Amendment of the Constitution forbids Electoral College members in Texas from voting for both the president and vice president who are "inhabitants" of their state.

Cheney made the voter registration change just in time Friday.

Friday was the deadline to register to vote in the Aug. 22 primary in Wyoming, where Cheney grew up and went to school and where he served as a representative to Congress. Cheney filled out the paperwork around 11 a.m., said Teton County Election Administrator Sharon Nethercott.

Cheney has a home in Jackson Hole and spends considerable time there, according to Wyoming Secretary of State Joe Meyer.

The change in registration was the first signal that Bush is seriously considering the former defense secretary as his running mate, two highly placed GOP officials said,

speaking on condition of anonymity.

Bush said he has not finalized his decision but will do so this weekend while pondering the decision in the privacy of his Texas ranch.

News that Cheney, who has headed Bush's vice presidential search team, is a leading candidate surprised two friends.

Maggie Scarlett said Cheney has said he is not interested in being vice president. A Republican delegate, Scarlett said she has known the Cheney's more than 30 years.

"I'm thrilled with the possibility and grateful he would consider," Scarlett said. "I think he would be a very strong candidate in his own right for whatever office .... I think for the nation and for all of us, it would be great."

Jan Larimer, a Republican national committee-woman who is co-chair of the upcoming GOP national convention, said there has been no talk around Philadelphia about Cheney's chances of becoming Bush's running mate.

# Blacks defy U.S. voting trend

African Americans were the only race or ethnic group to defy the trend of declining voter participation in congressional elections, increasing their presence at the polls from 37 percent in 1994 to 40 percent in 1998, according to a report released today by the Commerce Department's Census Bureau.

Nationwide, overall turnout by the voting-age population was down from 45 percent in 1994 to 42 percent in 1998 — about 3 million fewer voters in 1998 than in 1994.

"The increase in voter participation by African Americans was most notable in the South, where the rate grew by 4 percentage points to 39 percent," said Avalaura Gaither, co-

author of Voting and Registration in the Election of November 1998, P20-523. "About 40 percent of the 9 million African American voters lived in the South."

Turnout by Whites declined from 50 percent to 47 percent from 1994 to 1998, while Asian and Pacific Islander turnout fell from 22 percent to 19 percent and Hispanic turnout remained at 20 percent. (The turnout rates for each of the latter two groups would increase by nearly 13 percentage points if estimated noncitizens were subtracted from the voting-age universe. Data by race in this release exclude people of Hispanic origin, who may be of any race.)

Turnout also declined across all age groups and for men and women.

Forexample, 35 percent of 25- to 44-year-olds cast ballots in 1998, down from 39 percent in 1994.

Other highlights of the report:

#### Reasons for not voting

Of the 40 million people who said they registered but did not vote in the 1998 election, about one-third reported they were "too busy" or had conflicting work or school schedules. Another 13 percent were not interested or felt their vote would not make a difference.

#### Voter turnout

The West and Midwest states recorded the highest voting rates in 1998, led by Minnesota (66 percent), while the South had the lowest (Virginia was at 31 percent).

Among voting-age citizens, the lowest voting rates by age were

House," he said.

From there, he trimmed the cedars, replaced a live oak tree in the backyard, learned about the garden plants and planted new ones. Ward arranges and dusts displays, especially in the outbuildings, and basically is interested in doing whatever he can to help.

He's presented the trunk displays a number of times and is compiling all the notes into a useable format for the trunk shows.

Ward thinks a museum with as much to offer as the Deaf Smith County Museum can help residents to rethink where we are going as a community and to better understand where we came from.

"Everybody needs to know about the fabric that creates relationships and this museum can get people to know each other, and know them well enough to understand the cultures which have played a role in this community," he said. "It's more than a repository for things. It goes into education and the influence of the railroad and the XIT Ranch. These exhibits bring it all to life."

Ward says he's heard people say: "I've been to the museum once."

His reply is always the same: "Once is never enough, the displays and special attractions are always changing. You can learn something every time you come in."

Most of his work at the museum comes from an innate interest in history, but he has other reasons as well. His wife, Cindy, grew up here, the daughter of long-time residents Hap and Gladys Caviness.

"Her family was always civic-minded and this is my way of making sure their contributions to the community they loved won't be forgotten," Ward said.

"It's one thing to talk about the museum and what it stands for. It's another thing to actually get involved."

## Clinton: GOP tax cuts would erase budget surplus

WASHINGTON (AP) — Huge tax cuts being pushed by Republicans in Congress could "completely erase" the projected budget surplus before other critical needs are met, President Clinton said Saturday. Republicans replied there was plenty of money in the surplus for tax relief.

"Now we have the chance to pass responsible tax cuts as we continue to pursue solid economic policy," Clinton said in his weekly radio address. "But instead of following this sensible path that got us here, congressional Republi-

cans are treating this surplus as if they won it in the lottery."

The White House released an analysis estimating the 10-year cost of major tax cuts passed or moving forward in the GOP-led Congress at \$712 billion, including bills to ease the income tax marriage penalty and repeal inheritance taxes that the president has vowed to veto.

Because the public debt also would be paid back at a slower pace, the analysis predicted that higher interest costs would raise the overall price tag of the tax cuts to \$913 billion over a decade. Combined with

the Republican-sponsored \$792 billion tax cut Clinton vetoed last year — which contained many of the same tax measures moving again this year — the grand total comes to nearly \$1.8 trillion over 10 years.

"Taken together, the tax cuts passed last year and this year by this Congress would completely erase the entire projected surplus over 10 years," Clinton said. "The majority seems to have forgotten that projections in a report are not the same as dollars in the bank."

# 'C TRICK': From Hairy Ranger to Grumpy John, cast of colorful characters comes to life

"C Trick: Sort of a Memoir" is fun, irreverent, filled with colorful characters — a source for real guffaws.

It was hard for me to believe Don Cooper's recollections of his duty in Berlin was nonfiction because it had the flavor of a novel, like "Catch-22." It would be easy to shrug off "C Trick: Sort of a Memoir" as just another book about the military — that was one complaint I had with the book; I believe the cover with its photograph of an Army Security Agency installation and its choice of olive green color scheme could lead the reader to think it is just another military memoir — but it is much more.

"C Trick: Sort of a Memoir" may have a military setting, but to jump to the conclusion that it's a military book is like saying Frank McCourt's memoir "Angela's Ashes" is about the Irish economy.

In his use of anecdotes about his service with an elite Army unit in Berlin during the Cold War, Cooper tells about young men coping with unpleasant circumstances and coming of age during a turbulent era.

The men of C Trick, one of the shifts that maintained an around-the-clock vigil of Soviet and East German communications from atop Teufelsberg, a 400-foot-high mountain built from the rubble of World War II, struggled to carry out the difficult technical work involved in an important national security installation while coping with the rigors and absurdities of military life.

The characters of "C Trick: Sort of a Memoir" are well drawn and by the time I had finished the book, I felt like I knew Hairy Ranger, Chief, Grumpy John, Rock Weed, Prince and, of course, Blackie,

which was the nickname the author lived with during his three years in Berlin. Like the author, many of these young men were from small towns and were experiencing for the first time the exhilarating life of a European metropolis. For most of them, Berlin offered a chance to live life to the fullest, even to excess, and they leaped at the opportunity.

The men of C Trick were both idealistic and cynical. While they believed what they were doing was important for the country, they also were cynical about military service, and most of them agreed with Hairy Ranger's comment: "Every day I spend in the Army is a day in my life that's wasted."

Maybe that's what Hairy Ranger thought about his military service, but that's not how I felt about "C Trick: Sort of a Memoir." It was irreverent, bawdy and hilarious, and I'll pull it off the shelf again and again.

The author doesn't whitewash his own activities, recounting hilarious encounters with Berlin's streetwalkers and transvestites, playing practical jokes on the "treads" (career military) and drinking excessively.

### Commemorative pins available to veterans

U.S. veterans of the Korean War are eligible for a commemorative 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Korean War pin issued through the U.S. Department of Defense, according to U.S. Rep. Larry Combest.

"The 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary pin is a small token of our immense appreciation and admiration of their courage," Combest said.

The U.S. began observances of the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Korean War, which is commonly known as the "forgotten war." During the 37-month war, nearly 34,000 Americans died in action and more than 100,000 were wounded.

Any veteran who served in the theater of war — on Korean soil — between June 25, 1950 and July 27, 1953, is eligible to receive the pin. Spouses or families of deceased veterans who served during these dates also are entitled to claim one pin per family.

To apply for the pin, a veteran will need to provide name, address, telephone number and dates of service. The veteran also should provide a copy of the report of separation, commonly known as a DD-214 or a corrected version of that document, a DD-215. National Guard members should provide the statement of service equivalent, NGB Form 22. All branches of the U.S. armed services will be recognized.

