The FIRST ratings are based upon analysis of staff and student data reported for the 2003-2004 school year, and budgetary and actual financial data for the 2004 fiscal year (ending August 31, 2004). The FIRST rating system was developed by the Texas Education Agency in response to Senate Bill 875 of the $76^{\text {th }}$ Texas Legislature in 1999. The primary goal of the FIRST is to achieve quality performance in the management of the school district's financial resources.
