City grants 'Y' \$20,000 for operation

The Hereford and Vicinity YMCA was granted a \$20,000 funding request by the Hereford City Commission at the commission's regular meeting Monday night.

For the last several years, the YMCA's revenues have been running about \$40,000 short of expenses, according to Dave Hopper, representing the YMCA board of directors. Hopper said the YMCA's total budget has been cut from around \$185,000 four years ago to about \$165,000 now.

Although the YMCA eliminated a youth director and raised adult membership fees, the deficit has remained. Youth membership fees have been lowered in order to be more affordable, resulting in more memberships but about the same amount of money raised, according to Hopper.

The YMCA gets funding from the United Way of Deaf Smith county and asks individuals and companies to donate to its sustaining fund. "Each year, raising the money gets to be a little greater strain," Hopper said.

"Do YMCA members see this as an annual request or a one-shot deal?" asked Commissioner Tom LeGate.

Hopper said the YMCA wants to make the funding request every year.

"We presently support no programs for children," said Commissioner Emory Brownlow. Between 1,500 and 3,000 children are expected to participate in YMCA programs this year.

Later, Brownlow asked Hopper if YMCA members have any intention to go to the county for more money.

"I would have no problem with going to them," Hopper said.

"Maybe it's time for the city to take the lead," said LeGate before moving to grant the \$20,000 request. LeGate's motion passed unanimously.

Encode of Lubbock was awarded the \$44,911 bid for the city's new computer. The computer is a NCR

Tower 3200/300 Mainframe. Fees included in the bid are the purchase price of the computer, software, installation and training.

The new computer will replace a 10-year-old NCR.

PSA, of Amarillo, had the losing bid, for an IBM RS/6000. The PSA computer would cost about \$8,000 more initially and has a larger capacity than the NCR Tower 3200/300.

City Manager Darwin McGill said he thought the IBM RS/6000 had more capacity than the city needed and that the NCR Tower 3200/300 would serve the city's needs well.

A zoning change request from two family to central business district on a tract located at 207 Union was denied. Boyd W. Vaughn said the property, located in a residential district, is being used as a warehouse.

Since the property has been used as a warehouse for many years, it can continue to be used as a warehouse under a grandfather clause, according to City Attorney Earnest Langley.

"It's the use, not the ownership, that makes the difference," said Langley.

A zoning change request from single family to mobile home district was approved on a lot located in the 900 block of South Miles.

In other business, commissioners amended the Golf Course Advisory Board ordinance to set terms of appointments. Places one and two on the board, which will be appointed by the Men's and Women's Golf Associations, will serve one year terms to begin on June 1 of each year. Places three, four, and five, which will consist of one city commissioner and two members appointed by the city commission, will serve for two year terms beginning on June 1 of even-numbered years.

The Hereford State Bank was granted the city's depository contract. Hereford State was the only financial institution to make a bid.

Gorby winds up trip through US

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) - Mikhail S. Gorbachev, celebrating the end of the Cold War, embraced former arch-enemy South Korea, thrilled crowds of ordinary San Franciscans, won the applause of businessmen and then flew home to his own deeply troubled nation.

In a major speech on the last day of a five-day U.S. visit, the Soviet president proclaimed, "The Cold War is now behind us. Let us not wrangle over who won it."

Later Monday, speaking to leaders of more than 100 major U.S. companies, the Kremlin chief earned praise with promises to speed up the exchange of rubles for dollars, streamline the Soviet bureaucracy, and turn his land into a new frontier of capitalism.

Apple Computer Inc. Chairman John Sculley said Gorbachev's presentation also reassured executives wary that the Soviet Union's course depends only on Gorbachev's political fortunes.

"He has indicated ... that maybe his personal future is uncertain, and he's been quite honest about that," Sculley said. "But I think he's also said he's got to stand up to adventurism, that he believes in profound change, that he is on a steady course, that he is not going to deviate from that."

