bert Cator was Hansford County Sheriff from 1893-95 and again from 1900-09.

Marshall Cator began riding horses at age 3. By the time he was 11, his uncles paid him with a heifer calf for working their cattle. That was the start of his career in the ranching business.

At one time, Cator held leases on such historic ranches as the LX, XL, Kilgore, Coon, Nance and Lipps. Although all the leases didn't run concurrently, some overlapped, and his cattle and farm operations spread into seven states.

Davis said Cator's generosity extended far beyond Boys

"He sent money to a lot of the old cowboys that used to work for him," Davis said. "He'd say, They didn't make very much money when they were working for me, so I might as well help them out now.' He was a wonder. He did a lot of things nobody ever knew and probably will never know.

Courson, Davis and Gardner all related the story about a banker from Canadian coming to foreclose on Cator during the Depression years. When the banker arrived at

the ranch, Cator was perched atop a windmill, repairing it during gale-force winds and in

about a 20-degree temperature.

"He went back to the bank and said, 'If anybody's going to make it, it's Marshall Cator," Courson said.

Cator's secret of longevity was simple: "If you sit down in that rocking chair, you get to where you can't get around. If you keep going, you'll keep

And his recipe for success was equally uncomplicated: "Hard work and good friends."

And he didn't mince words on his generosity to Boys Ranch: They help kids. That's why I





These men have visited at the Lake over the years and have the name of being tough. They can put a boat on the Lake in cold weather and not seem to let the cold bother them.



Dale Rollins, in his column Wildlife by Design in the Livestock Weekly, has been writing about how to make your land a better home for quail.
Two items surprised me. One
was that he doesn't approve of brush piles as extra homes for quail. He said most of them are just homes for skunks and snakes. One of the ranchers told him that he took Rollins' advice and burned his to find many of the piles had raccoons

The country he writes about usually has more natural cover for quail than we do, so I don't know if that applies to us or not. It seems to me that we were always told to make brush piles

to give cover to quail.

The second surprise was when Dr. Rollins wrote that no research had ever documented a population increase to supplemental water. They do like free water and drink it, but they can get enough from dew or their diet of greens and insects to take care of their needs.