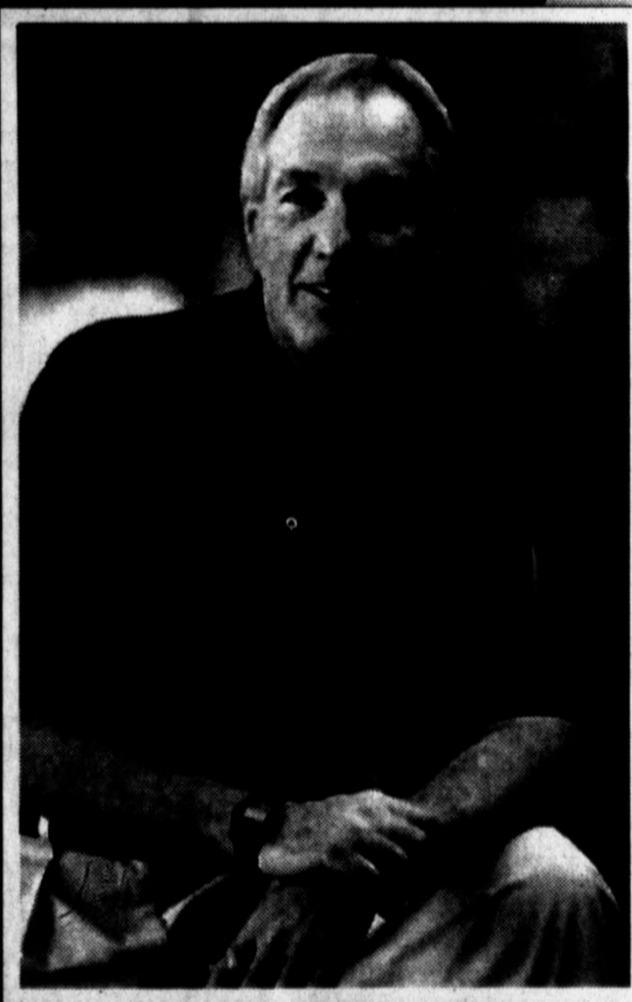

### Nader should be in the debates

The best thing about the frantic presidential primary season was plenty of television and radio debates. On the Republican side, the worst thing about the primaries was that there were too many candidates for the time allowed. That meant lots of rhetorical heat and little enlightenment.

So we have some sympathy for the gatekeepers of debates slated for the general elections. To present substantive debates requires limiting participation to substantive, viable candidates. Provided that he continues to campaign aggressively, Ralph Nader, carrying the Green Party standard this year, is one of those candidates and should be included in this fall's presidential debates.

Trouble is, the Commission on Presidential Debates, composed of only Democrats and Republicans, puts up high barriers for third-party candidates. ... We aren't sure there is a magic (polling) number that puts a candidate over the threshold of seriousness. ... But we do know that Nader is a substantial candidate, one whose issues and priorities are different from Al Gore and George W. Bush. ...

## Post-Dispatch was Shunkle's favorite paper

Shunkle swore the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch* is the greatest newspaper ever published. I'm not sure how the old man arrived at that decision, but I knew better than to question that assertion.

Shunkle was one of my grandfather's older brothers. He and Granddad were partners in running the family farm about 4 miles north of Nashville, a small town in southwestern Arkansas. Shortly after Duckett Young McCrary — he picked up the nickname "Shunkle" in his 50s when one of his nieces was just learning to talk and when the little girl tried to say "Uncle," it came out "Shunkle" — was born in the spring of 1866 in South Carolina, his parents, Matthew and Rachel McCrary, packed up the family and moved to Arkansas.

When they left South Carolina, the family intended to settle in Texas, but they stopped in southwestern Arkansas and just never resumed the trip.

It's not clear when Shunkle decided the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch* represented the finest in American journalism, but I believe it was in the late 1880s or early 1890s when the newspaper published a special Sunday edition that recapped the news of the week.

It would be shipped by train from St. Louis, through Arkansas and into Texas. On its trip, the train would make a stop in Nashville and drop off a bundle of papers.

One Saturday when the train made its stop, Shunkle was waiting to pick up some seeds and catalogs that were being shipped to his father, who operated a nursery and orchard on the family farm. When he picked up his father's order, he also purchased a copy of the *Post-Dispatch*.

That chance occurrence began his lifelong love affair with the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch*.

Years later, when Shunkle was pushing 90, he told me how excited he was when he opened that big newspaper and saw the news from all over the world, even news about some places that he barely knew existed.

After discovering the *Post-Dispatch*, Shunkle regularly saddled a mule or hitched a team to a wagon and went to Nashville each Saturday to wait at the depot for the train to arrive with its bundle of newspapers.

This routine continued for many years, until the newspaper owners, much to the annoyance of Shunkle, finally stopped shipping bundles of the *Post-Dispatch* across the country.

In 1950, when Shunkle was 84, he needed someone to help look out for him, so my mother and I moved into his red farmhouse on a gravel road about a quarter-mile west of my grandparents' home. My father, who drove a truck for Texas & Pacific, rented a room in a boarding house in Texarkana and would catch a bus to Nashville, where he would spend the weekends.

During the seven years Mom and I lived with Shunkle, one little routine was established. Every Sunday morning before breakfast, Dad, Shunkle and I would ride into Nashville to the bus station to buy a copy of the *Arkansas Gazette*, which was shipped out of Little Rock by bus.

Shunkle would read the paper from cover to cover, sometimes re-reading articles that particularly interested him, but when he finally finished, he'd pull his handkerchief out of his pants pocket, clean his glasses carefully, and say, "It was a good paper today, but it don't hold a candle to the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch*."

Who knows? He probably was right.

## Lotto has 4 more numbers

AUSTIN — The Texas Lottery Commission added four numbers to the Lotto Texas drawing last week in hopes of increasing player participation and rejuvenating slumping ticket sales.

The change was implemented July 16 when new player slips with 54 numbers were delivered to retailers, across the state. The first drawing with the new system was July 19.

Lotto spokeswoman Kristina Childress said preliminary figures showed ticket sales were up by the end of the day, but she pointed out that the July 19 jackpot already had climbed to \$21 million before the numbers were added.

"We believe it was more of the lure of the jackpot than the lure of the balls," Childress said.

Pay-outs under the new number configuration are expected to increase as the jackpots grow. The prize for selecting five of six numbers increased \$1,000 to \$2,500 and players who select three of six numbers now will earn \$5 instead of \$3. The pay-out for selecting four of six numbers only increased slightly.

Public reaction to the Lottery's proposal when first announced several months ago was mixed. Many longtime players said they would prefer better odds of winning not higher jackpots.

### Jury convicts man for 8-liners

A Bexar County man became the first person to be convicted of organized crime involving eight-liners since Attorney General John Cornyn began a crackdown on the illegal gaming machines.

A jury deliberated for three hours and found Richard E. Legere guilty of operating eight-liners in his Universal City bar Poor Richards Lounge.

Legere faces up to \$10,000 on each count and confinement in a state jail facility for not less than 180 days or more than two years. Legere could also be eligible for up to 10 years probation.

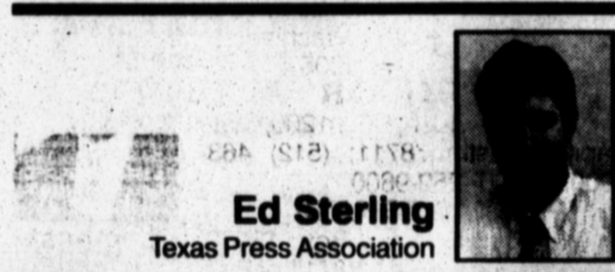
This is the first conviction for organized crime involving the use of eight-liners that Cornyn's office has obtained.

The attorney general's office began investigating the case with the Bexar County District Attorney's office in March 1999. The Department of Public Safety's Special Crimes Division in San Antonio also assisted.

Since March 2000, six defendants have been found guilty on multiple counts regarding eight-liner operations.

### Deregulation awareness pushed

The Public Utility Commission July 18 approved a multi-million-dollar customer education plan to prepare Texans for the start of



### retail electric competition in 2001.

The campaign budget is \$12 million the first year and could reach \$36 million for the entire four-year campaign. The PUC is seeking bids from private companies to manage and implement the customer education plan.

Texas' electric consumers will first have access to utility deregulation through pilot projects beginning June 1, 2001, and full retail competition of investor-owned utilities starts Jan. 1, 2002. Senate Bill 7, passed in 1999, opened Texas to utility competition.

High Point/Franklin, a marketing firm specializing in electric restructuring issues, designed the Customer Education Plan with extensive input from the PUC, utilities, retail electric providers and consumer groups. The plan includes recommendations based on successful strategies used in other states undergoing electric restructuring and extensive research conducted throughout Texas.

### Other highlights

• Drought conditions have affected 134 of the state's 4,534 public water systems and at least 17 of those are under severe water rationing in which outdoor water usage is prohibited. Another 11 have imposed moderate rationing to limit use of sprinkler systems, according to the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission.

• Texas Land Commissioner David Dewhurst said lease and land sales have earned more than \$4.8 million for the Permanent School Fund. Dewhurst said the \$226 average bid per acre for oil and gas leases is the highest in two years.

• Insurance Commissioner Jose Montemayor unveiled a new Internet resource page to help small businesses make wise insurance choices and save money. The new Insurance Resource for Small Businesses is available online at [www.tdi.state.tx.us](http://www.tdi.state.tx.us).

• More than two dozen Texas coastal cities and counties are urging Congress to pass the Conservation and Reinvestment Act, which would provide an estimated \$237 million in new dollars each year for Texas' coastal areas, state and local parks, wildlife, historic sites, educational entities and private landowners.

## Voters face a fall full of distractions

Voters will have plenty of distractions this fall when the Olympics and baseball's postseason occur just as undecided voters normally begin to focus on the presidential campaign.

This could make it tougher to get voters' attention until the final few weeks of the campaign, analysts say, and increase the public focus on the presidential debates, which will still compete with baseball's playoffs.

Several recent polls have suggested voter interest in the campaigns is lower than in recent election years. One showed the number

who do not plan to watch the political conventions, about four in 10, twice the number who said that four years ago.

