Immunization clinics offering vaccines that give protection against several childhood diseases are scheduled for May. Protection is against polio, diphtheria, lock jaw (tetanus), whooping cough (pertussis), measles, rubella, mumps, and HIB (haemophilus influenzae type B), hepatitis B. The Texas Department of health is charging money to help with the cost of keeping the clinic open. The amount of money charged will be based on family income and size, and the ability to pay. In Pampa they will be at the Columbia Family Health Center -- 600 West Kentucky, on May 8 and May 22, from 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. In Borger they will be at the Golden Plains Community Health Center -- 600 Cedar, on May 13 and May 27, from 9 - 12 & 1 - 4 p.m.

Crisis Center Golf Tournament Slated

The first annual Panhandle Crisis Center Golf Tournament is scheduled for Saturday, May 24, 1997. The tournament will be a 2-man low ball format at the Perryton Municipal Golf Course. The Panhandle Crisis Center is a private, non-profit agency which serves victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. Our agency serves the three northeastern counties of the Texas Panhandle, Ochiltree, Hansford,

and Lipscomb. We offer a shelter, a 24 hour hot line, counseling and advocacy services, and assistance with obtaining housing and employment.

The Panhandle Crisis Center is funded primarily by federal and state grants, United Way, city and county funds. These comprise 94% of the total operating budget of the center. Donations and fund raisers fund the remaining 6% of the center's activities. The Panhandle Crisis Center relies heavily on our fund raisers in order to match existing grants and to provide services which are not funded by grantors. One example of such a service is our client assistance program. This program allows our agency to assist victims of violence with rent, utility, medical, and daycare expenses. This is an important aspect of our services, as many abusers assert financial control over victims in an effort to force the family to return home. The

Panhandle Crisis Center also provides community education programs to civic organizations, professionals, parents, and children. These programs focus on educating individuals about the trauma of domestic violence and sexual assault, while also focusing on prevention. Since the Panhandle Crisis Center was established in 1984, we have been able to help many adult and child

victims of family violence and sexual assault, and the numbers continue to increase. Community support of our efforts is vital to our program and to the victims we serve.

Beasley Receives Scholarship

Samantha N. Beasley has been selected to receive a college scholarship worth \$8,000 from the Educational Fund for Children of Phillips Petroleum Company Employees.

Beasley, a senior at Spearman High School, is the daughter of Ed and Jan Williamson of

Spearman and Jim Beasley of Amarillo.

Each year, Phillips awards 66 scholarships and names 30 alternates. A committee of independent educators selects the winners based on scholastic records, future promise and financial needs. Winners may use the scholarships to attend any accredited college or university of their choice.

Each winner will receive a \$2,000 award, renewable yearly based on scholastic achievement, for a four-year scholarship of \$8,000. More than 300 students applied for scholarships this year.

The scholarship fund was established in 1939 to aid children of employees of Phillips and its subsidiaries in obtaining higher education. Since then, 3,078 young people have received a college education from scholarships totaling approximately \$9 million. Phillip's annual scholarship contribution totals \$528,000.

Christopher L. Evans has been promoted in the U.S. Air Force to the rank of airman first class.

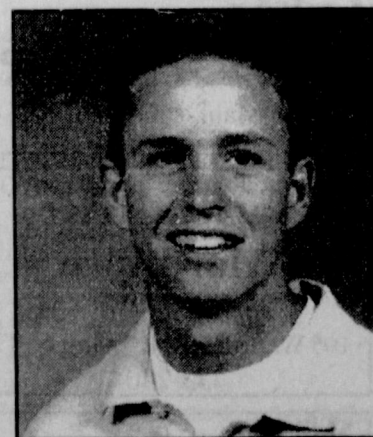
The airman is a staff writer at Cannon Air Force Base, Clovis, N.M.