In the earlier speech at Stanford University, where thousands of students hailed him with chants of "Gorby! Gorby!" the Soviet leader

touched on global themes, advocating a system of international alliances that unites rather than divides the world - an apparent bid for security arrangements broader than the U.S.-led North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

He called for a "new approach to the structures of security ... and alliance building" that would result in a "unity ... worthy of the life of a human being."

He also implored scientists in both countries to join in determining how nuclear weapons could be destroyed without harming people or the environment.

It was bravura performance by Gorbachev, despite his obvious fatigue after four days of summitry, a dash to Minnesota, and a 22-hour spin around the San Francisco area that featured a brief reunion with former President Reagan.

The clamor of thousands of protesters - Armenians, Lithuanians, Estonians, Latvians, Palestinians, Koreans, Eritreans from embattled Ethiopia - competed with the cheers of thousands of others crowded behind police barriers and craning for a glimpse of Gorbachev.

But in all the din and pomp of the long day, a historic moment occurred quietly behind closed doors when the Soviet leader stepped into the tower of the posh Fairmont Hotel and shook hands with South Korean President Roh Tae-woo.

Schroeder earns HHS high honor

Schroeder was honored for his scholastic, athletic and academic achievements during his career at Hereford High School. Schroeder received the award based on a vote of faculty members at the high school.

A crowd of well over 2,000 persons jammed the west side stands at the stadium for the graduation exercises, where 245 students received diplomas presented by John Fuston, president of the board of trustees of the Hereford Independent School District.

Valedictorian Daphne Roddy and Salutatorian Angela Banner addressed their classmates and the crowd.

Banner read a letter to the class of 1990.

"We will be a little frightened to trust new people...or to choose a major because we might change our minds," she said. "We might be afraid to leave our past, with our memories and friends...but we will tackle the future with determination, courage and spirit no others can match."

Roddy looked back at their school days.

"Remember your first day in high school? It was one of the most frightening days of our lives." She recalled the old rivalry between La Plata and Stanton junior high schools (the schools have since merged into Hereford Junior High) and how hard feelings were healed into new friendships.

"We know we are capable of making new friends and standing our ground without holding mom or dad's hand," Roddy said.

After the diplomas were presented (and Fuston collected over 70 golf balls palmed by graduates as they shook his hand), the graduates were led in singing the school song by class officers Richard Perez, Delinda Hernandez and Edward Castillo, then threw their caps high into the air.

Leaders see quick session

AUSTIN (AP) - State leaders are predicting lawmakers will approve a \$528 million compromise plan for court-ordered school finance reform and bring a quick end to the Texas Legislature's record sixth special session.

"We're going to put it on the fast track and hope we can get it out of here within the next four or five days," House Speaker Gib Lewis, D-Fort Worth, said as lawmakers convened in special session Monday.

The compromise plan for the 1990-91 school year was worked out among Democratic legislative leaders and Republican Gov. Bill Clements Friday in response to a Texas Supreme Court order to make more money available to poor school districts.

The Senate Education Committee approved the school finance reform bill 9-1 and sent it to the full Senate for consideration. The Senate Finance Committee approved state budget cuts to help pay for the reform bill.

In the House, where tax increases must originate, the Ways and Means Committee endorsed a quarter-cent increase in the state sales tax to help pay for education reform.

Also in the funding package - which would raise about an additional \$100 million to bail out financially strapped social service programs - are: a 15-cent per pack cigarette tax increase; higher taxes for mixed drinks and smokeless tobacco; and higher state fees, including doubling the levy for obtaining a duplicate driver's license to \$10.

Clements killed two previous school finance reform plans after objecting to lawmakers' plan to help pay for them with a half-cent increase in the sales tax, now 6 cents on the dollar.

But he relented last Friday, saying there was no other way to enact a school reform plan without court intervention. He called lawmakers into their fourth consecutive special session on school finance reform, following two last year on workers' compensation.

Religious leaders laud court ruling

WASHINGTON (AP) - Conservatives and religious fundamentalists are hailing a Supreme Court ruling they say helps put extracurricular prayer back in public schools for students who want to worship together.

