Survey dispels Hispanic stereotypes

Most of the nation's 17 million ton. Americans of Mexican, Puerto Rican or Cuban origin don't identify with 2,817 Latinos and 598 themselves as part of one large Hispanic community, a survey has found.

While they share a common issues, Hispanics don't constitute a unified voting bloc, according to the Latino National Political Survey.

"Our findings challenge the notion of a distinct U.S. Hispanic community with shared cultural, political and economic interests," said lead researcher Rodolfo de la Garza.

"While the results suggest that there may be a basis for a national Latino political community, they also make clear that it will not spring primarily from a shared cultural University of Texas at Austin.

In fact, the researchers found, Hispanics are more favorably inclined to Anglos than they are toward Hispanics of descent from countries other than their own.


Among the survey's other findings, most Hispanics:

-Use English as their primary language, with mainly foreign-born Hispanics relying mostly on Spanish. Hispanics born in the United States have significantly higher levels of English proficiency than their foreign-born peers.

-U.S.-born Hispanics have higher levels of education, better jobs and more income than their foreign-born counterparts.

-Don't support increased immigration. More than 65 percent believe there are too many immigrants entering the country.

-Don't support traditional roles for women, contrary to stereotype. Hispanics are more likely than non-Hispanics to agree that women are better off in the workplace than if they stay at home.

My daddy was Santa Claus at many different occasions. Frio community had asked him to come for 35 consecutive years to their annual Christmas party. As Santa, he visited the schools, the hospital, private parties of all kinds, walked the streets, sat in different stores, and visited rest homes.

Through the years, Christmas has been special to all of us, but especially to those of us who know that our daddy is Santa Claus. My youngest brother, Troy, first knew that his daddy was Santa Claus when Mother took him to visit Santa in a store. Daddy had forgotten to wear gloves and when they left, my brother said, "I believe Santa is my daddy because those are my daddy's hands." Later, my own children had seen him dressed or dressing as Santa when we visited my parents during December. One of my sons, Steve, almost had a fist fight in first grade when a second grader decided to explain the facts of Santa to him. The older boy

was trying to break the news that his daddy was Santa Claus and my son was very positive that his granddaddy was indeed, Santa Claus.

When he was 79 years old, Daddy broke his leg on the job at the cattle feed yards. The next year he could walk only with a walker, so my brother-in-law made a plywood "sleigh" to fit on either side of his wheelchair making it possible for him to still be Santa. In 1991, Daddy was in the hospital following surgery during Christmas. Many of the nurses had sat on his knee as children and now their children also had come to know him as Santa Claus. They would come into his room and comment. "Mr. Gandy, it just doesn't seem right that Santa Claus should be in the hospital at Christmas

This coming December, my daddy will be 88 years old. He hasn't been physically able to be "Santa Claus" in 6 or 7 years, but he misses having the "Santa experiences" each Christmas and now he spends time remembering the 40 or more Christmases past. To me and all of our family, my daddy, Cliff Gandy, of Hereford, Texas truly is Santa Claus.



age son came home the other day with a story that floored me. One of his high school teachers is teaching the students that there are five sexes in the human race--male, female, homosexual, bisexual and asexual.

DEAR ANN LANDERS: My mother, who is 59 years old, is slowly dying from Alzheimer's disease. This beautiful person, once a talented and professional businesswoman, has been so tragically affected by her illness that she can no longer dress, bathe or feed herself. She is incontinent and cannot recognize me even though I care for her every day.

Many times at work and in social situations, I hear such comments as "I can't remember anything. I think I'm getting Alzheimer's." This is usually followed by laughter and more jokes about forgetfulness associated with this cruel illness. I don't understand how people can be so insensitive. 
Gift-making from the heart

Hometown teachers

Over a million dollars a year is leaving Hereford, trickling out every day through employment of out-of-town teachers, administrators and counselors by the Hereford Independent School District.

There is already enough leakage of money from Hereford's economic

base. A recent survey showed that almost half of our effective buying is going out of town. True, a person has the right to spend their money wherever they desire. A vital, healthy retail district is important to our community in many ways, and all of us need to consider those factors before shopping out of town.

Folks in the public sector especially should be beholden to Hereford merchants. No one in Amarillo pays a dime of taxes in the Hereford school district. If you can get it at Winn's or Gibson's or Anthony's or Brookhart's or The Atrium or wherever in Hereford, persons in the public sector (teachers, county and city workers) should patronize the folks who are paying their salaries.

With approximatley 60 HISD employees living outside of Deaf Smith County, we are losing more than \$1 million a year. We are losing persons who could be active members of our churches, volunteers in organizations, and serving as role models in ways other than in the traditional classroom setting. If they are living in Canyon or Amarillo or elsewhere, the community is losing twice. Surely the school district can find qualified teachers who will reside in this community.

There was a policy that only Deaf Smith County residents are eligible to work in the Hereford Independent School District. That policy was rescinded or is being ignored. The problem with out-of-county hires was discussed by Chamber officials with our current superintendent, Charles Greenawalt, and his predecessor, Dr. Harold Holder, but out-of-county hiring continues.

Hereford taxpayers, tired of bearing an ever-larger burden, deserve better. They deserve to know that everyone working at HISD is paying their share of taxes in the same district, and that those school employees are doing more than their fair share of personal business in Hereford.

Reform in eyes of the reformer

WASHINGTON (AP) - Reform is a risky political business, except for the people who get to decide what it is. That's why politicians would rather give reform than get it.

The hassle over House rules changes is a case in point.

Congressional Democrats call it reform for the sake of efficiency and fairness, while outnumbered Republicans complain they're being bullied by revisions that will bring down the gavel on overtime talk - and also enable five Democratic delegates to vote on legislation.

Conservative Republicans saw an opening and grabbed it for a nightly series of speeches assailing Democrats in general and, often, House Speaker Thomas P. O'Neill Jr. in particular. O'Neill retaliated in 1984 by changing the TV, rules; the C-SPAN cameras that had been required to focus only on whoever was speaking began periodically panning the House floor - showing when nobody was there to listen. That enraged the Republican orators, but it's still the procedure.

The new rule doesn't eliminate the overtime speeches, but it will limit them to no more than three hours, split evenly between the parties, with a 9 p.m. curfew.

Most nights, that probably won't make a lot of difference. But Republicans see it as another narrowing of their already sparse minority powers. It would, for example, preclude the infrequent staged, on abortion last year and on flag-burning the year before.

The new rules also limit the

party will be held to 10. Those also have been tailored to television; they're perfect for sound bites on the issue of the day, since any member

can orate on any subject.

Rep. Robert H. Michel, the minority leader, often conciliatory in the past, called the speechmaking limits an outrageous attempt to stifle Republicans, and threatened to retaliate with disruptive parliamentary tactics.