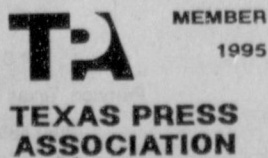

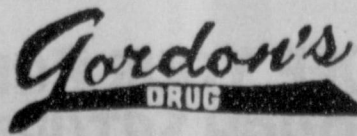

Focus On The Family

QUESTION: How can I teach my children the right attitudes toward possessions and money?

DR. DOBSON: This is accomplished not only with words, but also by the way you handle your own resources. It is my belief that excessive materialism in parents has the power to inflict enormous damage on our sons and daughters. If they see that we care more about things than people... if they perceive that we have sought to buy their love as a guilt reducer... the result is often cynicism and disbelief.

And more important, when they observe Dad working 15 hours a day to capture ever more of this world's goods, they know where his treasure is. Seeing is believing.

QUESTION: At times I feel I am overreacting to insignificant issues, and at other times I fail to respond to an act of deliberate defiance. How can I know when to ignore a misbehavior and when to confront my child?

DR. DOBSON: The ability to "read" your child's thoughts and feelings is a skill that can be learned by parents who take the time to study the behavior of their kids. Ultimately, the key to competent parenthood is in being able to get behind the eyes of your child, seeing what he sees and feeling what he feels.

When he is lonely, he needs your company. When he is defiant, he needs your help in controlling his impulses. When he is afraid, he needs the security of your embrace. When he is curious, he needs your patient instruction. When he is happy, he needs to share his joy with those he loves.

Thus, the parent who learns to comprehend his child's feelings is in a position to respond appropriately and meet the needs that are apparent.