"That suggests a low-interest electorate which can be readily seduced to watch fun events in place of boring politics," said Doris Graber, a University of Illinois-Chicago specialist in political communication. "Politicians know this and avoid scheduling major political events in time slots that compete with sports events. When they do, sports always wins."

Some sports fans, like 29-year-old Duane Dorsey of Whitehall, Pa., say they have no trouble following sports and the campaign at the same time. But Dorsey said it helps him

focus on politics when his baseball team is struggling.

"I follow the Phillies, they're pretty much out of it," the office manager said, adding the political campaign would be more important to him anyway.

"If people are concerned about issues that go on around the country, they will pay attention to the campaign no matter what," Dorsey said. "It's a little more important than sports. It affects everyday life."

Unfortunately, not all Americans are as civic-minded as Dorsey. A recent poll by the

Few Research Center for the People and the Press suggested that three in 10 Americans are not convinced it makes a difference who is elected president, with even more adults under age 30 feeling that way. That may be a bigger problem than competition from sports events like the Olympics, scheduled for Sept. 15 to Oct. 1.

The Games, which will be televised on NBC, MSNBC and CNBC, are taking place later than usual because they are in the Southern Hemisphere, where it will still be early spring.

"My guess is that these Olympics probably will not get too much in the way of the campaigns," said Tom Rosenstiel, director of the Project for Excellence in Journalism.

Officials with both campaigns said their message will break through the sports distractions.

Andrew Kohut of the Pew Research Center said his polling suggests interest in the elections may not pick up until October, making this more like 1996 than 1992.

The baseball playoffs and World Series are that month, but "that's always with us," Rosenstiel said.

If the combination of low voter interest and sporting distractions makes October the key focus of the campaign, that could magnify the importance of the presidential debates scheduled that month.

"I think you'll see more attention paid during the

month of October and particularly in the debates," said Norman Ornstein, a political analyst at the American Enterprise Institute, a Washington think tank. "If you don't know the candidates, debates become a place you can engage them side by side."

The commission that schedules presidential debates had to work hard to find openings for the presidential and vice presidential debates because of competition from the Olympics, baseball and prime time pro football, said John Scardino, spokesman for the commission.

"The window was from mid-September to mid-October for the debates," Scardino said. "You've got the Olympics that run from mid-September to the end, then you've got ABC with commitments on NFL coverage ... then you've got Rosh Hashanah, then NBC and Fox have baseball commitments beginning in early October."

"It was extremely difficult to find the dates," he said, noting the presidential debates are set for Oct. 3 in Boston, Oct. 11 at Winston Salem, N.C., and Oct. 17 in St. Louis. A vice presidential debate is set Oct. 5 in Danville, Ky.

For some, sports does not interfere with following the campaigns at all.

"It's not going to make any difference to me," said Tammy Helms, a 26-year-old stay-at-home mom from Pensacola, Fla., who says she will follow the campaigns. "I don't pay much attention to that sports stuff. I would think men would probably pay more attention."

# Is there a real person around here?

I want to talk to a real person.

A person owes money -- whether it be taxes, loans or some repayment -- to a governmental entity and it must be repaid on time with interest. Period. The end. No discussion.

The government will get what it has coming, regardless of how it affects an individual.

On the other hand, a citizen tries to get money, which is owed or held by an agency, and they seem to be pretty well up that proverbial unpleasant creek with the proverbial broken paddle.

The governmental agency holds the citizen's funds, collecting interest on it, and only releases the funds at the very last possible moment.

In the meantime, the agency will send a notice the funds are being held until all other associated agencies receive a clearance from what appears

to be an unrelated agency.

The problem comes when the citizen tries to get the clearance. To get the clearance, the citizen has to get the non-associated agency to provide the release to each of the other agencies. However, all the other agencies have to provide a clearance for the initial agency. Each release has to be typed, signed, notarized, approved and then mailed.

The cost of this process is something like \$17 per letter, per agency, per incident.

No one can tell me why, one fax, one electronic memo or even one letter can't cover all the required agencies needs.

Should a citizen question the whereabouts or the standing of a particular item, the perturbed nasal twang on the other end of the line sounds out: "Ma'am, that's not my department. I can give you a number where you can reach that department's assistant supervisor, who will be able to give you a number where someone else may help you."

If the citizen is lucky, the person will only hang up, in-

stead of smacking their gum and putting the caller on permanent hold. Otherwise, the caller gets to wait on permanent hold, at long distance prices, while the gum-smacker retrieves the number, and finally rudely gives up the number of the person who can give you another number to someone who might be able to answer your question.

I think all of this boils down to the government is just too \*&%\$ big.

Anytime you have to go through three receptionists to get to an assistant to the assistant, something has to go.

All I want is to talk to ONE person, in one agency, who will answer my questions intelligently and correctly, without giving me this bureaucratic runaround. I don't care who it is. I just want an answer.

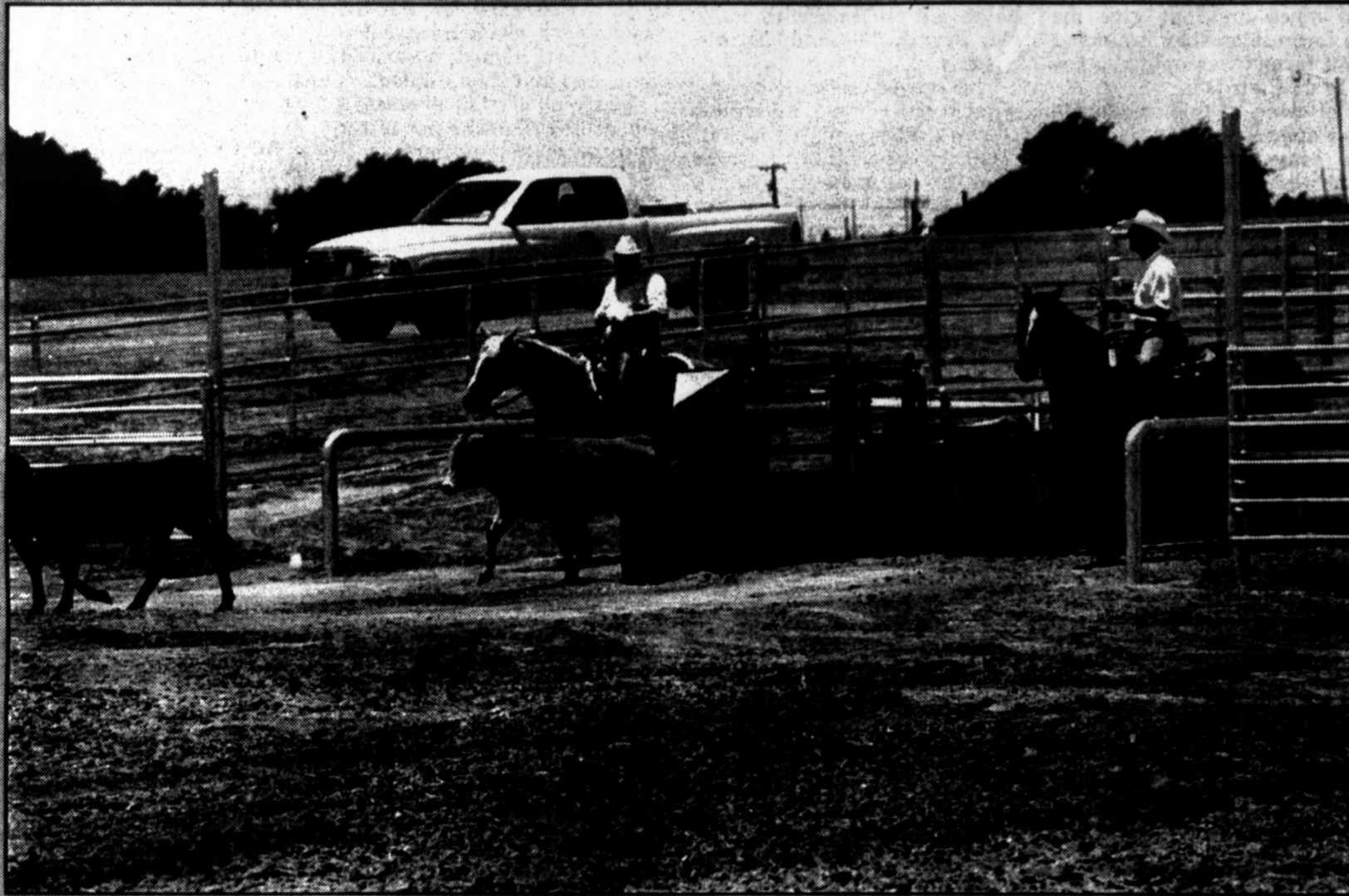

# Mets and Braves focus of weekend

## Cards snap Elarton's winning streak

ATLANTA (AP)—The New York Mets infield looks a whole lot different from the last time it visited Turner Field. The biggest change yet might be coming.

The Mets are just an approval away from adding Barry Larkin to an infield that has been hit hard since it shined last season.

On Friday, before a 6-3 loss to the Braves 6-3 — the Mets' 17th defeat in 18 games at Atlanta — a deal was reached with the Cincinnati Reds that would land the All-Star shortstop in New York if the former NL MVP says yes.

The Mets will have 72 hours, beginning Saturday, to try and convince the former MVP to say make the jump.

"Barry's a great player, but he's not here yet," New York manager Bobby Valentine said. "He definitely won't be here tomorrow. And I'd like to win the baseball game tomorrow."

In other NL games, it was the Chicago Cubs 4, Milwaukee 2; Pittsburgh 9, Philadelphia 2; Montreal 7, Florida 3; Arizona 5, Cincinnati 4; St. Louis 12, Houston 1; San Diego 5, Colorado 1, and Los Angeles 6, San Francisco 5.