The decision "should send a message to school administrators nationally that religious speech on the high school campus is as fully protected as any other student speech," said Jay Sekulow, an Atlanta lawyer for Christian Advocates Serving Evangelism.

In an 8-1 ruling Monday, the justices said public high schools generally must allow student prayer groups to meet and worship if other student clubs are permitted at school.

Such extracurricular prayer meetings do not violate the constitutionally required church-state separation when high school religious groups are given the same access accorded such activities as chess or scuba diving clubs. Justice Sandra Day O'Connor said for the court. Justice John Paul Stevens dissented.

The decision upholds the Equal Access Act of 1984, in which Congress said public high schools accepting federal aid must not discriminate against groups based on "the religious, political, philosophical or other content of the speech at such meetings."

Liberals said the ruling was a pretext for reconsidering classroom prayer and could undermine earlier rulings that banned such activity.

SAN FRANCISCO - Mikhail S. Gorbachev wooed the West Coast's business elite with visions of rich natural resources in the Soviet Far East and warnings that they've got to act fast. "I think he truly spoke from the heart," an impressed banker said.

COPENHAGEN, Denmark - Secretary of State James A. Baker III carried promises of Western economic help and nuclear and territorial assurances to Soviet Foreign Minister Eduard A. Shevardnadze today to try to gain Moscow's support for NATO membership for a united Germany.

WASHINGTON - Congress, returning today from a long holiday, finds itself at odds with the administration on policy toward China and the Soviet Union.

Dear Thankful: It was wonderful of you to let me know. The knowledge that I have changed someone's life for the better gives me a tremendous amount of pleasure. This old workhorse says "thanks" for that nice bucket of oats.

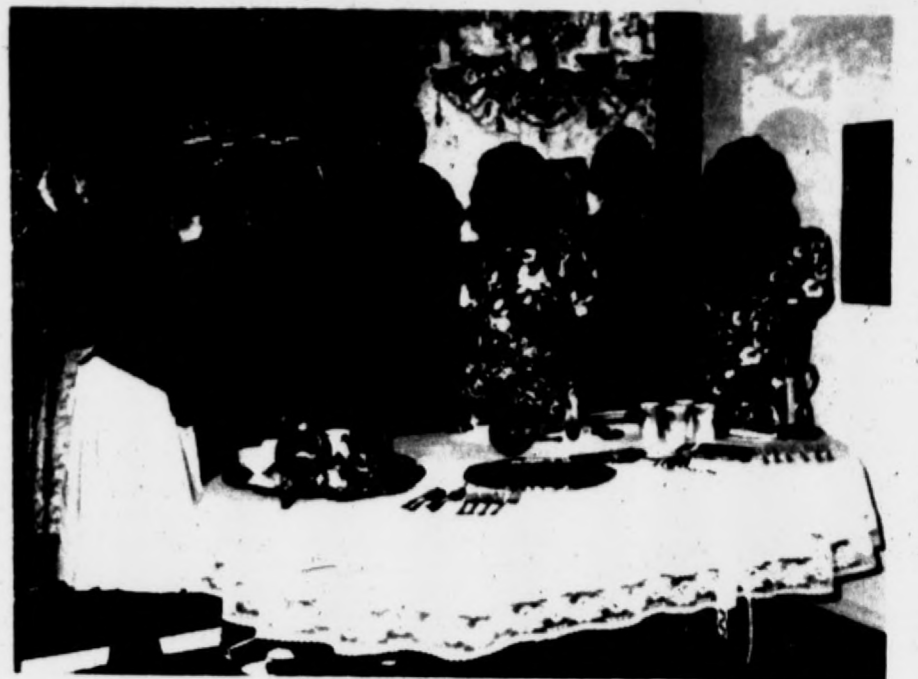

Eat out the healthy way

When you eat out, don't let large portions, mysterious menus and tempting desserts discourage you from your commitment to healthy eating.

You can practice the principles of a weight loss plan without giving up the pleasures of dining in restaurants.