The change on voting by delegates to Congress is more substantive, and Republicans were said to be weighing court challenge on that front. Prompted in part by pressures to make the District of Columbia a state, the Democrats decided to grant limited floor votes to the congressional delegates from the capital, Puerto Rico, American Samoa, Guam and the Virgin Islands. All five are Democrats, effectively widening the majority

Republicans gained 10 House seats in the November elections for a total of 176 in the new Congress. Democrats have 258, and there is one independent.

The delegates already can introduce bills and amendments, and vote on legislation in committee. Under the new rule, they will be able to vote when the House is acting as a committee of the whole, which is the parliamentary all-night speeches the GOP has status in which most of its significant business is done. Notes on the Law

It is estimated that approximately 150 different languages are now being spoken in the United States. This has led to a variety of cases brought by persons who do not speak English against manufacturers and employers who give warnings only in English.

One recent case involved a suit against an aspirin manufacturer on behalf of a child who developed Reye's Syndrome after being given the aspirin. The bottle of aspirin contained a warning regarding Reye's Syndrome but the warning was only given in English. The child's parents did not speak or read any English.

The California Court of Appeals held that whether or not the manufacturer was under a duty to warn was a question for the jury to decide. In deliberating the issue, the jury was to consider several factors including the nature of the product, the marketing efforts directed to the segment of the population who do not speak English and the number of non-English speaking persons in the potential market for the product. The Court found that the California state statute adopting English as the official language was not relevant.

The Court also was not swayed by the fact that the child did have English speaking and reading siblings in the household that could have read the label to the mother or by the fact that the mother did not attempt to ascertain whether the aspirin would be harmful for the child.

As has been noted, the Court held that whether or not there was a duty to warn the mother in her own language was an issue for the jury. This puts the manufacturer in a difficult situation. It seems implausible for the manufacturer to print the warning in all 150 languages. Yet failure to do so could result in significant liability.

There are other cases which have established that totally illiterate persons can recover because the manufacturer failed to utilize symbols to warn of potential dangers. See, Campos v. Firestone Tire & Rubber Co., 485 A2d 305 and Hubbard-Hall Chemical Co. v. Silverman, 340 F2d 402.

As of yet, the courts have found liability for failure to warn in several cases without placing any judicial limitations on the scope of potential liability. Indeed, under the cases, a jury could hold a manufacturer liable if he warned in 149 languages but someone who spoke the 150th language was injured. Perhaps the answer is the adoption of a universal warning symbol system. People maneuvering on the roads of America also speak the same 150 languages and now there is a universal warning system for the highways. Perhaps the pharmaceutical companies will adopt a similar system to warn of dangers in using aspirin and other medications.

Researcher keeps eye on potato families

COLLEGE STATION -- More than 300 parents and 50,000 children are participating in a Texas program to find the cream of the crop, and that's no small potatoes.

"It's all a numbers game," says Dr. Creighton Miller. "The more we pull the slot machine, the greater our chance of getting cherry, cherry, cherry."

Or spud, spud, spud.

Miller a Texas Agricultural Experiment Station horticulturist, natures tens of thousands of potato plants each year searching for the ultimate tuber. So much time is spent with the individual plants that MIller refers to them in familial terms. "We plant all the kids of a family in a row," he says. One gets the idea that Mr. Potatohead could be a cousin.

"There will never be a perfect person, or variety," Miller says. "What we're trying to do is like crossing in all-American football player with a National Merit Scholar to get a really smart athlete."

With an \$18,000 grant from Farming Technology, Inc., a Houstonbased packing company, Miller is developing new Texas varieties that can be harvested to fill a void in the market when potatoes from other states are not available.

But potato matchmaking is tricky. For one thing, seeds produced in a tomato-like fruit on the vine above ground will not necessarily yield a potato like the tuber below ground.

"There may be 200 seeds in a fruit. Each is totally different and could be a new variety," Miller explains. "If this seed is planted, it might produce a short or tall plant, a white or a russet

Thus, researchers try to cross similar parents to narrow the variation in the "children," he notes. New plants are grown from pieces that come from a potato cut into two-ounce sections, each including one or more "eyes" that will grow into a plant.

Also, potatoes are tetraploids, which

double what most plant species have. That complicates the inheritance of important traits.

We may look at 200,000 seedlings to find one that could become a new variety," Miller says.


But Miller is getting a jump on the numbers by using such modern techniques as tissue culture to quickly grow plants for experimental use. Instead of getting four tubers from a parent potato, tissue culture may provide Miller with 4,000 mini-tubers to plant and evaluate in a shorter time. "It takes about one year to do what we used to do in five or six years," he

The super spud of Texas will be one with vines that can withstand hailstorms and hot, desiccating winds in the state's main producing area northwest of Lubbock.

Miller is selecting plants in the breeding program that will mature early--for the late-July to early-August market--and that are resistant to means they have 48 chromosomes, or disease and environmental stresses. He says researchers have used wild potatoes from around the world to find these resistances, as well as to Colorado potato beetles and frost. Varieties with these last two qualities are almost ready for release to growers.

In addition to withstanding cultural nd climatic conditions, Miller adds, the breeding program is developing U.S. potato varieties with yellow and orange flesh, similar to European potatoes. The pigments that color the flesh also have increased anti-cancer components, he says.

"The yellow-flesh potatoes are very good, but it may be psychological,' Miller says. "You think the butter is already on it. Colored potatoes might never be a major part of the market in the United States where the white flesh potatoes are preferred, but they will be a special and important part of the

Most farmers believe that agriculture is not a major cause of environmental problems," said Dr. Jim Mjelde of a recent study of Texas farmers' perceptions about environmental concerns by a team of Texas Agricultural Experiment Station researchers. "But 70 percent said government involvement is a cause of many problems in agriculture."

The findings are important because people who do not see themselves as part of a problem will be less likely to join in solutions, said Mjelde, a resource economist.

"If you don't feel that you are harming the environment, why would you enroll in a conservation program," Mjelde pointed out.

More than 1,000 Texas farmers from the Panhandle to the Gulf Coast

Illegas waste dumping, litter garbage, industrial discharge and sewer systems, for example, are perceived by farmers as the main sources of water pollution, Mjelde said. Only 2 percent of the farmers said they are involved in the water quality incentives program.

Soil erosion, pesticide or fertilizer runoff and livestock waste were listed by 4 percent or fewer farmers as being a major source of water pollution in Texas, although as many as 40 percent believe those sources are at least a minor cause of the problem.

Mjelde noted that low participation in specific government conservation programs could be due to the newness of the programs, a lack of information, geographic differences in the state and poorly developed programs.

By percentage, here's what the Texas farmers said on the issues:

-- On agriculture and wildlife-farmers should be concerned about protecting wetlands for wildlife, 70 percent; endangered species and their habitat should be protected on agricultural land, 47 percent; agriculture water pollution is a serious threat to fish and wildlife, 27 percent.







