"If the proper efforts are put forth I do not believe that the holl weevil will ever become a serious pest in the Panhandle of Texas, and that the counties along the Fort Worth \& Denver railway will prome the most important cot producing section of the South.
"If fall cleaning of the fields essential in the weevil infested districts it is doubly so in your section to prevent the weevil from getting a start. Pass resolutions in your Farmers' Institutes and urge upon every farmer to clean up
his fields this fall his fields this fall.