Follow these suggestions to help keep your plan on target when you eat out:

1. **Choose the restaurant carefully.** Select restaurants that offer a variety of foods from which you can pick and choose. Establishments that serve "a la minute" dishes (made from start to finish once you order) are more likely to accommodate special requests.

2. **Ask and you may receive.** Rely on your server to clarify unfamiliar terms or to explain how a dish is prepared. Ask, "Is butter or cream added to the sauce?" "Is the chicken grilled with or without its skin?" Then, depending on the answers, as, "May I have a substitution?"

3. **Disregard the menu's convenient categories.** Dinner menus tend to be laid out in a sequence that subtly suggests you must order an appetizer, soup, salad, entree and dessert. You don't have to.

It's perfectly fine to order, for example, an appetizer and soup, followed by a salad or a side dish of pasta.

-**Side dish.** Choose baked potato, boiled new potatoes, steamed vegetable or rice, or fresh fruit instead of french fries, potato chips onion rings or mayonnaise-based salads. Ask that no margarine be used to prepare the vegetable or rice.

-**Entree.** Look for entrees with descriptions that indicate low-fat content, such as London broil, grilled chicken breast teriyaki, lemon-baked fish, broiled bee kabobs or grilled ham steak.

Avoid items with descriptions indicating high-fat content, such as prime rib of beef, veal parmigiana, stuffed shrimp, fried chicken, fettucine alfredo, filet mignon with bearnaise sauce, shrimp tempura or fried rice.

Choose pasta primavera or linguine with red or clam sauce. Skip pasta with meat or cheese stuffing, or sauces that contain bacon, butter, cream or eggs.

-**Dessert.** Choose fresh fruit, poached spiced fruit, angel food cake with fruit puree, sorbet, sherbet or gelatin.

-**Alcohol.** One ounce liquor, four ounces dry wine or 12 ounces of light beer.

Portland players not surprised about playing for championship

AUBURN HILLS, Mich. (AP) - The Portland Trail Blazers, who barely made the playoffs a year ago, say they aren't surprised the team is in the NBA Finals for the first time since 1977.

"This team won 59 games, and people still say, 'Portland Who?'" Jerome Kersey, the Trail Blazers' leading playoff scorer, said on the eve of tonight's championship series opener against the Detroit Pistons. "But I knew we had a good team at the beginning of the season, and I knew we had a good chance of making the finals if we made the playoffs."

Clyde Drexler, Portland's closest thing to a marquee player, said the Trail Blazers expect to beat the Pistons, who are making their third consecutive trip to the finals and hope to become the third NBA franchise to repeat as champions.

"A lot of people think we're just happy to be here, but even early in the season we expected to be here," Drexler said. "We're coming in with

the idea that we can beat the Pistons."

Detroit coach Chuck Daly doesn't gracefully accept the Pistons' favorite's role.

"They have guys who have been around for a long time and I don't think our championship experience will make much difference," Daly said.

Daly said Portland "is balanced, tough and quick on transition. It's a mental adjustment to go from one kind of team to another. You can't cheat on defense on any player in their lineup. They've got too many guys who can play, and they're bigger than us at nearly every position."

The finalists have a lot more in common than their identical 59-23 regular-season and 35-6 home records. Both play a physical style, with strong rebounding and balanced scoring.

Another similarity between the teams is that each won on the other's homecourt in two regular season games.

Portland won its home game 102-82 on Nov. 26, another source of worry for Daly.

"We got totally annihilated and we were rested," Daly said. "I don't think anybody beat us that badly all season."

Pistons guard Isiah Thomas agreed with Daly that the Trail Blazers' balance makes them a tougher team to defend than Chicago, which was held under 80 points twice in the seven-game Eastern Conference finals.

"We have to respect everyone on their team because they have three or four guys who can score 25-35 points," Thomas said. "In the other series I've been able to dominate the other point guard most of the time, but Terry Porter is equal to or better than me."