Grid star to Lt. Governor: Mildren has full life

By WHIT CANNING Fort Worth Star-Telegram

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) - The original dream, as formulated in the pole vault pit at Abilene's old Fair Park Stadium, had nothing to do with becoming lieutenant governor of Oklahoma.

It would have seemed such a small thing then, and the dreams of 7- and 8-year-old boys reach far loftier heights ... such as becoming, eventually, one of Chuck Moser's famed Abilene Eagles ...

Before Jack Mildren had a chance to become a mighty Eagle, they built a new high school (Cooper) in Abilene, and he settled for being a classmate of one of Chuck Moser's daughters. And becoming one of the most famous schoolboy heroes in the history of an area that regards them as a regional birthright.

After several whirlwind recruiting courtships, he landed at the University of Oklahoma just in time to witness the birth of the Wishbone and quarterback a team that could have outscored the Red Army. In fact, it was the Red Army,

Moving ever onward to the ranks of professional football, he finally came to ask himself, "How many more nights I really wanted to spend in the snow, in Buffalo?"

He returned to Oklahoma and settled in to raising kids and making money in the oil business, eventually owning his own company. He sold it in 1988, a transaction that "gave me an opportunity to begin doing some things at my own pace."

Such as politics. With his brother Richard as his campaign manager, Mildren won the lieutenant governor's post.

The father of three teen-agers (Leigh, 17; Lauren, 13; Drew, 12), he regards education as a paramount concern in training new generations of Oklahomans to survive in a troubled society.

"Football was a means to an end for me," says Mildren, 43, who graduated from Oklahoma an Academic All-American with a degree in petroleum land management. "I thoroughly enjoyed it, but when I speak to young people today, I talk to them about education -.not something I did 20 years ago wearing a funny-looking red helmet."

Nevertheless, Mildren is grateful for his roots - the son of a football coach growing up in a West Texas town dominated, largely, by family, church and football - where on Fridays they roped off the end zones for high school Armageddons and on Saturdays the Methodists drove the church bus to Dallas to watch SMU

There wasn't a lot of opportunity to get in trouble," he says, smiling. "It was a good place to grow up."

He grew up listening to tales of Abilene heroes such as Glynn Gregory and Jimmy Carpenter.

By the time Mildren got to Abilene Cooper, the team had "lost something like 15 or 20 straight games," competing in the district then known as the Little Southwest Conference.

They had also hired former Oklahoma star Merrill Green as coach, and the losing soon ended. By Mildren's senior season, 1967, the Cougars seemed everything the awesome Eagles had once been.

By the time they rolled into TCU's Amon Carter Stadium on a cold, gray December day, they stood 13-0 and

had scored 495 points to 80 for their foes. They were the top-ranked team in Texas and were expected to become the third consecutive team from their district to win the state title (Odessa Permian had won in '65 and

San Angelo in '66). The opponent was Austin Reagan, also undefeated but less exalted. The Cougars were so confident that when they won the coin toss, they chose to kick off. Reagan's Johnny Kleinert returned it 97 yards for a touchdown.

Mildren regrouped his team and drove Cooper to a 19-7 halftime lead, but Reagan had a plan.

"I thought Cooper was physically the finest high school team I had ever seen," Raiders coach Travis Raven said a few years later, "but we felt they had a tendency to let up in the second half. I told our kids if we could stay close to them, we had a chance to win, and that's what happened."

Reagan scored twice to regain the lead, 20-19, and then, late in the game, Mildren whipped his team downfield one last time - 71 yards to the lip of the goal, with no timeouts left.

On the final play of the game, he waved Cooper's field goal kicker off the field and hurriedly tried a quarterback sneak - which failed by

Capping a 2,873-yard season that would one day earn him "Quarterback of the Decade" honors from Texas Football magazine, Mildren finished the day with 210 yards ... and a feeling that he had probably witnessed the end of civilization.

"Losing everything you dreamed of that way - on a controversial play with no time left - is a pretty momentous event in the life of an 18-year-old kid," he says. "Even today, after all these years, it still stings a little

The loss, of course, did not dissuade recruiters - who were lined up from Austin to South Bend and sea to shining

He settled on Oklahoma largely through the efforts of a young Sooners assistant named Barry Switzer, with whom he maintains a close friendship.

Mildren arrived at OU during a relative decline in the Sooners' fortunes - the 1969-70 teams went 6-4 and 7-4-1 - and, he says, "around here, six-and-four is like slow death."

Things were about to speed up, however. After a loss to Oregon State early in the '70 season, the decision was made to scrap the Veer and go to the Wishbone. Among other things, this meant the Sooners had one week to install a new offense to face unbeaten Texas - the defending national champion.

OU was mangled, 41-9, but by the end of the year the Sooners were in a bowl - and looking forward to '71.

Few teams in the history of American football have been as awesome as the one that blew out of Norman in '71 like some sort of swirling red storm - with Mildren at the controls. Perched behind him in the backfield, like cocked revolvers,

were Leon Crosswhite, Joe Wylie and Greg Pruitt.

It was a team that scored 534 points in 12 games and set a National Collegiate Athletic Association record by rushing for 472.4 yards per game. It had two 1,000-yard rushers (Pruitt, Mildren), three All-Americans (Pruitt, Mildren, center Tom Brahaney) and nine All-Big Eight selections. Mildren set a Sooners record with 2,018 total yards.

In the third game of the season, the Sooners ripped Southern California for 33 points, throwing only one pass (incomplete). The shattered Trojans never recovered, stumbling to a 6-4-1 finish salvaged by a victory against Notre Dame.

A week later, OU faced Texas, which hadn't lost a regular-season game in three years, and won so easily (48-27) you almost had to laugh. Up popped third-ranked Colorado, led by John "Bad Dude" Stearns. Down went the Buffs, 45-17. The next week against Kansas State, the Sooners scored 75 points.

The offense was so strong, Mildren says, "we had a feeling we could do anything we wanted - and nobody could stop us."

Finally, someone did - Nebraska. Or rather, the Cornhuskers - with an equally potent offense of their own (Johnny Rodgers, Jerry Tagge, Jeff Kinney, etc.) won another of those 'Great Shootout" showdowns, 35-31, to win the national title.

Many think that of all the Great Shootouts, this was the greatest because it is the only one not dominated by defenses. Mildren, the losing quarterback, is remarkably philosophical.

"Two great teams," he says, "and a great game. It was disappointing, sure, but I feel we played as well as we could. We gained 467 yards on the nation's best defense and lost."

Mildren finished his OU career with 4,831 total yards but is proudest of the fact that he graduated in four years with academic honors and "met the woman (Janis) I've been married to since 1972.'

After graduation he played two seasons with Baltimore and one with New England before he returned to Oklahoma and started putting his degree to work.

Mildren went to work for Saxon Oil Co., where, he says, "I was given an opportunity to take some chances, make some mistakes and learn a few things."

Success came so swiftly that he retired before the age of 40. His job now, as he sees it, is to help teach Oklahoma to survive a time that has haunting resemblances to the Dust Bowl Era.

