> Pumps 3,500 Gallons Per Minute. One of the biggest pumping plants near Hereford and one which has been partly overloooked by the publicity man is the plant of J. F. Collup, 3 miles east of town. He has two pumps installed in the creek from which he gets all the water needed. One of the pumps will deliver 3,500 gallons in a foot lift with a 45 H. P. gasoline engine. He has about 40 acres of alfalfa in fine growing condition, which he planted last fall. It is greening up now and he expects to get four cuttings this season. Besides the alfalfa, he will irrigate other field crops. Mr. Col-8-2t lup's farm is nearly all valley land and is as rich as the famous Nile.

About 150 people assembled at the Hurley church at 2:00 p. m. to hear Mr. H. M. Bainer, the Santa Fe demonstrator, and Mr. Singleton speak on Better Farming. and Profitable Pork Production in Texas.

Mr. Bainer's address was full of practical and sound advice, his picture of the future of the Hurley country, when entirely placed under irrigation, was a magnificient one. He also suggested the planting of better seeds and make several suggestions in regard to developing and selecting better seeds. The oats proposition was , discussed, also wheat, maize, broom corn, millet, alfalfa, peanuts, cowpeas and speltz were suggested as profitable crops under the dry land as well as irrigated farming in this country.

H. E. Singleton next spoke on Profitable Pork Production and startled the people by announcing that, while Texas could produce pork cheaper than any other state in the Union, we annually import \$76,-000,000 worth of pork products to feed the Texas farmers while they raise wheat and cotton to pay for same. At 4:00 p. m. the meeting adjourned and the efficient auto service carried the people to and from the irrigation wells in operation, the people were all enthusiastic over the wonderful amount of water put out on the surface by the different pumping plants.



\$10 FOR A LETTER.

A gentleman in Dallas, seemingly not satisfied with the results in English as taught in the Dallas public school, offered \$10 to each graduate of that school who would wtite a letter of application which he would grade as a model, the letter not to be more than one page in length. The News took up the defense of the ready to be beribboned, unrolled and pupils and tried to show that the requirements were impossible of fullfilment, and that the average English student from any high school was able to write a good letter.

The Brand does not think The News quite fair in its statement of the critic's position, nor does it agree with the statement that the average high school graduate is able to write the Mother Tongue as it should be written. But, before anything is said on the subject, The Brand disclaims any ability whatever to either discern the qualities of correct English or to write it. The haste with which all newspaper articles are written bars to some extent the possibility of furnishing properly written "copy," even if the ability was claimed by the writers or admitted by the readers.

Experience teaches, however, that there are many glaring and inexcusable errors committed by those who should know how to write correct English sentences. These errors are not found only in the "copy" from high school graduates, but in the studied productions of teachers and college graduates. Then why should the Dallas gentleman throw out such a challange to high school girls and

boys. There is no better place to examine English "as she is wrote" than in a country newspaper office. Every week the "turns" that are brought to the mill must be painfully ground out and all corn, good, bad and fearfully indifferent, made into fine meal True, often, the process of grinding is bad and the results disappointing both to the editor and to the reading public, but you cannot expect sweet water from a bitter fountain, nor 'do

age high school or college pupil is quite deficient in English. There are several reasons for this. First, the teachers are not as well qualified as they might be. Second, the subject matter, as usually presented, is dry, and deals too much in technicalities which are not apparent to the pupil. Third, the average pupil thinks he knows how to talk, and he believes that his time is being wasted in the drills. He sees no logical connection between parsing each word in a long sentence and his ability "to rattle off English slang as she is spoke" on the school grounds and even in the arithmetic class. He nounce their names for the respective sees no possible route over the angular lines of a diagram to polished English in his graduation speech. He knows a rich uncle, who has made his millions, and who never used a capital letter only in the incorrect place, and compares him with the English teacher, who has bought his kitchen furniture on the \$1.00-down-and-installment plan. Against such odds no common mortal can teach the English language to a bunch of young American buds.

The failure is often admitted and grossly aggravated by the graduating pupils themselves, when they call upon their more able friends, and often their own teachers, to write their essays and speeches. A case germain came under observation some years ago when a graduate of a college wrote back to a litteratuer in her home town, sending the subject to be treated and asked for the composition to be forth coming, read before admiring spectators. Other cases, even among high school graduates, could be named. Thus admitting in a most shameful way that they had failed to accomplish one of the main objects of the school-to learn to write their Mother Tongue correctly.



Ice Cream Makers Warned.

Austin, Tex.—Commissioner Ab-bott of the State Pure Food and Drug Department today notified all creamery managers of the State that the food product called "ice cream" made from homogenized butter and skimmed milk can not be sold. At the same time he said that he would proceed to prosecute all violations of the law detected.

The Commissioner's letter follows: "March 18, 1912 .- To the Ice Cream Manufacturers and Creameries of Texas: You are respectfully notified that you can not call a food product 'ice cream' that is made from homogenized butter and skimmed milk, Such a product is not entitled to the name 'milk' or 'cream.' This homogenized product, however, may be called 'imitation cream,' or, if sweetened, flavored and frozen may be called 'imitation ice cream, provided all the ingredients are pure and wholesome.

"This is in accordance with the food inspection decision No. 132 of the United States Department of Agriculture."

A new state bank is being organized at Clarendon.

The new waterworks system at Lubbock has been thoroughly tested and is now in operation.

A Ramsey-for-governor club has been organized at Lubbock with John W. Baker as chairman.
