Comptroller to Conduct New Appraisal District Reviews
 sponsibility of reviewing the performance of
each county appraisal district at least once every other year. In the off years, the Comp-
troller's office will conduct a property study to determine the taxable value in each

(d) The numbers shall not be obscured from view by vegetation, screening or other
means. Adifferent mehhod oddress display may
be required by the City for a house, building or structure which is located further from a street than the normal front yard setback. Any person owning, leasing, occupying or
maintaining any house, building or structure which has no number displayed thereon,
hich displays an incorrect number, or viowhich displays an incorrect number, or vio--
lates this ordinance, when so informed and otified by the City shall put up a number,
shall change the incorrect number so that the proper number will be displayed, or shall rake any necessary action to comply, wi
thirty (30) days after the date of notice. Any person who violates, disobeys, omit
neglects or refuses to comply with or who r neglects or refuses to comply with or who re-
sists the enforcement of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not more than
$\$ 500.00$ for each offense. Each day that a violation is permitted to exist shall constitute a separate offense This ordinance shall b
effective on July 1,2009 .