Last season New York's defense broke records for fewest errors and fewest unearned runs, but it didn't help in Atlanta. With a makeshift infield Friday night, the Mets lost again.

"I'm not quite sure as to why," said Mets starter Al Leiter (10-4), winless in his career in Atlanta. "They're a good baseball team and we haven't played as well as we would have liked to at Turner Field."

First baseman John Olerud signed with Seattle in the offseason, second baseman Edgardo Alfonzo is out with a hip injury and the Gold Glove

left side of shortstop Rey Ordonez and third baseman Robin Ventura is on the disabled list.

On Friday, the Mets had Todd Zeile at first, Joe McEwing at second, Melvin Mora at shortstop and Lenny Harris at third.

"Barry Larkin would make a difference with any team," Braves outfielder Brian Jordan said. "Maybe we'll put in a couple of calls to him and get him to veto it."

The Braves, who lead the Mets by six games in the NL East, are 14-1 at home against New York during the regular season since September 1997. They won three more games at The Ted during last year's NL Championship Series.

"It may look like we have an edge on them," Atlanta third baseman Chipper Jones said, "but that could change overnight."

John Burkett pitched 4 1-3 innings of scoreless relief to earn the victory. Burkett (7-4), dropped from the rotation when Atlanta acquired Andy Ashby during the All-Star break, came on in the third inning after Terry Mulholland gave up four hits and three runs.

"I think I can help out," Burkett said.

**Diamondbacks 5, Reds 4**  
Luis Gonzalez's eighth-inning double drove in the go-ahead run as visiting Arizona beat Cincinnati.

Greg Swindell (2-3) retired both batters he faced in the seventh to win. Matt Mantei pitched the ninth for his sixth save in eight chances.

Scott Sullivan (1-4) took the loss.

**Expos 7, Marlins 3**  
Geoff Blum homered and had a career-high four RBIs, and Mike Thurman pitched six strong innings as Montreal defeated Florida on the road.

Thurman (2-1) was activated from the disabled list just before allowing the Marlins one run and five hits.

Florida starter Chuck Smith (0-3) lasted just four innings.

**Pirates 9, Phillies 2**  
Rookie Jimmy Anderson allowed only three hits in eight innings and Mike Benjamin drove in three runs as Pittsburgh beat Philadelphia at home.

Anderson (3-5) had his second straight solid start.

Bruce Aven's two-run double highlighted a four-run first inning against Paul Byrd (2-8). Byrd is 1-6 in his last 10 starts.

Philadelphia avoided being shut out when Gary Bennett hit a two-run homer in the ninth.

**Cubs 4, Brewers 2**  
Kerry Wood (5-6) put together consecutive victories for the first time this season, pitching Chicago over visiting Milwaukee.

Rick Aguilera pitched the ninth for his 20th save in 27 chances for the Cubs, who won for the eighth time in 11 games.

John Snyder (3-5) took the loss and dropped to 0-3 in four July starts.

**Cardinals 12, Astros 1**  
Edgar Renteria tied a career-high with four RBIS and rookie Rick Ankiel tied a career-high with 11 strikeouts in seven innings as St. Louis

stopped a three-game losing streak with a victory at Houston.

Ankiel (7-5) allowed only three hits to win for the first time in five outings.

## Tiger has lead with two rounds left

ST. ANDREWS, Scotland (AP) — Halfway home to history, Tiger Woods isn't even breaking a sweat. He's leaving that to everyone else.

On a crusty, sun-baked Old Course at St. Andrews, Woods made even the most daunting shots look easy. When the final putt crawled into the cup for par Friday, Woods had a 6-under 66 for a three-stroke lead in the British Open.

All that stands in the way of the career Grand Slam at age 24 is two more trips over a course where he has yet to make worse than par.

"It's a good spot," Woods said, trying to contain a smile.

Extending his major championship streak to 62 holes without a bogey, Woods played another near-flawless round and was at 11-under 133, three shots clear of David Toms.

His 36-hole lead was twice that large at Pebble Beach last month when he won the U.S. Open by 15 strokes. The way Woods has played this

week, another runaway into the record books is not out of the question.

"I'm playing very similar to how I played at Pebble," he said.

If so, Woods would become the youngest golfer to win all four majors and only the fifth ever. Jack Nicklaus was the last, in 1966 at 26.

Toms, who has never contended in a major championship, had a bogey-free 67 and was at 136. Another stroke back were Loren Roberts (68), Steve Flesch (70) and Sergio Garcia (69), the last guy who challenged Woods in a major championship.

Ernie Els failed to ride the momentum from his first-round 66 and stayed right where he was with a scrambling 72, putting him at 138 along with Fred Couples (68), Phil Mickelson (66) and Tom Lehman (70).

All of them could use some help from St. Andrews. The Old Course has 112 bunkers — a mere rumor as far as Woods is concerned. He has found nothing but safe spots on the rock-hard fairways and greens. The one exception turned into an exceptional

shot.

Woods hit his approach through the 17th green, down the slope and onto a thin strip of grass next to the road. Using the back slope of the dreaded Road Hole bunker as a backboard, Woods chipped past the hole and the ball rolled back to 8 feet.

"That chip shot wasn't exactly easy," Woods said. "The key is to choose a line so if you hit it too hard, you're not

going to go in the bunker."

All that remained was a par putt that broke twice. Woods clenched his fist when it fell, a rare display of emotion during his round.

# Breeding duck numbers generally strong despite dry spring

**F**or whatever projections are worth, and there is some debate about the validity of those made concerning ducks, the annual report on breeding duck numbers from the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service for the year 2000 seems promising.

If the numbers are to be believed, duck hunters ought to be feeling downright optimistic about their prospects for the upcoming fall and winter. Weather-driven migration patterns of these birds will ultimately determine overall success, as many waterfowlers have been reminded, to their disappointment, the past couple of seasons. If cold weather doesn't move the ducks south during the season, a good many hunters could end up disappointed, despite strong duck numbers.

Overall duck breeding population numbers have fallen slightly from the record high of 43.4 million birds in 1999. An estimated 41.8 million birds were in the survey area this year. Projected duck numbers are off only four percent from last year's pinnacle, according to F&WS projections, and remain 27 percent above the long-term average.

The fact that projected duck numbers remain so high has to be counted as a win considering that a dry spring confronted duck populations in much of the northern nesting country.

Dr. Bruce Batt, chief biologist for Ducks Unlimited, says the strong breeding duck number projections might be rated as better than expected.

"I think many who tracked the weather this spring would have expected the overall population count to be more reduced than the final estimate," said Batt.

"Pond counts in the prairies of the U.S. and Canada were down 41 percent from last year and 20 percent below the 30-year average. This would normally have resulted in a much more reduced breeding population estimate. Nevertheless, it looks like we can be pretty confident that most species are doing quite well, and the

breeding duck numbers are better than expected, considering how dry the conditions were this spring. Late spring rainfall probably helped," he added.

Unfortunately, one of the bellwether species of local duck hunting—the pintail—isn't included in that optimistic assessment, continuing a troubling trend from the past several years. A continued decline in pintail and scaup numbers has waterfowl managers concerned. Pintails and scaup are the only two duck species with populations below the goals set by the North American Waterfowl Management Plan.

Pintails are 33 percent below the long-term average this year, and they have been on a worrisome decline.

The long tail-stickered ducks were once the second-most abundant, after mallards. Their population peaked in the 1950s at 10.3 million, compared to 10.4 million mallards. They have particularly declined since about 1980—the last year that they were near the population goal.

Happily, eight of the ten surveyed duck species are at or above the population goals of the North American Waterfowl Management Plan, and that includes two important local favorites—mallards and green-winged teal.

While mallards exhibited the largest drop from 1999—12 percent

below last year's count, remember that's off the pace of an exceptionally high 10.8 million birds last year—the second-highest number of mallards since 1955. This year's guesstimate is 9.47 million breeding mallards—still quite a greenhead factory.

Both green-winged and blue-winged teal breeding bird numbers are at record highs this year. During the past two years those decoy-buzzing, hunt-saving greenwings have increased their numbers by 56 percent, posting a 21 percent increase this year after a 35 percent increase in 1999.

Blue-winged teal, sure to be attention getters locally during the early season in September, increased four percent from 1999. That may not sound like a big jump, but that's four percent above a record number of 7.1 million birds in 1999. Breeding numbers this year are pegged at 7.4 million!

Although there were minor declines in the numbers of most duck species compared to last year, that fact that major plunges in numbers weren't registered due to drought has to be considered encouraging.

An abundance of ducks should be winging south again this fall, and season lengths and bag limits similar to those of the 1999 season are likely.

One exception as to season dates, and a good one, is that the 16-day early teal season in Texas has been approved for September 15-30 this year. The early season will be opening a week later than it has in recent years. This should give Texas waterfowl hunters a better opportunity to harvest bluewings during their peak migration through the state, and should boost hunter success.

the shine off the Cowboys' star and makes Sundays a little less interesting.

"In reality, they're moving on to their real life, or their own individual life, but in a sport, it's like a person just died," running back Emmitt Smith said. "They're no longer with you. They're with you in spirit, but they're no longer with you in body."

"What do you do to combat it when somebody dies in your family? You go in mourning for a moment and then eventually you pick yourself up and move forward. That's what happens. I'm picking myself up and moving on."

Although none of the trio participated in offseason activities, their absence really hit home in the first week of training camp.

"It is different," quarterback Troy Aikman said. "You get used to playing with guys and you expect them to be around. Now we have a lot of new faces around. That's one of the things we have to fight through."