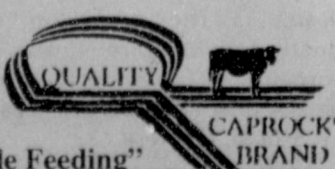

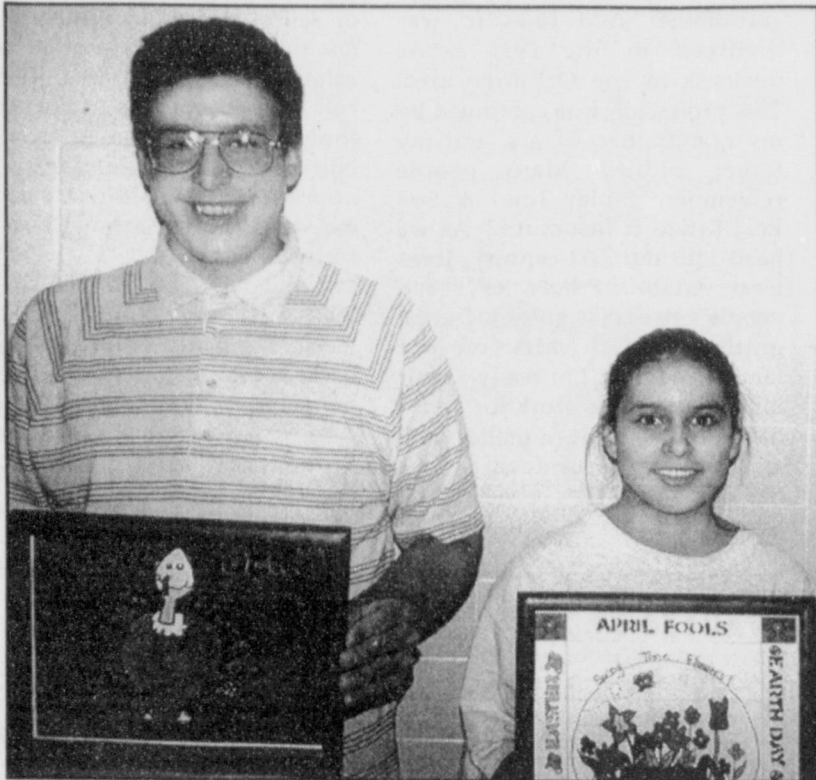

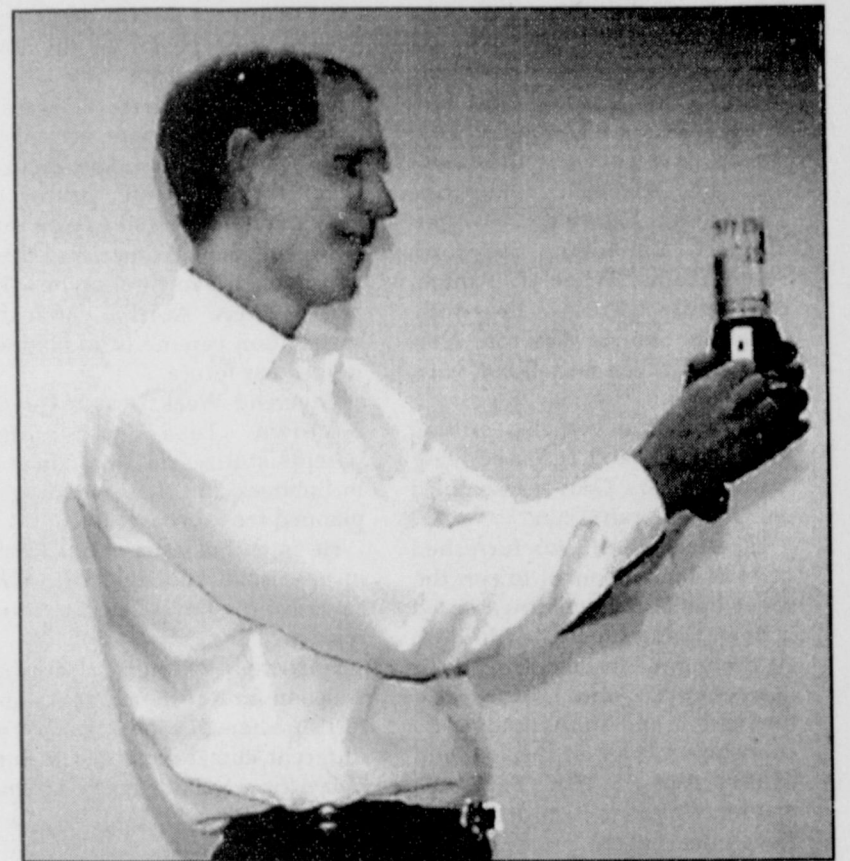
SHS Band Ranks Second at UIL Contest

UIL REGIONAL MEET AT ABILENE

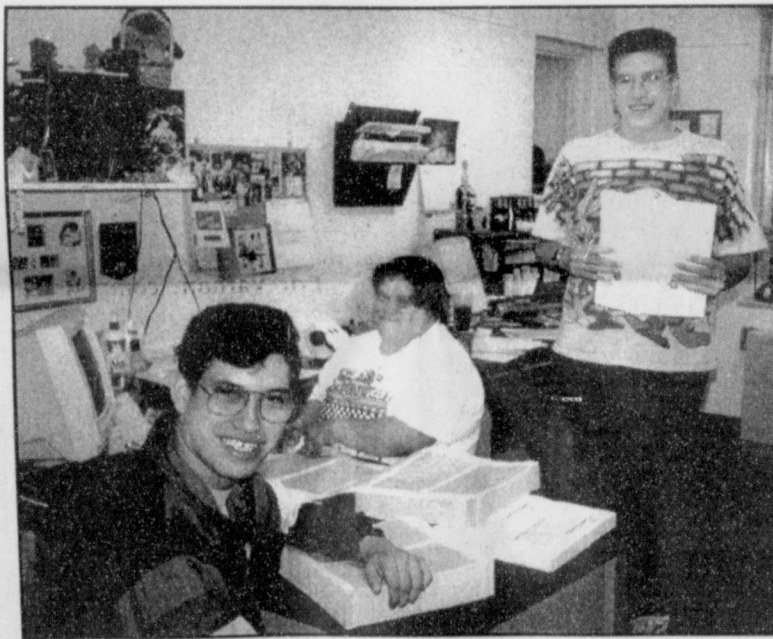