He applauds tightened academic NCAA and the job that current coach

Gary Gibbs has done in that regard. He does wish that on the field, the Sooners would behave more like a Barry Switzer team.

On his new playing field, he is taking a few chances, making some mistakes, learning a few things ...

Of defeat - and victory - he has learned much over the past 25 years.



Ask Dr. Lamb

DEAR DR. LAMB: Recently I sustained an injury to my ear from a Qtip. My eardrum was 80 percent ruptured, middle ear bones were smashed and pushed into my inner ear. I also had a lymphatic fistula in my inner ear causing severe dizziness.

After two weeks of uncontrolled dizziness and passing out on standing up in the morning, I went to an eye and ear infirmary. Emergency surgery was performed. The fistula and smashed bones were repaired and a new eardrum was built from fascia from the temporal area. My hearing was restored from zero to 99 percent with the surgery.

I am left with a loud blowing sound in my ear 24 hours a day. Sometimes it gets very loud. At times I have other high-frequency sounds. The carotid pulse in my neck is bounding at night. It sounds like an 18-wheeler truck revving up. Also, I have a con-

stant very gross metallic taste in my mouth. This is from damage of the nerve from the ear to the side of my tongue. Is there anything that can be done for any of the above problems?

DEAR READER: When the eardrum is damaged, it may cause a lowpitched blowing sound as you describe. This can occur from a perforation of the eardrum. When the perforation heals, the blowing sound disappears. Inflammation of the middle
ear may cause a pulsating sound.
Your case is more complicated because of damage to the eardrum, to
the middle ear and possibly the inner
ear from your description. There is a
branch of one nerve to the ear that
also supplies the side of the tongue,
and its injury can alter taste.

It may be too early to tell how persistent your problems will be.
There may be further healing of the eardrum problem. But you should return to the doctors who did the ear.

surgery for a follow-up evaluation, and to see if these changes are likely to persist in your case or if something else needs to be done. Regaining your hearing and eliminating the dizziness is a big step forward in your progress.

I know you will want to know more about the causes of tinnitus. Read Special Report 112, Ear Noises (Tinnitus), which I am sending you. As indicated in the report, an injury to the middle ear will cause tinnitus. So will an inflammation. When, and if, these underlying causes can be corrected, the tinnitus usually disappears. Your story shows why one should never stick anything in the ear.

SANFRANCISCO (AP) - Hearts 177 roles in the Nutcracker. With moms watching nearby, the youngsters huddled under the skirts of Mother Ginger - really a man on stilts - before taking the stage for a comic

Throughout the two-hour production, stage managers rounded up fidgety children who, after make-up reddened cheeks, were pushed on stage, some obscured by costumes that turned them into horses and mice. 'Sometimes I look around at all

the people coming and going and it amazes me that we get the show on," said Tomm Rudd, a 24-year veteran dancer with the San Francisco Ballet whose son Christopher played the

Amid the graceful dancers backstage, burly men in jeans donned leather gloves to move scenery or help Clara and the prince's swan boat fly. During breaks, stagehands played chess in a tiny room offstage.

Meanwhile, wardrobe mistresses stood by with needle and thread to repair fresh tears in tight-fitting costumes as men and women, flashlights held between teeth, helped dancers shed costumes in the semi-dark.

'Some of these kids have never been on stage. You push them out there and then it's 'Wow!'" said Rudd, looking skyward in mock awe. But after a couple of performances some are walking around like prima donnas.

The Nutcracker, set to show again this season in San Francisco for its 100th anniversary, had its U.S. debut in this city in 1944. Now, it's a holiday tradition worldwide, a popular moneymaker for companies and a training ground for young dancers.

"This is every kid's dream," said Diane Kounalakis, public relations manager for the San Francisco Ballet. "It's a rite of passage, a tradition to have your first role in the Nutcrack-

Katita Waldo, who danced her first Sugar Plum Fairy role on stage two years ago for San Francisco, is testament to that; the 26-year-old has played nearly every part in the Nutcracker.

"I've done every role a girl can play except the soldier and the mouse. Now, I can say I've done it all," she said after finishing her first turn as the Sugar Plum Fairy. "I'm glad it's over today. The first curtain was frightening.'

Waldo got into a jam when she was supposed to exit down stage and reenter upstage after a quick solo. Coming off, she ran into a pack of ballerinas watching her performance and lending support.

She muttered an expletive, losing her composure for a moment before quickly weaving through the crowd in time to respond to her cue to return to the stage.

On the sidelines, ballerinas tittered at the exclamation, then went back to shadow-dancing the Sugar Plum Fairy steps. Some offstage mimics were to dance the role in later productions, others in the future perhaps. Waldo finished to warm applause from the audience and from backstage.

'The younger dancers are always waiting for someone to come up to them one day and say, 'Hey! Someone's not here. You want to save the show today?"' said ballet mistress Anita Paciotti, with the San Francisco troupe for nearly two decades. "They're all ready, at a moment's notice."

Performers must sign in one hour before each show to ensure everybody

is ready, but last-minute replacements due to illness or no-shows do happen.

"I once had to be the Chestnut Lady because she didn't show up," Paciotti recalls. "It was literally five minutes before the show and the street sweeper had to tell me what to do."

Even after days of rehearsal, the older dancers whose roles require more athletic prowess get last-minute jitters that can turn into spills. Pacing, feet splayed or on pointe, is a constant activity backstage. "It's really scary when you're

batting .500 at rehearsals on a move,' Paciotti said. "I mean, batting .500 in baseball is good, but in dancing that means you fall down half the time. "You can't fake it in this business."

At least not on the stage where the dance is the only thing and perfection is the goal.

Fahrenheit; allowing the punch to boil

1 teaspoon whole cloves

1 (3-inch) cinnamon stick piece fresh ginger, about 1-inch square, peeled 5 bags of tea of any variety, or 2 1/2 tablespoons loose tea tied in a cheese cloth bag

- 3 cups orange juice 1 cup lemon juice
- 1 to 1/2 cups sugar
- 1 whole lemon, thinly sliced 1 whole orange, thinly sliced

In a large nonaluminum kettle, combine the water, cloves, cinnamon stick, and ginger, and heat to boiling. Add the tea. Cover the kettle, remove it from the heat, and let steep for 5 minutes. Then remove the tea bags or leaves.

In another pan, heat the orange juice, lemon juice, and sugar over medium heat, stirring until the sugar is dissolved. Pour the hot fruit juice mixture into the spiced tea. Add the lemon and orange slices. Keep hot until ready to serve, but do not boil.

25 servings, about six ounces each RED WINE GLOGG

- 1 1/2 cups water
- 1/2 cups sugar 5 whole cloves



Create wreaths, garland for holidays

or garland is a satisfying way to continue an early-American tradition. With a few instructions, some of the season's greens, a few basic supplies, a few short sprigs to balance the design and a little patience, you're all set to or cover any bare places. Trim the fashion a customized arrangement for ribbon ends diagonally or with a notch, your home.