With his swagger on and off the field, Irvin epitomized a new breed in Dallas in the early 1990s: loud and proud with the talent to back it up. The same was true of Sanders, who joined the mix in '95 and helped the Cowboys win a third Super Bowl in four years.

Irvin and Sanders considered entertainment part of their job description. You didn't watch just to see Irvin catch a pass or Sanders intercept one; you wanted to see what they would do once the ball was in their hands.

Irvin's exaggerated first-down gesture was among his trademarks. Sanders could enliven a crowd just by lining up to receive a punt. Once he caught it, the show really be-

gan. The same was true of his playing cornerback, or even his failed bid to join Irvin as a receiver.

Johnston was a strong, silent fullback who inspired teammates by being so durable despite playing so rough. Opening holes for Smith left him with serious injuries, but he endured them quietly while others fussed about lesser problems involving other players.

Johnston became the working man's favorite player and a quirky appreciation developed. On the rare occasions when he'd catch a pass or take a handoff, fans would roar his nickname, drawing out the first syllable. The chants were heard on the road, too.

Yet for all the thrills Irvin, Sanders and Johnston provided, the Cowboys haven't won a playoff game in the four seasons since their last championship and are 24-24 in the last three seasons.

In January, owner Jerry Jones decided the team needed an overhaul. He began making changes with the idea that Irvin, Sanders and Johnston wouldn't be back.

Jones replaced coach Chan Gailey with defensive coordinator Dave Campo and junked Gailey's offense in favor of the system Dallas used in the early 1990s.

Joey Galloway was acquired to replace Irvin as the No. 1 receiver and four new cornerbacks were brought in to cushion the loss of Sanders. Converted linebacker Robert Thomas will remain in Johnston's role, having assumed the job last year.

Jones is confident he has a better group of players. What he doesn't know is who will emerge as the team's new focal points and its most color-

ful characters.

"There's a lot to overcome," Jones said. "Between the coaching staff and the veteran players we have, we must recognize there is a void there and do something about it."

Campo, who had been an assistant in Dallas since 1989, understands what's missing. He considers it his job to find the heirs to Irvin, Sanders and Johnston.

"Motivation and leadership can be cultivated, and that's what I'm going to try to do," Campo said. "I'm going to try to bring it out of guys who have it inside them right now but maybe have never had to jump out and do it."

With only nine players left from Dallas' last Super Bowl team, the Cowboys' transition is moving fast — so fast that Irvin's No. 88 and Johnston's No. 48 already have been assigned.

So while fans may yearn

for the good old days, Johnston says a new era could be on the way.

"You're going to have new people coming in and hopefully there will be someone young who steps up," he said. "I'm sure that in the mid- to late 1980s people were probably wondering how the Cow-

boys would ever replace the guys who came before us."

Certificate to recognize Cold War vets' service

For more than four decades, hundreds of thousands of young Americans served their country in a war that was not a war, in a cold war.

In 1998, the U.S. defense secretary approved awarding Cold War Recognition Certificates to all members of the armed forces, including the National Guard and reserves, and qualified government civilian personnel who served the nation during the Cold War era, Sept. 2, 1945-Dec. 26, 1991.

The certificate may be requested by use of U.S. or international forms found at the Army's Cold War webpage, <http://coldwar.army.mil>. It is a secure site, but anyone who doesn't feel comfortable providing a Social Security num-

ber online can obtain the form by mail.

Supporting documentation, which must be submitted with the request, includes military service number, foreign service number or Social Security number, a copy of a DD-214, which is the military service record, or a DD-215, which is a corrected version of that document. National Guard members should provide the statement of service equivalent, NGB Form 22.

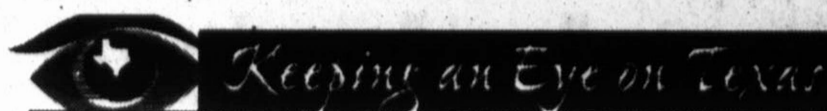

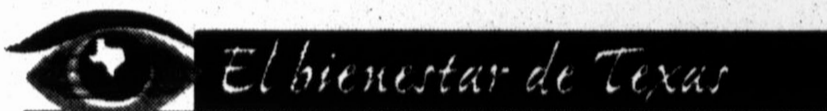

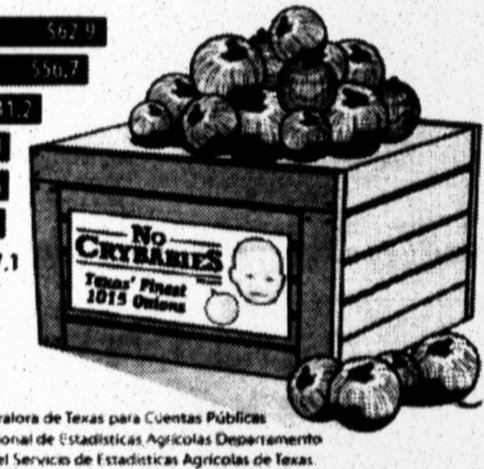

**Ford Focus quietly takes top spot in world's sales**

DETROIT (AP) — Shhhhh. Ford Motor Co. doesn't want you to know this, but its Focus compact is the world's best-selling car.

The automaker is trumpeting the news in Europe and on Wall Street, but it's not telling the rest of America.

After all, Ford is promoting the Focus in the United States as a ride for the young and stylish, not for the masses.

"They're trying to sell it more on attitude and emotion," said Wesley Brown, an analyst with Nextrend. "How

do you then throw in there that it's a best seller? It clashes with the message."

By many measures, the year-and-a-half-old car Focus has been a hit for Ford. The car, which sells for \$12,000 to \$15,000, has lured in a far younger audience than its predecessor, the Escort. It has attracted a number of first-time buyers, who may be more inclined to buy a Ford the next time around. And it has proved to Wall Street that Ford can sell the same basic car in different markets.

**Garcia named to state panel**

SAN ANTONIO — Because of her accomplishments in serving childhood intervention programs in the Texas Panhandle, Maria Garcia of Hereford was recently appointed by Gov. George W. Bush to the Texas Inner Agency Council on Early Childhood Intervention. She began her six-year term July 11 during special ceremonies in San Antonio.

Garcia is director of Uniting Parents, a Coalition of Health Services program working with children from infancy to age 21 with developmental disabilities. The service area includes all 26 coun-

ties of the Texas Panhandle. The Coalition of Health Services is a cooperative organization of hospitals throughout the region working together in an effort to address regional health issues. Uniting Parents provides comprehensive care and case management for children with or at risk of having developmental disabilities. At present they serve 653 families in 26 counties and will soon expand to 31 counties to include five counties in the Lubbock area.

"I'm very proud of our program and what we've been able to accomplish," Garcia said. The program began nine years ago as part of the no longer existing Amarillo Area Hospital Home Care. The program became a part of the Coalition of Health Services when the Coalition formed three years ago.

Garcia's successful partici-

pation in early childhood intervention programs began with the strongest of motivations. When her son Joe, 9, was born with Down Syndrome, developmental disabilities became a deeply personal issue for Garcia and her family.

"He (Joe) is my torch. He keeps me going," Garcia said. "I remember the fear (when Joe was born) about what was going to happen with my child." The raising of Joe and his two sisters, Victoria and Linda, continue to be the focal point of Garcia's life.

Garcia first began her involvement in early childhood intervention programs by starting a support program for families of children with developmental disabilities.

**14 students at WTAMU finish their McNair research work**

**Special to The Brand CANYON** — Fourteen West Texas A&M University students recently became the first on campus to complete summer research projects through the McNair Scholars Program.

The McNair Scholars Program is named for Dr. Ronald E. McNair, one of America's first black astronauts. He and six colleagues were killed in 1986 when the Space Shuttle Challenger exploded. After his death, Congress provided funding for the post-baccalaureate achievement program to encourage college students with similar backgrounds to McNair to enroll in graduate studies. The program targets low-income and first-generation college students.

The McNair Scholars Program prepares these carefully selected undergraduates for graduate study at the doctoral level. The program aims to increase numbers of students in doctoral programs from under represented groups and thus increase representation of these groups on college and university faculties. The program identifies qualified undergraduate students, provides them with faculty mentors in their chosen disciplines, and provides a research stipend for students to conduct research, possibly publish their

findings, and to present their work at research conferences.

"This has been a great opportunity. I learned a lot about doing research, and I learned a lot from doing the research itself. It was very constructive, and I feel much more prepared as I get ready for graduate school," Melissa De La Cruz, a senior elementary education major from Hereford, said.

De La Cruz researched "Using the Constructivist Theory in Teaching and Learning." She hopes one day to perhaps pursue a doctoral degree and become a member of the WTAMU faculty.

Mike Cook, director of WTAMU's McNair Scholars

Program, said the program is made possible through a grant from the U.S. Department of Education. Cook termed WTAMU's inaugural participation in the program "a success," crediting both the students and faculty mentors for embracing the program from the outset.

"I can't say enough about the faculty support and the quality of the students we had involved in our first year of the program," Cook said. "This can only help these students in the classroom and enhance their ability to achieve."

## Panhandle Community Services approved for \$400,000 for housing

The Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs has approved Panhandle Community Services for \$400,000 to be used for down payment and closing cost assistance for first time homebuyers, according to PCS executive director Johnny Raymond.

The agency serves the 26 counties of the Texas Panhandle with this program except in the Amarillo metropolitan area, which is served by the City of Amarillo.

The Hereford office of Panhandle Community Services is located at 1011 E. Park and Celia Serrano is the center coordinator.

