## City's tax base shows increase

## Hereford city commissioners got some good news from the Deaf Smith County Appraisal District that makes their job a little bit

 easier. for the year district completed its work this year, the city's tax basewas put at $\$ 282,710,576$, up $\$ 9,672,527$ from 1999 . That means that the effective tax rate for this year will be 39.52 cents per $\$ 100$ assessed valuation. The effective tax rate is the rate
required to generate the same amount of revenue in the next budget year as it did in the current fiscal year.
The city's tax rate for this year was 41 cents per $\$ 100$, which generated $\$ 1,119456$ in property tax revenue. The 39.52 -cent rate, which would represent a decrease of 1.46 cents, would generate ETven if the tax rate were held the same or reduced, many their property rose during the past year.
The proliback rate for the city is $\mathbf{4 2 , 6 8}$ cents per $\$ 100$ assessed.

## Breeding duck numbers generally strong despite dry spring

For whatever projections are worth, and there is some debate about the validity of those made concerning the U.S. Fish \& Wildlife Service for the year 2000 seem promising. If the numbers are to be believed, duck hurters ought to be feeling downright optimistic about their prospects for the upcoming fall and winter. Weather-driven migration patterns of these birds will ultimately determine overall success, as many waterfowlers have been reminded, to their disappointment, the past couple of seasons. If cold weather doesn't move the ducks south during the season, a good many
numbers. numbers.
Overall duck breeding population numbers have fallen slightly Overall duck breeding population numbers have fallen slightly
from the record high of 43.4 million birds in 1999. An estimated 41.8 million birds were in the survey area this year. Projected duck numbers are off only four percent from last year's pinnacle, according to F\&WS projections, and remain 27 percent above the long-term average.
The fact that projected duck numbers remain so high has to be
counted as a win considering that a counted as a win considering that a dry spring confronted duck Dr Bruce Batt chief biologist for Ducks Unli strong breeding duck number projections might be rated says the strong breeding
than expected.
" I think many who tracked the weather this spring would have expected the overall population count to be more reduced than the final estimate," said Batt.
"Pond counts in the prairies of the U.S. and Canada were down 41 percent from last year and 20 percent below the 30 -year average.
This would normally have resulted in a much This would normally have resulted in a much more reduced breeding population estimate. Nevertheless, it looks like we can be
pretty confident that most species are doing quite well, and the

breeding duck numbers are better then expected, considering how dry the conditions were this spring. Late spring rainfall probably elped," he added.
Unfortunately, one of the bellwether species of local duck hunting-the pintail-isn't included in that optimistic assessment, continuing a troubling trend from the past several years. A managers concerned. Pintails and scaup are the only two duck species with populations below the goals set by the North merican Waterfowl Management Plan
Pintails are 33 percent below the long-term average this year, and hey have been on a worrisome decline.
The long tail-stickered ducks were once the second-most abundant, after mallards. Their population peaked in the 1950s at 10.3 million, compared to 10.4 million mallards. They have particuiarly declined since about 1980-the last year that they vere near the population goal.
Happily, eight of the ten surveyed duck species are at or above he population goals of the North American Waterfowl Management Plan, and that includes two important local favorites-mallards and green-winged teal.
below last year's count, remember that's off the pace of an exceptionally high 10.8 million birds last year-the second-highest number of mallards since 1955. This ypar's guesstimat
Both green-winged and blue-winged teal breeding bird numbers are at record highs this year. During the past two years those decoybuzzing, hunt-saving greenwings have increased their numbers by 56 percent, posting a 21 percent increase this year after a 35 percent increase in 1999.
Blue-winged teal, sure to be attention getters locally during the early season in September, increased four percent from 1999. That may not sound like a bigjump, but that's four percent above a record pegged at 7.4 million!
Although there were minor declines in the numbers of most duck species compared to last year, that fact that major plunges in numbers weren't registered due to drought has to be considered encouraging.
An abundance of ducks should be winging south again this fall, and season lengths and bag limits similar to those of the 1999 season are likely.
early teal seation as to season dates, and a good one, is that the 16 -day early teal season in Texas has been approved for September 15-30 this year. The eariy season will be opening a week later than it has in
recent years. This should give Texas waterfowl hunters a better opportunity to harvest bluewings during their peak migration through the state, and should boost hunter success.

Farmers say changes inadequate WASHINGTON (AP) - A farmers group says major
changes in federal farm policy being pushed by two Republican lawmakers are inadequate.
The Rural America Prosperity Act offers to help farmers by allowing them to fully deduct the costs of their heath care; to exclude from the capital gains tax $\$ 500,000$ from other business tax provisions.
"We must do more to bring prosperity to America's farms, ranches and rural communities," said one of the bill's sponsors, Rep. John Boehner, R-Ohio.
National Farmers Union President Leland Swenson said the legislation introduced Wednesday by Boehner and Sen. Richard Lugar of Indiana, the Republican chairman of the
Senate Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry Committee, Senate Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry Committee,
failed to offer the kind of help failed to offer the kind of help farmers really need facing our nation's farmers and ranchers: low prices, facing our nations farmers and ranchers: low prices,"

Baby Blues, a new animated series beginning a tryout run Friday, July 28, on The WB Network, has had'one of the longest gestation periods in TV history.
Its five-yèar development process'led to widespread rumors that the show was a stinker, but Blues - a gindidate for a midseason berth during the 2000 01 season - is actually smartly written and engagingly played by an appealing voice cast.

Based on a successful comic strip of the same name by Rick Kirkman and Jerry Scott, who serve as co-executive producers on the series, Baby Blues was developed by Jeff Martin (The Simpsons) and Pete Ocko (the under-
rated Dinosaurs). The new show's classy pedigree is evident in its savvy blend of contemporary realism and snarky satire.
Like the Kirkman-Scott comic, the animated series focuses mainly on Darryl and Wanda MacPherson (voices by Mike O'Malley and Julia Sweeney), a 20 -something couple re-
cently blessed by a young daughter, Zoe. But Blues surrounds this family