Porter, who has played in the shadow of the West's strong cast of point guards - Magic Johnson, John Stockton and Kevin Johnson - said he and his teammates have gotten some recognition because of Portland's

playoff success this year.

"Before the playoffs, if you asked the average fan to name someone on the team, they probably only could have named Clyde Drexler and Buck Williams," Porter said. "But we've been getting a lot of national publicity as we've gone through the playoffs."

In 1988, the Pistons won the first game on the road, lost the next two games, won two at home and then lost the next two at the Forum.

"The Trail Blazers are going to have to learn for themselves the problems we had that first year in the finals," Thomas said.

One of Portland's problems is the Pistons' defense, which is allowing 92.3 points per game, even better than last year's record playoff pace of 92.9 when Detroit won 15 of 17 postseason games en route to its first title.

"We have to be willing to take our offense to another pass and to the next option," Portland coach Rick Adelman said. "And if we can defend well, we can get into the open court offensively."

San Jac batboy real star of NJCAA World Series

GRAND JUNCTION, Colo. (AP) - Baseball is filled with superstition, and lucky charms are cherished. So are little boys, the little leaguers and just maybe the major leaguers of the future.

Clay Van Hook, 5, won the hearts of the crowd of the National Junior College World Series and those of the San Jacinto team of Pasadena, Texas, who fought their way through the loser's bracket to win a fifth championship in six years.

Clay is the littlest batboy. He says he's 5, and he's just 3 feet, 2 inches tall. The Gator jersey, No. 2, that he wears tucks down past his knees. The batting helmet rests on his shoulders and he can see only when he uses both hands to tilt the helmet back.

His dad is the assistant coach for San Jacinto.

By Saturday night's championship game, which the Gators won 5-0 over Middle Georgia, Clay was a minor celebrity in his own right. He was signing autographs on fans' programs and baseball hats behind the dugout.

"I'm glad he's here," said Robert Henkel, the sore-armed freshman who pitched a three-hit shutout for San Jacinto in the final game.

"He's our good luck charm." Friday night's game, a 15-6 San Jacinto victory over Middle Georgia that set up the "if necessary" second title game, was played in weather unseasonably cold for western Colorado in early June - under 40 degrees.

Clay was cold, so one of the Gator players took off his coat and draped it around the little guy. It dragged on the ground as he carried bats back to the dugout.

When a San Jacinto catcher was beamed by a bat whipping around a hitter's shoulder, he was taken out of the game and dispatched to the bench with a large ice bag to hold on his head.

Top 5A hurlers to square off in state tourney

DALLAS (AP) - Talk about a 2-for-1. Fans at the schoolboy baseball tournament this week will get to see the state's top two pitchers, both of them first-round draft picks named Todd, facing each other for the first time.

Duncanville's Todd Ritchie (14-1) will face Arlington Martin's Todd Van Poppel (12-1) in the second game of the Class 5A semifinals at Disch-Falk Field in Austin Thursday night.

Van Poppel, the nation's top prospect this year, was expected to be taken No. 1 until he committed to the University of Texas. That didn't stop the Oakland Athletics from drafting the right-hander with a 95-mph fastball the 14th pick overall.

Ritchie, a right-hander who has spent the season in the shadow of the other Todd, was actually selected ahead of Van Poppel, with the 12th pick by the Minnesota Twins.

"The baseball fan will drive from all over the state to see them," said Bill Farney, athletic director of the University Interscholastic League.

Both Ritchie and Van Poppel downplayed the matchup.

"I think this just adds to the fun of the game," Ritchie said. "But there's probably not going to be many runs scored."

Van Poppel said, "You can't go out there pitching against another pitcher. You've got to pitch against a team."

Eight-thousand fans are expected to see the game between Duncanville (31-4) and Arlington Martin (23-8).

Van Poppel said being selected by the world champion A's wouldn't sway his decision to play for the Longhorns.

"It doesn't really make any difference which team it was," said Van Poppel. "I'm going to Texas. I've just got some things I want to do in my life. My goals mean too much to me to go to the pros right now."