Under the program, up to \$5,000 can be utilized (up to \$7,500 in some cases) for down payment and closing costs on a loan.

This is not a grant, but a zero interest, zero payment, second lien that does not come due until the first lien is paid off or on the premature sale or disposition of the property.

In essence, according to Raymond, it is moving the down payment and closing costs from the front of the loan where the money may not be available, to the back of the loan where it can be more readily addressed.

Homes purchased under the program cannot exceed \$59,877 for an existing home, or \$94,716 for a new home.

"We expect the money to be available to begin administering the program late in August," Raymond said.

Applications may be made at the Hereford center for

PCS, where an applicant's income will be checked against program guidelines to see if they qualify. The income guidelines differ by county.

If the applicant qualifies under the guidelines, they still must be able to meet the credit requirements of the lender they choose to work with. After initial application, PCS works strictly with the lender.

Interested parties should contact Serrano at 364-5631 to make initial application for the assistance as soon as it becomes available.

The honor attendant was gowned in royal blue with silver trim and carried an arm bouquet of carnations and baby's breath.

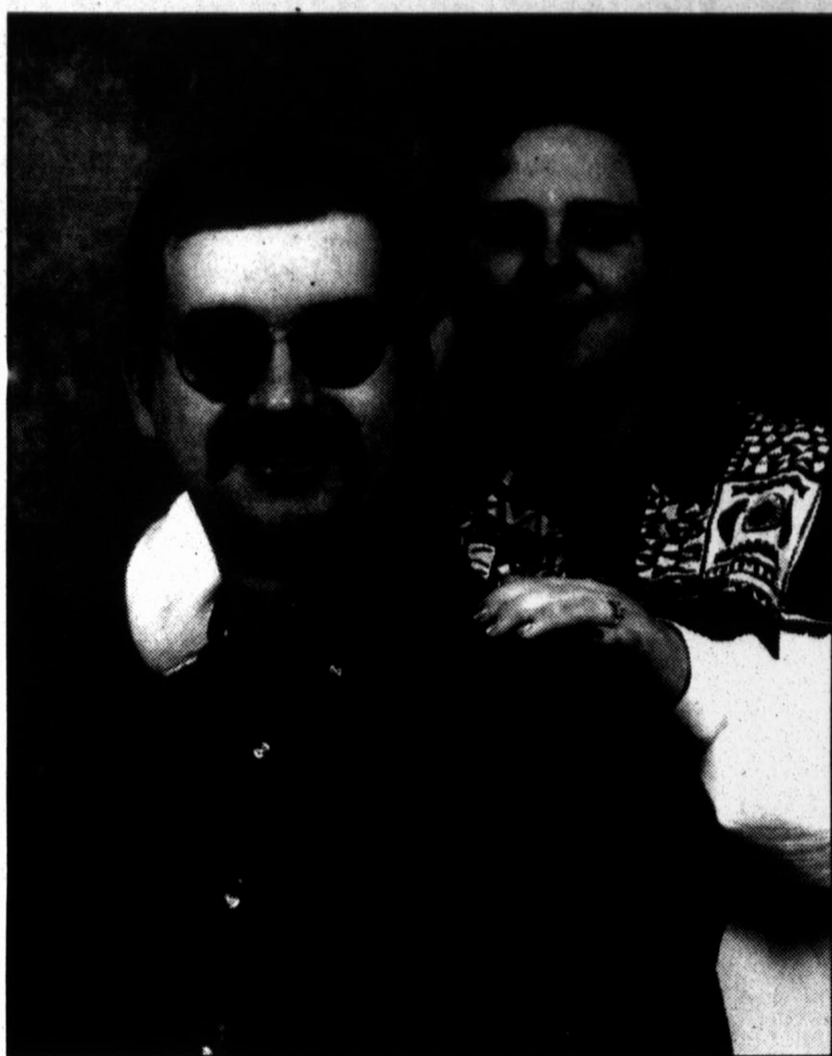

## Mature Marketing: The Baby Boomers are Growing Up

(Last of two parts)

Last week, we discussed how the baby boomers would continue to be a lucrative target for marketers who understand this diverse generation. We also discussed four potential growth areas: medical, technology, education and luxury spending. This week we'll provide a little marketing strategy for appealing to the

baby boomer generation.

There is money to be made by marketing to this group of nearly 76 million Americans. Here are some tips on how to get more bang for your marketing dollars. Use these strategies to build market share with boomers.

### How to sell to boomers

...Show them the "value." Baby boomers are no different than most consumers: they want good value in exchange for the money they spend. Boomers are strong spenders, but because they are acutely self-interested they will walk away from any deals with marginal or questionable values.

Remember this, is a well wired, highly educated segment of the population. They are knowledge rich. They know products, services, features and benefits. Often they are more knowledgeable than the person trying to sell them. You can only be successful if you know what you're selling and focus on giving them honest value.

...Sell up. This generation will buy top-of-the-line items. From laptops to lumber and clothing to cars, they like to buy the highest quality. You can benefit if you can convert the features of your products and services, to tangible benefits the boomer buyer will receive. So, show the best, point out the benefits and prove why the top-of-the-line is the best value long term.

...Don't treat all boomers the same. This is a diverse generation. Many boomers are enjoying their grandchildren as they turn fifty. Others have young children of their own. Some are at the peak of their careers, others are returning to school or starting a business.

Take time to learn about each boomer customer as an individual. This is good advice for all customer groups, but especially wise for this diverse generation.

...Focus on experience, not age. Boomers are aging physically, but not mentally. Most are in their 40s and 50s, but are still thinking 20s and 30s. They will live longer than any previous generation and be more active at the same time. They aren't going to grow old gracefully.

Focus your marketing efforts on their experience, not their age. Focus on what they can do, not what they can't. It's a subtle selling philosophy, but a sound one.

...Understand their limitations. For example, as boomers age their eyesight will deteriorate. Make certain your marketing messages can be read. Think about your business cards, brochures, packaging, etc. You may need to go to larger type sizes, select simpler type faces and add more white space.

You may need to add a little lighting to brighten your store or office. If you're playing music, turn it down a little. And, they'll need a comfortable chair if they have to wait too long.

...Don't expect boomers to be traditional buyers. This is the "different" generation. They shun tradition in their approach to life, business and buying. They will buy non-traditional goods, they are "early adopters" and don't care much about the country of origin. Expect the unexpected and your marketing plans will be successful.

There are nearly 76 million baby boomers. You can grow your business if you carefully analyze the products and services they will need as they age. If you can help them secure their futures, save them time, lower their stress levels and improve their quality of life, they can make you rich.

# Between the Covers

You don't always have to take a trip to Europe to encounter Europeans. The other day, a couple came into the library to use the Internet. This is not

usual, but as it turned out, they were from France, bicycling across the U.S. They were checking their web page, updated periodically by friends in France using information sent to them by e-mail. The page included a photograph of the couple on their bicycles somewhere in the North America. What fun!

They started in New York and were scheduled to be in California by the end of the month. This is not the first time for the French gentleman to do this. His first tour was accomplished by himself, but he did agree that it was a more enjoyable trip with his female companion. They are doing this just for fun.

After they left, and I was telling another patron about them, I realized that I should have taken a picture of the couple. We might just begin a collection, a gallery, of people who have visited our library from unusual and far-flung places. Maybe next time I will remember to do that. And, there will be a next time, as the world shrinks, and technology brings Hereford into the "global village." Internet has wide ranging ramifications, many of which we never anticipated. Speaking of Internet and

computers and libraries, I was privileged to attend a "Before Your Computer Arrives" workshop in Amarillo, provided by The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. Say what you want about Bill Gates, but you can't fault him for what he is doing for libraries all over the country.

We have been awarded more than \$18,000 in grant monies to purchase four PC workstations, a content server, a laser printer, plus a ton of software. They also include a stipend for making the necessary adjustments and updates in wiring to accommodate the new equipment. The only thing they don't provide for us is the furniture.

One thing I love about the whole program is that the Foundation didn't throw computers at us and expect us to know what to do with them. They have librarians on their staff to help determine the kind of equipment which will best serve libraries, develop training that librarians can understand, and design the grant process and ongoing tech support to accommodate library staff who are technologically underdeveloped and challenged. The Gates Foundation has chosen to enter our world to be of the utmost assistance, rather than forcing us to try to jump through their hoops.

The workshop was to help us prepare for the implementation phase of the grant and give us an overview of the training and support phases. I am so relieved that they will send someone from Seattle to hook up our network and teach us how to take full advantage of the technological marvels at our fingertips. This person will spend two days with us to set up

our system and to give us personal, one-on-one training. This is invaluable training that would be impossible for Deaf Smith County Library to provide on our own.

They are making the whole process as easy as it is possible to make it, with their stated goal being, "to ensure that members of every community have continued access to digital technologies including computer applications and the Internet." The whole community benefits. The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation also believes that this funding should serve as a catalyst for government, business, foundations, and individuals in the community to support the public library as an institution. Their goal is for the community to sustain access to technology beyond the life of the equipment they are now donating.

The grant program seems to be well thought out as well as generously supported by the foundation. We are grateful for all they are doing to enable us to provide access to the world for the citizens of Deaf Smith County.

There is an ongoing debate about whether advancing technology will replace the written page. While I doubt that it will, I suppose it is a possibility, but not this week.

While you're waiting to read *The Brethren*, you might want to scratch that itch with *The Great Divide* by T. Davis Bunn. When attorney Marcus Glenwood resigns from his prestigious corporate law firm to retreat to the small town of Rocky Mount, N.C., and rebuild his life after a devastating personal tragedy, he has no idea that the biggest, most emotionally difficult case of his entire career is about to fall into his backyard.