Begin by selecting the type (or combination) of greens best suited to your tastes and to your project.

EVERGREEN SWAGS Medium-gauge florist's wire Evergreen boughs 10 to 18 inches long, preferably a mix of several, such as white pine, cedar, balsam, juniper, and boxwood

Pinecones, one very large or three medium-size Red all-weather ribbon

Lay all three sprays of white pine or other flat evergreen on a work surface. Lay three more mediumlength boughs over them. Wrap their stems together with wire, spreading the greens gracefully.

Arrange shorter boughs (about half the length of the first group) of the same varieties of evergreen so they form a spray facing the other direction. Push the two groups together so the cut ends of each one are partly buried in the other. Wire the second group of stems to the first with several wraps.

Wire the pinecones together into a group (or use a single large cone) and place them over the long boughs, near the place where the stems meet. Wire the cones in place and fill in around them with shorter sprigs of evergreen to cover the stem section. Tie the preson I wich I made them get beter ribbon into the bow - a multilooped

Creating an evergreen wreath, swag wire bow is usually best for these leaving long streamers. Wire the bow to the swag, just above the pinecones, so it covers the wire. If necessary, add making them a little shorter than the long pine boughs.

Hang the swag on the door at a slight angle, with the longest boughs facing down. If the swag is in the sun, some of the needles may fall. If there are bare branches, simply pull these out carefully (put the swag on a flat surface first) and replace them with fresh ones pushed into the arrange-

ROPES OF EVERGREEN Soft cotton clothesline cord (stiff cords do not drape well) Fine-gauge florist's wire Short sprigs of evergreen

Measure the length of roping needed and mark it on the cord, but do not cut. Leave 2 feet of cord for tying before starting to measure. Tie one end of the cord to a fixed object: a table leg f you are working on the floor, or a

Cut greens into 5 to 6 inch lengths and wrap three or four together into little bundles, their stems tied with wire. After a while you may decide to wire individual sprigs directly to the cord, but at first this extra step makes the job easier.

Wire the bundles to the cord so that each bunch covers the stems of the previous one. Work around the cord in a spiral so the evergreen covers the cord evenly. Make a half knot in the wire after every few bunches to keep them from coming unwrapped when you set it down. You can make the rope thicker or thinner by increasing and decreasing the bundles used per foot of cord.


After you have finished the length needed, go back to the beginning and cover the stems of the first few with very short sprigs wired in the opposite direction. Push their stems into the main part of the roping and hide the wire under the needles.

Trimming first tree on shoestring

One idea for affordable decorations is to get several rolls of gift ribbon in holiday plaids or red, green and white stripes, and fashion them into bows at the tip of each branch.

With a few strands of white lights, an abundance of brightly colored bows and a homemade angel or star at the top, your first tree will be very special.

"Twas the Night" is celebrating 160 years of memories

EDITOR'S NOTE - Long before there was a Rockefeller Center Christmas tree or a Macy's Santa Claus parade or a Radio City Christmas show, a quieter, smaller Christmas visited little old New York. Here is a story of that Christmas and the legacy it has left children forever.

NEW YORK (AP) - It was Christmas Eve, 1822, and snow lay heavily over old New York, the downtown streets and the farmland that occupied most of the island of Manhattan. Sleigh bells jingled

through town, but would not inspire
"Jingle Bells" for another 35 years.
Clement Clarke Moore, a 43-yearold teacher at an Episcopal seminary,
had been at work for weeks with his quill, crafting a secret present for his

six children. Now it was done.

Earlier that day Moore rode out in his carriage on Christmas errands with his servant, Patrick, and returned home to his four-story brick farmhouse with the largest turkey he could find in the Washington Market's crowded pens at the tip of the island.

After Christmas Eve dinner, the family retired to the parlor in front of the hearth, with its warming fire. And now Moore unveiled his Christmas gift. His children - Margaret, Charity, Benjamin, Mary, and Clement Jr.- sat at his feet. Infant Emily was in her mother's arms.

He began to read:



But in the years to follow the history of the poem took a curious turn. Though it was cherished immediately, Moore would not acknowledge authorship publicly for another 15 years, say Gerard and Patricia Del Re in their book, "Twas Yes, Virginia, there

The Night Before Christmas. Although it was passed from hand to hand and copied, it was two days before the next Christmas in 1823 that the Troy, N.Y. Sentinel published it for the first time. It was unsigned and preceded with this, from the

newspaper's editor: "We do not know to whom we are indebted for the following description of that unwearied patron of children - that homey and delightful personage of parental kindness - Santa Claus... as he goes about visiting the firesides of this happy land, laden with Christmas bounties; but from whomsoever it may have come, we give thanks for it.

Perhaps Moore thought it too frivolous an enterprise to his standing as a scholar and teacher of Oriental languages and Hebrew, author of "A Compendious Lexicon of the Hebrew Language" and pious patron of the Episcopal Church. Or perhaps he thought it a private communion with his children, his family.

But he finally consented to sign his name to it on a reprinting in the New York Book of Poetry in 1837.

The poem is based in part on an old Dutch myth which Moore's friend, writer Washington Irving, related in his "Knickerbocker's History of New

And in fact there are some similarities between the two texts. Irving saw the smoke from St. Nick's pipe "like a cloud overhead." Moore said "it encircled his head like a wreath." Irving: "And laying a finger beside his nose." Moore: "his finger aside of his nose." Irving: "remounting his wagon he returned over the treetops and disappeared." Moore: "And giving a nod up the chimney he rose.

Irving's aim was satire; Moore's was a simple, innocent tale of goodness

and giving.

Moore had other things on his mind that Christmas season, as well. He stopped regularly to view the construction of the General Theological Seminary, which he helped build. He gave almost the entire Chelsea section of the city to the Episcopal Diocese and helped build nearby St. Peter's Church, which still stands.

The city-ordained grid of streets had not yet reached Chelsea where the few graceful farmhouses were linked by dirt lanes, but to the south the hanties of Greenwich Village were about to give way to the rising city. Moore railed against the dissection of the countryside with the streets and avenues laid out in unforgiving

rectangles. It was a fight he would lose. But it was part of the romantic spirit of this scholar with a long face and prominent nose, the son of another scholar who became president of Columbia University, to want the homes and churches of Chelsea connected by curving streets and winding lanes.

For Moore was a romantic, say the Del Re's and The Rev. Wray MacKay, today's rector of St. Peters, evidenced by the letters of his courtship to his wife, Eliza, and his dedication to the church which at one time provided the only education for the poor children of the shantytown to the south. But only on Sunday.

"The church is a highly romantic building," says parishoner and architectural scholar Chris Jenks. "Almost a stage set." Not quite Gothic, but trying to capture the feeling of the Middle Ages.

