Torn apart by war, brought together by love... Spearman's Tia Conley gives special Father's Day gift

## Editor

After ten years of research and not being able to place a face on the man she wished to see on Father's Day, Tia Conley has been reunited with herbiological father, Jay Lynn Wofford, almost three weeks before Father's Day 1993.
Before their reunion on Sunday, May 23, Tia had not seen her father since she was two years old and he went off to Vietnam. She explained that her mother had placed the kids up for adoption and when her father returned the kids were gone. "I could remember his outline and couldn't put a face on the body," she said.
She quickly added that despite the time thathad gone by she knew it was him when they first met. "I knew is wasn't a joke and I was real excited. It was a dream come true for both of us," Tia exclaimed. She continued, "Usually there is a gap, but when we saw each other it felt like we'd always been together."
Before their reunion, Tia and her father talked on the telephone for about three hours on Friday,
conversation, Tia reports that her father came to her house in Spearman on Sunday, May 23 , and they spent about 24 hours together. "We didn't get much sleep," she added.

| The fishing at Lake MacKenzie near Silverton should be good in 1993 according to latest studies by Charles Munger, Texas Parks and Wildlife inland fisheries biologist. Mr. Munger reports "blue channel and flathead collections were very good during recent gill net surveys". He noted that the walleye reproduction is "very limited" but $75 \%$ of those caught in the nets were over 25 inches. The hybrid stripers are the last survivors of stocking in 1979 through 1981 and all were longer than 24 inches. Munger noted that the hybrids may not last much longer. <br> Final note from Munger indicates that the population of black bass was extremely high for gill nets, but better data on bass will be collected in the fall. <br> My recommendation - keep the hybrid stripers and catch-and-release the largemouth bass. Atwenty foot rise would work wonders for the fishing at MacKenzie. Now is not a bad time to take a video camera and make a permanent record of the interesting lake features that will hold fish after the rains come. <br> Lake White River was gill netted in April and Joe Kraai, TPW biologist, reports "good numbers of channel and flathead cafish." According to Kraai, walley numbers have decreased since 19 , and evidence indicates that th are not reproducing. Some previous studies were the results of "cove kills" using rotenone.