Van Poppel said those goals include the 1992 U.S. Olympic team and a chance at the College World Series.

Another Texas pitcher, left-hander Robbie Beckett of Austin McCallum High School, was selected 25th by the San Diego Padres. Beckett's selection marked the first time in the 26 years of baseball's amateur draft that three Texas high school pitchers were first-round selections.

Ritchie and Beckett have indicated they will sign.

"If the money is right, and they make me the offer I like, there's no reason I wouldn't go pro," said Ritchie, who also has a scholarship to Mississippi State.

Ritchie, a three-year starter, has a 0.64 ERA. In 109 innings, he has 116 strikeouts and 32 walks. His fastball has been consistently clocked near 90 mph.

Van Poppel has a 1.10 ERA with 163 strikeouts in 95 1-3 innings.

Brady, Del Rio lose tracks

AUSTIN (AP) - Texas Racing Commission chairman Hugh Fitzsimons Jr. says the slow start in state pari-mutuel racing indicates Texans aren't quite ready to support several medium-sized tracks.

On Monday, the field of Class 2 tracks tightened as G. Rollie White Downs and Del Rio Downs were scratched from the list.

"It may be evidence that we can't handle that many (tracks) right away. It takes time" to build up fan support, said Fitzsimons.

The Racing Commission voted 3-0 to deny G. Rollie White Downs in Brady a license for 1991, and Del Rio Downs asked to be dropped from consideration for a renewed license.

G. Rollie White Downs last year became the first track in Texas to

conduct pari-mutuel wagering since 1937. But the track's operators - Heart of Texas Racing Inc. - quickly ran into financial trouble and cut the season short.

The track now is insolvent with debts soaring to about \$700,000, officials said.

In other business, the commission renewed the licenses of Bandera Downs near San Antonio and Longhorn Downs in Blanco County, and gave Lubbock Downs until Aug. 6 to prove it has financial backing to complete construction.

Commissioners also approved renewing a Class 3 license for the Gillespie County Fair and Festivals Association in Fredericksburg.

The Fredericksburg track recently

completed a Memorial Day weekend racing schedule and is set to race again over the July 4th holiday.

On Bandera Downs, the commission asked that track president and general manager Don Essary provide officials with documentation concerning a construction loan he received from Bandera Financial Management Inc.

Essary said the loan was made without signing any documents and that it could be for as much as \$3 million.

The track, located about 45 miles northeast of San Antonio, is scheduled to open July 6 for pari-mutuel wagering.

On the Lubbock Downs track, commissioners and staff members

said they were concerned that track owner, Jean Arnett of Lubbock, would face dangerous debt problems.

Ms. Arnett said she has spent \$550,000 to start the track up and would probably have to borrow the remaining \$5 million.

"There is a long history of racetracks not being able to make it because they were too highly leveraged," Fitzsimons said.

She said she had a financial commitment for the remainder of the costs needed to start the track if the Legislature and Gov. Bill Clements reduces the state's 5 percent wagering tax. Clements on Monday added consideration of reducing the wagering tax to the special legislative session.

Big 10 adds Penn State

IOWA CITY, Iowa (AP) - It took more than 40 years, but the Big Ten Conference has added another member to its ranks.

The presidents of the universities that make up the conference agreed Monday to make Penn State University the 11th member of the Big Ten.

The Nittany Lions are the first addition to the Midwest-based conference since Michigan State joined in 1949.

Big Ten commissioner Jim Delany indicated the conference would change its name in the next 60 days, but did not elaborate. He said new names have been "tossed around."

The Big Ten university presidents, known as the Council of Ten, agreed informally last December to add Penn

State, but made it official after meeting here during their annual summer review of conference business.

Illinois president Stan Ikenberry, the council chairman, said at a news conference at the University of Iowa that at least seven of the presidents voted in favor of adding Penn State to the conference. He declined to break down the voting and said there was no "arm twisting."

"You find as chairman of the Council of Ten you don't touch the arms," Ikenberry said.