It is a fragile and spiritually wounded Glenwood who first meets his distraught clients, Alma and Austin Hall. ## Stock work goes to the Catahoulas

At a time when the numbers of agricultural workers are declining, cattlemen are constantly searching for cost-effective ways to work their stock.

One local man — John Kropp — believes he's found the best help possible. From the swamps and bayous of Louisiana to the salt cedars of East Texas and the hills and draw of New Mexico, stockmen are discovering the benefits of good stock dogs, particularly the Louisiana Catahoula blue-leopard cow dogs.

Kropp is no exception. "These dogs can replace four or five good men," Kropp said, while looking over his pen of working dogs. "It just makes sense when you think about the way the ranch work crews are changing. They can help gather and handle cattle and they are always ready to go."

"You're not gonna get a Catahoula whumped," he says. "They're just that tough. They're heat-resistant and just a lot of fun to be around."

Kropp works with several breeds of dogs, including blue heelers, Australian shepherds and border collies, but his favorite is the Catahoula.

"If I could only have one dog, it would have to be the Catahoula. They're big clowns one minute and deadly serious the next. They're just good dogs," Kropp said.

Kropp's fondness for the dogs is evident in only a short discussion. His fondness, though, doesn't blind him to the shortcomings of the breed.

"They don't have the work ethic of the border collies, which wake up ready to work, but they've got a lot of athletic ability and they're very

trainable and have a lot of natural instinct," Kropp said, while scratching the ears of a border collie.

Catahoulas are more hound like than shepherd, Kropp explained.

"They don't have to see the cattle to be able to find them. They sniff out a trail or wind 'em. They stop 'em and bay 'em up," he said.

Kropp said there are three ways the Catahoula work cattle. The strike dog is able to pick up a cold trail and is usually the first to pick up the scent. The bay dog usually circles and holds livestock until humans arrive and the catcher will hold and catch one at a time.

Kropp says pups can begin training as early as two or three months old, but there are a few things a handler has to remember.

"You gotta set up training sessions so the pup doesn't get hurt and make sure it doesn't get outrun. Something about that just sets up a mental block and it's hard to get them past it. Other than that, it's

more patience than training," he said.

"Lots of people don't realize how valuable a dog can be to

a stockman. You gotta get the cattle dog-broke, used to being worked by dog. Cattle just handle different with a set of dogs."

Kropp is a natural story teller, at least as far as the Catahoulas go.

He sits in the shade and watches as a gyp (female) plays with a couple of young pups. He releases the male and all four tear across the yard in some kind of wild

chase.

"They're the biggest thieves you'll ever have in camp. They'll pick up gloves, shoes, ropes, just whatever they can get. I used to have one that would stick her paw outside the pen and drag in anything she could get a hold of."

Most of Kropp's Catahoula tales are funny, but they show the determination of the breed.

"Once we were working

some young steers and this one had fallen, so we went to get it up. We knew we were supposed to have two dogs, but we could only find one. Then I saw this little tail just a-waggin' under this 900-pound steer. When we got the steer up, she was still hanging on to 'im. You'd a thought she'd been hurt, but she was ready

to go again." Kropp says the dogs are mainly working animals that can be trained to hunt livestock or humans, but he doesn't see a lot of aggression in the breed.

"They're good dogs, but I wouldn't consider them pets. They're work dogs and they're good at it."

## Drought brings more woes

### Hot dry conditions perfect for pests

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — A Plains drought has dried up soil, stunted corn stalks, helped more weeds grow in cornfields and brought on a particularly destructive corn crop insect.

Several farmers have complained that their herbicides are not working as well this year, causing more weeds, said Steve Gramlich, University of Nebraska-Lincoln Cooperative Extension Educator in North Platte.

Some western Nebraska farms are being hit hard with the western bean cutworm — an aggressive insect that can destroy corn.

For many farmers, the weeds and the onslaught of the cutworm have just added to problems brought on by a drought that has reduced

yields and increased costs.

The western bean cutworm, which thrives in dry weather and sandy soils, usually is found in Nebraska west of North Platte. But this year it has shown up in large numbers at least 150 miles further east, near Aurora and north into Plainview.

Byron Hoch, who farms near Bertrand, said he had to spray his several thousand acres of corn for the bug for the first time in the 26 years he's been farming.

The spraying limited the damage to his crops, but was another cost in a tough year.

"We had to throw another unexpected expense at the corn crop," he said. "That western bean cutworm — you can lose a third of a crop in a hurry."

"It's been a triple whammy this year. Nothing works."

## Farmers say changes inadequate

WASHINGTON (AP) — A farmers group says major changes in federal farm policy being pushed by two Republican lawmakers are inadequate.

The Rural America Prosperity Act offers to help farmers by allowing them to fully deduct the costs of their health care; to exclude from the capital gains tax \$500,000 from the sale of a farm or primary residence; and change some other business tax provisions.

"We must do more to bring prosperity to America's farms, ranches and rural communities," said one of the bill's sponsors, Rep. John Boehner, R-Ohio.

National Farmers Union President Leland Swenson said the legislation introduced Wednesday by Boehner and Sen. Richard Lugar of Indiana, the Republican chairman of the Senate Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry Committee, failed to offer the kind of help farmers really need.

The proposal "does not address the biggest problem facing our nation's farmers and ranchers: low prices," Swenson said. "It does not promote rural development. It does not promote fair competition."

"Without significant changes that influence price, competitive markets and a safety net, these proposals are false solutions to the real problems facing the family-sized operation," he added.