And the poem itself. "It has the qualities of imagination and fantasy and energy and that's why it endures," MacKay says. "You read

it and you just get caught up in it."

MacKay sees something more than good fortune in the fact that when stones from the tower began to fall into the street a few years ago, the archdiocese provided \$500,000 to repair it. It only cost \$65,000 to build the church itself in the 1830s, and Moore provided much of the money. He also bought the pine pew on the right hand front of the nave for \$200 in perpetuity. The deed exists still.

As does the seminary, which schooled fewer than two dozen seminarians a year when it began, and more than 150 now.

The Moores are not buried at St. Peter's. For public health reasons, Moore attached a covenant to the deed that there there would be no burial grounds in Chelsea. He and his family were interred at St. Luke's in Greenwich Village, but were moved up to the Church of the Intercession in the Bronx, when St. Luke's future was in doubt about the turn of the century.

That neighborhood now is mostly poor Hispanic and black, but the church and its parish house are elegant, reflecting its past. It is built on the old James Audubon farm and e is buried on the grounds. As is fred Dickens, a son of Charles Dickens, author of "A Christmas Carel," who died in New York on a trip to America with his father. His grave was long honored yearly at this time of year by New York's Dickens Society in period dress.

Now every Christmas season, after a reading of the poem at the Church of the Intercession, the parishoners and their children troop down the long steep hill toward the Hudson River to the west graveyard.

Later, led by a St. Nicholas in gold miter and white gown, they will stream past the prestigious mausoleums where lie important New York families like the Astors and Cushmans, and they will pay homage to the poet's grave and that of the Moore family who heard the poem





Selecting appropriate greenery

Get to know your evergreens this holiday season. The most common evergreens have the following characteristics:

-Balsam has a rich green color, short needles, and outstanding keeping qualities. Because it can be cut into short sprigs and still retain its needles. Balsam is ideal for wreaths and other decorations.

-White pine has long, soft needles, and is quite pliable, making it especially suitable for large wreaths. On small bases, the needles fill in the center of the bases. It also is appropriate for use in swags and for arrangements in baskets and vases.

-Scotch pine is so stiff that it is virtually impossible to shape into wreaths or drape in swags and garlands.

-Spruce and hemlock are lovely short-needled greens that must be kept moist in order to prevent their needles from falling out; using these greens in arrangements that allow the stems to remain in water is the only realistic approach.

-Juniper has very short, pale needles and white berries, which make it a lovely contrast when combined with darker greens. It has a narrow shape and stiff branches, which make it best suited for use in

tanding arrangements.
-Cedar has flat foliage; it makes a good base for greens with contrasting textures.

'Lincoln' a landmark in television histories



Family treasure on display in worthy ABC documentary

As an American hero, Abraham Lincoln is a blessing on this still-young republic, an incarnation of national principle with the power to galvanize and sustain political culture for generations after his death. To present Lincoln's life well is both a good deed and a reward in itself, as brothers Philip and Peter Kunhardt have discovered in the making of Lincoln, a four-hour pictorial essay airing over the weekend of Dec. 26 and 27 on ABC.

The Kunhardts (Philip is an Episcopal priest; Peter is a veteran ABC news producer) are the great-grandsons of Frederick Hill Meserve, who collected an es-timated 100,000 Civil War-era photographs in an effort to illustrate his own father's diary. The passion he developed for Lincoln and his times he passed on to his daughter, Dorothy Meserve Kunhardt, upon whose death about half of the collection was sold or donated to museums. Her son, Philip Kunhardt Jr., a former managing editor of Life magazine, retained perhaps 50,000 mostly uncatalogued photos, which he and his sons Peter and Philip III have used to create both a book and film of Lincoln's life.

"The question is," says Peter, "where do you start? We could have started in 1854 or 1858 with the debates and had pretty good (photographic) coverage, but we decided that the war years themselves, which were the real crucible for Lincoln's growth, would be the matrix of the story.

"The heart and center of this (film)," says brother Philip, "is the story of the institution of slavery in this country.

"When all is said and done, (Lincoln) was the man who did the work that was necessary to end what he called 'the evil institution.' That's such a critical part of our nation's history, and it's the one thing that justifies the blood of the war.'

The first full-length documentary of the 16th president's life, Lincoln will remind viewers of Ken Burns' 1990 epic The Civil War; it borrows heavily on Burns' format, which combined period photographs with dramatic readings of the words of various eyewitnesses. (In his turn, Burns borrowed photographs from the Meserve-Kunhardt collection to illustrate The Civil War.)

Among the celebrities lending their voices to Lincoln are Glenn Close as Mary Todd Lincoln, Arnold Schwarzenegger and Richard Thomas as Lincoln's secretaries, Oprah Winfrey as Mrs. Lincoln's seamstress and James Earl Jones, who narrates the film.

Unfortunately, Lincoln suffers by comparison to The Civil War, from the choice of gravel-throated Jason Robards for the voice of middle-aged Lincoln, to the original score by Alan Menken (Beauty and the Beast), the rather repetitive visuals and a somewhat artless use of flashbacks from Lincoln's White House years to earlier times.

While Burns (who labored for PBS) had the luxury of expanding his film almost at will, the Kunhardts have lived

Thus, they have omitted a segment about Lincoln's years in Springfield, Ill., his famous 1858 Senate race against Stephen Douglas and the drama of the Republican Convention of 1860. A brief epilogue and some biographical notes would be helpful, too: When did Lincoln's father and stepmother die, and what became of Lincoln's family?

Admirers of Lincoln will find little new information in the film, but it is undeniably praiseworthy both as a cornerstone of video scholarship and as an educational tool, which it is already slated to become, through an agreement with PBS Video, just as soon as school reopens after the new year.

Heston twixt heaven and Hell's Kitchen

Charlton Heston knows the value of good material. The star of the biblical epics The Ten Commandments, Ben-Hur and The Greatest Story Ever Told now lends his powerful voice to the four-part performance documentary Charlton Heston Presents the Bible, starting Sunday, Dec. 20, on A&E.

The actor worked his way up from a humble beginning. Born Charles Carter, the Michigan native studied on an acting scholarship at Northwestern University before enlisting for a stint in the Air Corps. Back in civilian life, Heston and his wife, Lydia, moved to New York's Hell's Kitchen, where he worked sporadically as an artists' model before getting his first break in community theater.

After his 1948 Broadway debut in Antony and Cleopatra, Heston found work in the new medium of live television, in programs such as Studio One. He crossed the bridge to Hollywood in 1950 with the film noir Dark City. Since then he has made his mark as the lead in many historical dramas, but his roles in fictional films are equally memorable: Ruby Gentry, Treasure Island, Planet of the Apes, Will Penny and Soylent Green are but a few.

Politically outspoken, Heston has served six terms as president of the Screen Actor's Guild and chairman of the American Film Institute, but is not interested in public office.