The Big Ten Conference, headquartered in Schaumburg, Ill., had been made up of the University of Illinois, the University of Iowa, the University of Minnesota, the University of Wisconsin, Indiana

University, the University of Michigan, Michigan State University, Ohio State University, Northwestern University and Purdue University.

Penn State, with about 29,000 undergraduates, is a research-based land grant university located at State College in central Pennsylvania. The Nittany Lions are independents in football but members of the Atlantic 10 Conference in all other sports.

"We believe Penn State will make a splendid addition to the conference. We're proud of their academic standing. We're also pleased with the integrity with which they have conducted their intercollegiate programs over a number of years," Ikenberry said.

"Those were the two principle motivating factors ... when we first

began this process," he said.

"This represents a move of historic proportions from Penn States - past, present and future. We have joined a family rich in tradition built upon integrity and with a vision for the growth of higher education," Penn State president Bryce Jordan said in a statement.

"Our overriding motivation, in concluding this conference relationship, has been what we perceive as the wisest future course for the total university, both academically and athletically," he said.

Ikenberry also said the council voted to impose a four-year moratorium on further expansion, although it could be lifted if at least seven presidents agreed to add a 12th member.

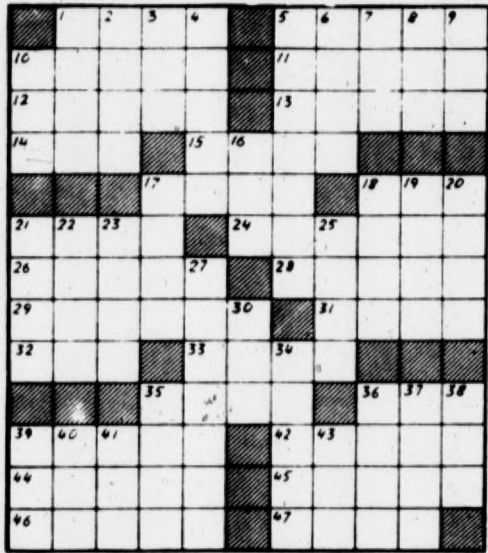

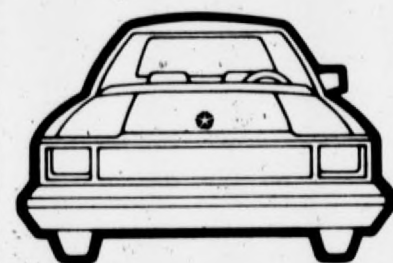

Breast cancer screening program set July 3

The Breast Cancer Screening Program of the Don & Sybil Harrington Cancer Center and High Plains Baptist Hospital of Amarillo, in cooperation with South Plains Health Care Providers, Inc., will continue community breast cancer screening clinics in Hereford on July 3, for low income women in need of screening mammography.

The clinic will be held from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the South Plains Health Care Providers, Inc., 603 E. Park. Exams are done by appointment only. For more information about the clinic or to make an appointment, please call the Harrington Cancer Center at 1-800-274-4673. Locally, for more information, contact the clinic at 364-7688.

Funding is available through the Texas Cancer Council for Texas residents requiring financial assistance for screening mammography, in an effort to provide screening to a previously underserved group of women.

Early detection of breast cancer is the major goal of cancer control for each woman seen in the clinic. The clinic provides low-cost screening which includes a breast exam by a registered nurse trained in breast cancer detection, teaching of breast self-examination, and a mammogram.

Currently, the most effective method known to win the battle against breast cancer is early detection. Early detection is best done by following the guidelines recommended by the American Cancer Society for breast cancer screening for women who have no signs or symptoms of breast cancer.

The guidelines are to learn and perform breast self-examination every month. To have a physical examination of the breasts every year and have a mammogram according to the recommendations by age. Persons ages 35-40 should have one baseline mammogram. Persons ages 40-50 should have a mammogram every one to two years. Persons over 50 years of age should have yearly mammograms.