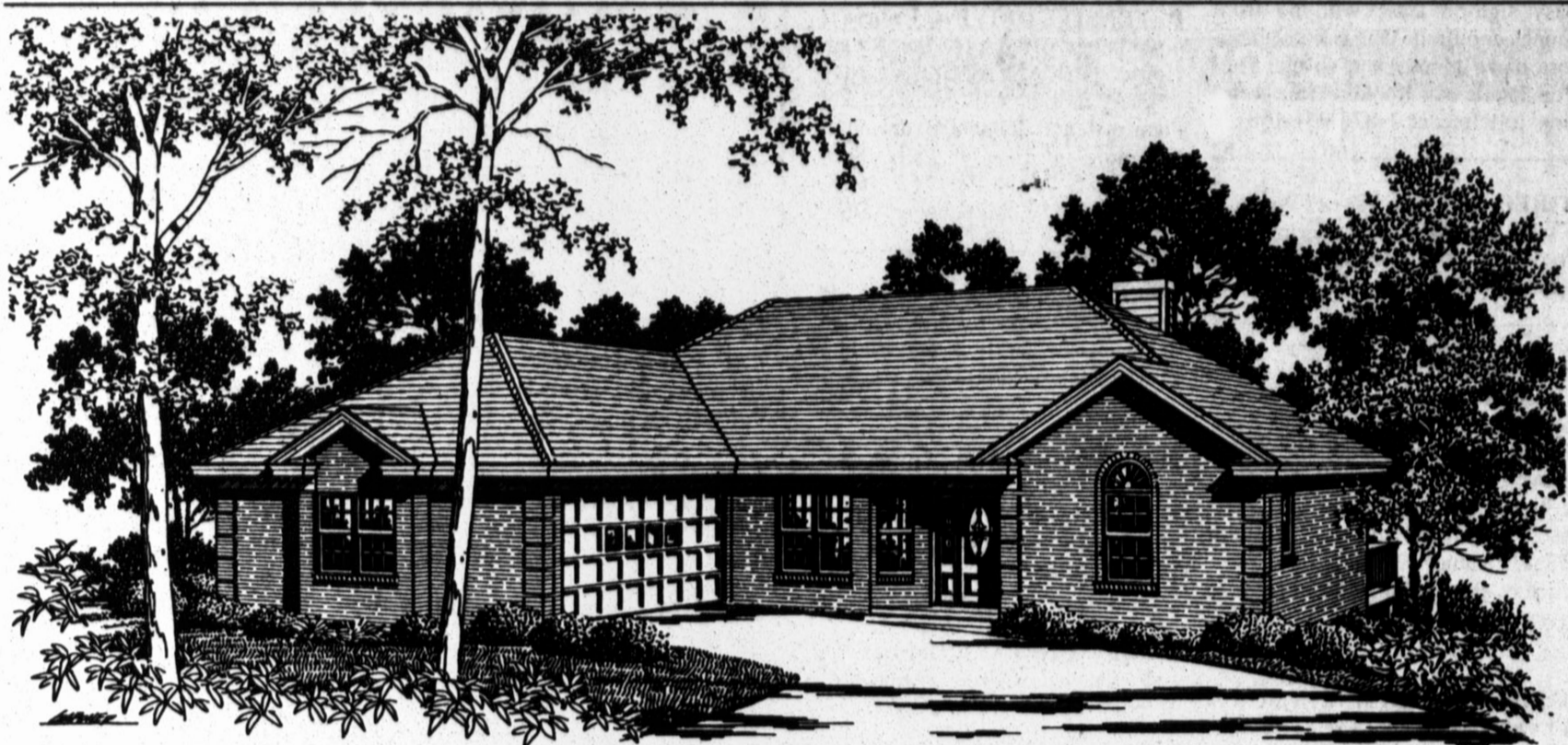

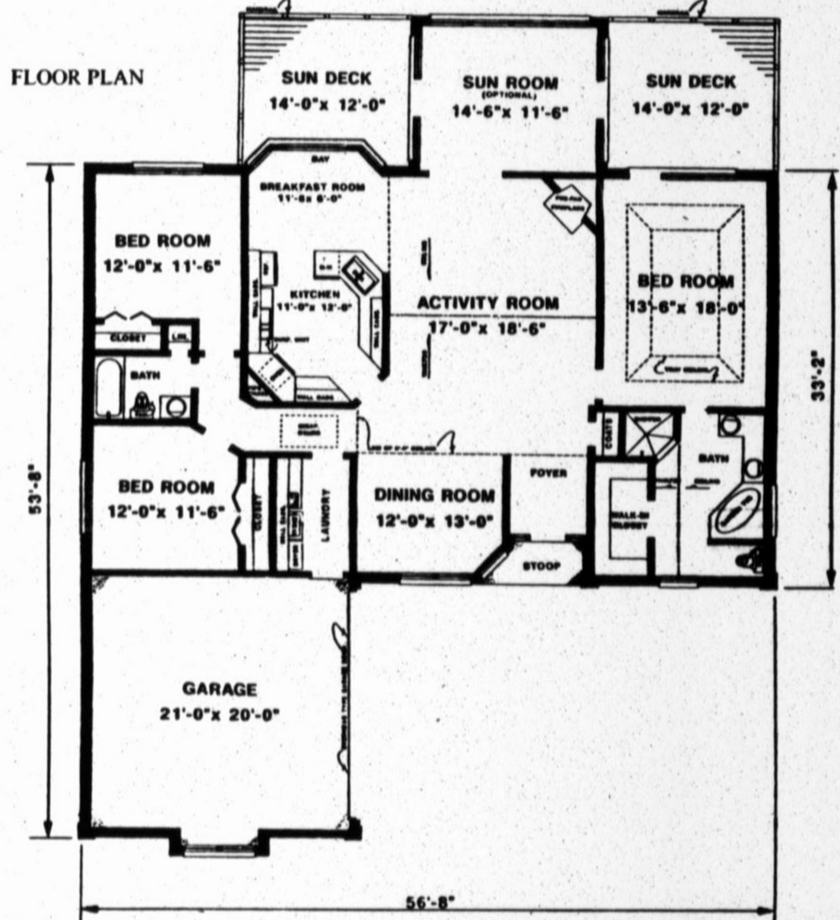

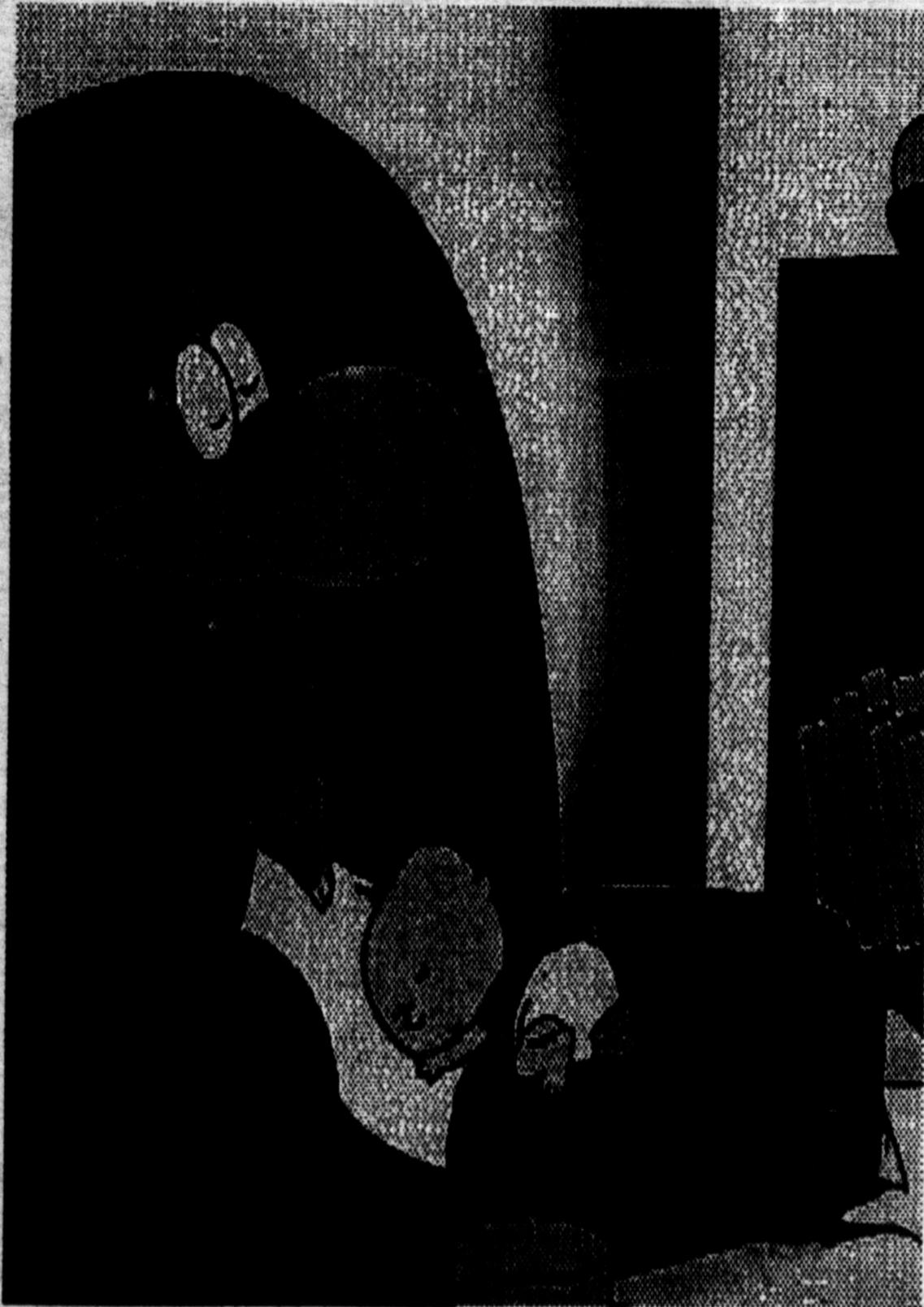

### Smart and funny Baby Blues jazzes up summer doldrums

*Baby Blues*, a new animated series beginning a tryout run Friday, July 28, on The WB Network, has had one of the longest gestation periods in TV history.

Its five-year development process led to widespread rumors that the show was a stinker, but *Blues* — a candidate for a midseason berth during the 2000-01 season — is actually smartly written and engagingly played by an appealing voice cast.

Based on a successful comic strip of the same name by Rick Kirkman and Jerry Scott, who serve as co-executive producers on the series, *Baby Blues* was developed by Jeff Martin (*The Simpsons*) and Pete Ocko (the underrated *Dinosaurs*). The new show's classy pedigree is evident in its savvy blend of contemporary realism and snarky satire.

Like the Kirkman-Scott comic, the animated series focuses mainly on Darryl and Wanda MacPherson (voices by Mike O'Malley and Julia Sweeney), a 20-something couple re-

cently blessed by a young daughter, Zoe. But *Blues* surrounds this family

with a host of colorful characters, including blue-collar neighbors Carl and Melinda (Joel Murray, Arabella Field) and their three rowdy kids. At the of-

fice, Darryl receives copious unsolicited advice from his colleague Kenny

(Diedrich Bader, *The Drew Carey Show*), who is so self-absorbed he

doesn't understand the true nature of the relationship between his own wife and her "special friend," another woman.

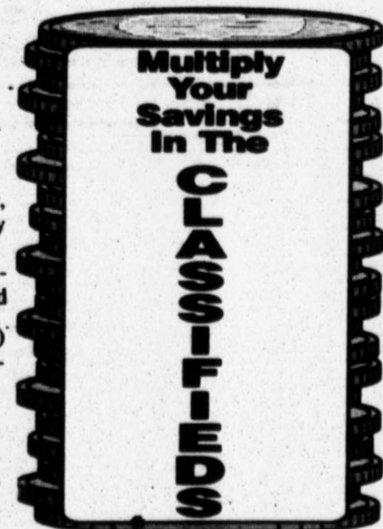
The WB is positioning *Baby Blues* as a "family" show, but its sensibility and

content are distinctly adult and probably will be best appreciated by young

parents in the same boat as Darryl and Wanda. There's plenty for every taste

here, though, whether the writers are sending up Scientology, toothy self-help guru Tony Robbins or *Touched by an Angel*.

*Baby Blues* is neither as flat-out inspired as *The Simpsons* nor as honest as *King of the Hill*, but it is far superior to such other recent fare as *Family Guy*, the WB's own *Mission Hill* and NBC's upcoming and ghastly *Sammy*.

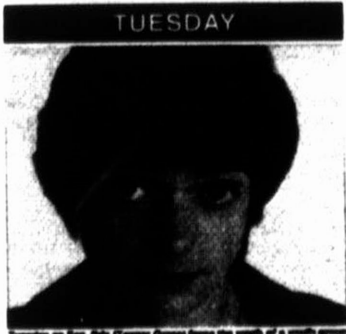

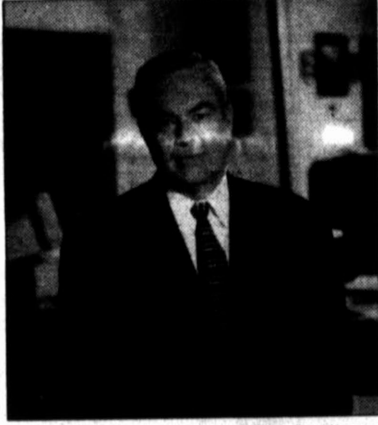