Heston simple storyteller in 'Bible' presentation

Classical art, music bring stories to life

If any actor's name is synonymous with biblical epics, that distinction belongs to Charlton Heston, The star of The Ten Commandments, Ben-Hur and The Greatest Story Ever Told now takes a different approach to the Good Book in the four-part series Charlton Heston Presents the Bible, beginning Sunday, Dec. 20, on A&E with "Genesis." "The Story of Moses" airs Monday, Dec. 21, followed by "Jesus of Nazareth" on Tuesday, Dec. 22, and "The Passion" on Wednesday, Dec. 23, The entire series repeats on Friday, Dec. 25.

The "performance documentary," as the actor/producer terms the project, treats the Bible not as the cornerstone of Judeo-Christian beliefs, but as a literary work of immense linguistic importance.

"There are two primary sources for shaping the English language," Heston says, "the one is Shakespeare, the other is the King James translation of the Bible."

The series has Heston performing

readings of Bible stories and offering historical perspective in Holy Land locations including Mt. Sinai, the Sea of Galilee and the Hall of the Last Supper. Many readings take place in a recently excavated Roman amphitheater in Israel. Executive producer Fraser Heston, Charlton's son, found the location inspiring.

"There is an ambience you pick up when you shoot in a place like this sweating under the same sun Jesus sweated under — that you can't get when you film in a studio."

Heston's booming voice serves well the stories of Noah, Moses, Jesus and others. But what brings the tales to life is the harmonious combination of paintings by masters including Michelangelo, Titian and Dali with music by Bach, Haydn and Mozart.

Heston stresses that the focus of this program is on the rich, poetic language of the Bible.

"The stories of the Bible were originally meant to be told aloud, in the dark, to people sitting around the campfire listening," Heston says. "That's where I come in. I'm a storyteller."



As a matter of fact, we know more of the personal history of his wife, Kate Columbo (Kate Mulgrew in Kate Loves a Mystery). who was never seen in the Columbo shows and vice versa, than we do of the intrepid police lieutenant.


Columbo began as one element in the NBC Sunday Mystery Movie rotation, which also featured McCloud and McMillan and Wife. It was very popular and threatened to become a series, but Peter Falk, the show's talented workhorse, felt a movie or two here and there was enough. (He was said to have earned almost a quarter of a million dollars per show.) Incidently, Falk wasn't the first choice of show creators Richard Levinson and William Link. Both Lee J. Cobb and Bing Crosby were first offered the role; Crosby was reportedly too rich and too caught up in his golf game to bother.

Q: Can you tell me what movies besides Dead Poets Society and White Fang have featured actor Ethan Hawke? -S.B., North Huntingdon,

A: In addition to his fine work in the two films you mention, catch Hawke in Explorers, A Midnight Clear, Mystery Date and Dad.

Q: Years ago, I saw a fantastic movie that I have never seen again on TV. I've tried to get it in many video stores, with no success. 1-800-669-7157. A number of other trustworthy video outlets are listed in the preface of Leonard Maltin's Movie and Video Guide 1993, arguably the best reference book for video enthusiasts. An astounding number of readers of this column write weekly to express their frustration in locating tapes that, unlike Casablanca, aren't rented every day. My advice: Purchase a video guide and dial toll free.

Q: Patricia Richardson, who plays Jill - Tim Allen's wife on Home Improvement - is great. What other roles has she played? - Patty Lewis, Birmingham, Mich.

A: Richardson's main body of work has been in theater, but look for her in the films In Country and Lost Angels. Her other TV roles include Double Trouble, Eisenhower and Lutz and FM.

Q: In the movie River of No Returnwith Robert Mitchum and Marilyn Monroe, a male voice is heard singing the title song. My wife says it's Ernie Ford, I say it's Robert Mitchum, my son says it's Jim Nabors and my daughter says 'Who cares?' For sanity's sake, who's doing the singing?






Game show return to NBC; Malcolm X on CD

Conan softens image for cartoon series

By Chris Carpenter Since 1933, books about Conan, a warrior from an age of wizards and kings, have held the imagination of armchair adventurers. More recently, Conan has become a Marvel Comics superhero and the protagonist of two films starring Arnold Schwarzenegger.

This season, a younger, gentler Conan has turned up in Conan, the Adventurer, a syndicated weekly cartoon saga. Conan is a robust action series strong on fantasy and imagination and light on hacking and gouging.

Though he's more humane, Conan still champions the cause of justice, but quick thinking and some cleverly drawn escape routes allow him to do so minus the bloody swordplay. Where the gore is no more, catty humor and magical meanies abound.

The 18-year-old hero brandishes a sword forged by his father from a metal discovered in the wake of a meteor shower. His friends include the telepathic Needle, archer Falkenar, circus girl Jezmine and the good wizard Greywolf. There's also Conan's black stallion, Thunder, who can outrun any horse. Entertainment Television is working with the Los Angeles chapter of the National Organization for Women (NOW) to develop programming addressing a variety of women's issues as they pertain to entertainment. Many seniors feel neglected by churches

Many older Americans find no sanctuary in their houses of worship because of benign neglect that abandons them at heaven's gate, a study has found.

Nearly half the people age 65 and older interviewed in a Holy Cross College study of 200 Christian worshipers said they would like to attend church more often, but find they're stuck at home because they lack transportation, among other obstacles.

The study disputes the theory that aging naturally leads people to withdraw from religious and other social activities. It also questions whether religious organizations, in their perpetual search for youth, may be sacrificing an important part of their congregations while also leaving those older members to face death alone

"In a word, the life of the older individual, as with religious institutions, becomes precarious," Stephen C. Ainlay, Royce Singleton Jr. and Victoria Swigert reported in the Journal for the Scientific Study of Religion. All three are sociologists at the school in Worcester, Mass.

"Greater involvement reduces feelings of meaninglessness, makes health problems understandable, and helps situate death itself," they wrote.

In one-hour interviews with a broadcasts, rather than organizing random sample of 200 Christians age transportation to bring them to 65 and older in Worcester, 46 percent church, Ainlay said.

of survey respondents said they would like to attend religious services more often.

Nearly a third of the respondents listed lack of transportation as the main reason they don't attend church more often. Thirty-seven percent cited health problems and poor weather.

"What we're not doing is we're not getting these people into the churches," Ainlay said in an interview. "It becomes particularly tragic because what we, of course, find is that people want to be there."

Monsignor Charles Fahey, a professor of aging studies and senior associate of the Third Age Center at Fordham University in New York, said the survey's findings ring true for him.

"From a pastoral point of view, this would be the lived experience," he said. "Those churches and synagogues that do reach out, older people do participate."

Many sociologists of religion say the relatively scant attention paid to the elderly results from benign neglect, not deliberate policy.

"My sense of it is, it is an act of omission more than anything," Swigert said.

Some churches may unintentionally discourage older people from attending services by focusing their ministries on the homebound through broadcasts, rather than organizing transportation to bring them to church, Ainlay said.

Lacking easy access to church can be disruptive, one gerontologist suggests.

People adjust to aging largely by

People adjust to aging largely by continuing lifelong patterns, and church attendance and participation are part of that, said Robert Atchley, director of the Scripps Gerontology Center at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio.

And despite the graying of the large baby boom population of Americans, most religious organizations see their future in recruiting younger members, and divert their resources accordingly.

Yet with older people disproportionately represented among the faithful, religious institutions take the lead in the graying of America. One survey found more than a quarter of parishioners in the average Roman Catholic church are over age 65. In light of this, sociologists say, the vitality of congregations will be threatened if they neglect older members.

"What is particularly ironic now is that as churches look for elders, or church leaders, they're looking for young people," Ainlay said. "The true church elders are excluded."

And in forsaking older members for the lack of the effort to get them to church, the institutions endanger their own spiritual health, said Atchley, the gerontologist in Ohio.

"If you really want to tell the truth about this, most every church has the resources," he said. "It's a lack of commitment to do it."

There are two ways to look at this, Atchley suggested.

"One, it's a lot of work. It's also a potential experience of service for the younger people of the organization, which in my view is what the church is all about."

Fatness, obesity different; both impact your wellness

By CHARLOTTE R. CLARK -MS/RD/LD

Obesity is well-known to be a major risk factor for serious chronic disease, such as coronary heart disease)CHD) and diabetes. It is also well-known that if you eat a lot and expend very little energy, you are likely to become obese over time.

One needs to focus on subject of dietary fat and what happens metabolically once you become obese: How and why does excess body fat

impair our utilization of energy intake? How and why does excess body fat increase risk for CHD, diabetes, and

other serious chronic diseases? Do you metabolize what you eat differently when you're obese as opposed to lean?

Does the type of dietary fat (saturated, monounsaturated, or polyunsaturated) consumed make a difference in whether you develop a chronic disease?

These are rhetorical questions, since all the answers have not been gathered. However, experts think that with continued research some light on the current understanding of the metabolic

consequences associated with excess body fat accumulation.

The underlying reason for some interest in the relationship between body fat distribution and chronic disease risk appears may be hormonal regulation of adipose reserves. Testosterone causes fat to accumulate in the upper body (abdomen and chest), as is typical for men, while estrogen-associated fat settles in the lower body (buttocks and thighs) as seen in women.

Dietary control over the plasma and expenditure in additional to loss. monitoring the composition of what you eat. Nutrition strategies aimed at reducing the amount of CHD underscores the importance of maintaining an ideal body weight and avoiding excessive dietary cholesterol

Cholesterol levels may be low or become lower foro many reasons. Cholesterol levels can be a marker for disease status, both good and bad. blood cholesterol levels will drop in most people when they lose weight.

Making dietary changes to lower cholesterol to lower the risk for CHD or other diseases is different than an unexplained drop in TC(total cholesterol). What a dangerously high or low cholesterol level really is depends on the individual and other variables. Risk profile is also influenced by blood pressure, smoking, obesity, and other factors.

Obesity in any adult, regardless of the percent of overweight is unhealthy. Fighting your weight problem needs to be a continuous activity in one's lipid profile requires a multi-faceted life. Follow guidelines and establish approach to regulating energy intake a realistic program for your weight

> 1. Engage in regular daily exercise for at least 20 minutes each day.

> 2. Watch your calories, but include all the essential nutrients in your daily

3. Take a moderate approach to both exercise and calorie restrictions.

4. Change your eating habits and develop behavior modification so that you form habits that will last your



Minneapolis seniors protect their turi

Jeanne Stradtmann settled in for retirement two years ago in a low-income high-rise for seniors, imagining days brightened by dances and coffee with friends.

They didn't expect to be tracking 911 calls from frantic residents: Drug deals. Assaults. Prostitution. Robbery. Murder.

We have people who lived here for 20 years or more, fully expecting to retire here, and live in peace and comfort for the rest of their lives," said Bear Stradtmann, 65. "Now there are people in the building who won't go out after three in the afternoon.

Their building, once home primarily to elderly people like themselves, has a growing population of young people who are disabled,

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) - Bear and formerly homeless or addicted to drugs or alcohol.

The conflict between young and old in Minneapolis and other cities around the country prompted Congress to pass legislation allowing public housing agencies to designate part or all of some buildings as elderly-only. President Bush signed the bill in October.

But that solution has generated a new debate - between housing officials who say low-income seniors have a right to a community of their own, and advocates for the disabled who say that's discrimination.

"It just limits the already limited housing available to people with mental illness," said Chuck Krueger, a spokesman for the Alliance for the Mentally III of Minnesota.

In Minneapolis, the elderly in the 42 public housing high-rises are moving away - or staying away - if they can. Just 46 percent of the high-rise residents now are senior citizens, and 93 percent of the applications in progress are from younger people, according to the Minneapolis Public Housing Authority.

Some older residents are trying to wrest back control. In Project Lookout in Minneapolis, residents patrol the halls at night, reporting suspicious activity to the police. But volunteers are few.

"People are afraid to death. They're afraid if they document something, someone will get them," said Bear Stradtmann. "The fear is a legitimate one, about people coming to your door with a gun in your

"Minneapolis has had one of the worst problems in the country," said Michael Erlandson, a legislative assistant to U.S. Rep. Martin Sabo, D-Minn., who helped pass the federal

The measure doesn't force people to move against their will, but permits housing authorities to begin phasing in segregated floors or buildings as apartments become vacant.

Elderly people say the bill is welcome but overdue, especially considering the time it might take to implement. In the meantime, they

say, they'll live in fear. Vern Schlief, 78, has been robbed three times - twice by a man with a gun - in his St. Paul apartment of 12 "It happens everywhere, whether years or in the hallway. The former it's public housing or not," he said.

Landfill, the only dump serving Branson and a six-county area. State regulators have cited Renfro several times for allowing contaminants to leach into creeks that feed Table Rock Lake, two miles away.

"All these people want to close the landfill as if all this trash would just o away," landfill owner Cleo Renfro said. Renfro denied any leaching has occurred but conceded trash is stacked higher than state standards allow.

The landfill opened less than five ears ago with an expected 20-year life. But it will last only another four years, Renfro said, because he didn't anticipate the large volume of trash coming in now.

State environmental officials and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers said water quality remains high in Table Rock Lake. But most officials agree on a need for much higher standards for private septic systems.

Heavy rains routinely cause septic overflows, raising bacteria levels in area creeks and lakes, said Tony Wasson, Taney County sewer district administrator.

Mayor Wade Meadows said growth in the community of 3,700 soon could threaten Taneycomo Lake, popular with trout fishermen.

State regulators cited the city's sewage treatment plant for dumping 20,000 gallons of sludge into the lake fter the Memorial Day weekend.

The plant hasn't reported any problems since, but Meadows said it will be operating near capacity until an expansion is finished in mid-1993.
