## School tax rate up 21\% over 1990-91

The "Robin Hood" school
financing plan is supposed to take
from the rich and give to the poor, but most Texans are finding themselves listed among the rich--if paying more
taxes is any indication. In Hereford, the new plan will give more relief to those 65 or older with
homestead exemptions, and some relief to others with homesteads
valued under $\$ 40,000$. will mean increases above that level. Businesses will bear the brunt of the hike--
paying about 21 percent more than last year.
On an $\$ 80,000$ home in the city, for example, the school the city will increasc by about $\$ 16.58$ a year even
for those with a homestead exemp-
An $\$ 80,000$ business--which gets no exemption--w will sec an increase
of about $\$ 159$ a yar.
The big increases are the result of
the additional exemptions voters approved in the County Education ${ }^{\text {District elections Aug. } 10 \text {. Home- }}$ owners voted themselves a 20 percent
break on the value of their home. break on the value of their home.
That action, however, decreased the That action, however, decreased the
property tax base by about $\$ 27$ million--which, in turn, caused a larger hike in the rate.

Five years ago, the school tax rate was 69 cents per $\$ 100$. Now, it's \$1.109, a 60 percent increase. It is a 21\% Increase over the rate for 1990-91.

## Bush unveils nuclear plan

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Bush wants the Soviets to join in
scaling back the world's most powerful nuclear missiles as he commits scaling back the world's most powerful nuclear missiles as he
the United States to eliminating most short-range missiles. In an announcement detailing some of the biggest changes in nuclear
history, Bush pledged Friday to "take steps to make the world a less dangerous place than ever before in the nuclear age."
Bush said in a nationwide television ad

ground-launched short range nuclear weapons - most of them stored in ground-launched short range nuclear weapons - most of them stored in
Europe - as well as those carried on ships and submarines, including the Europe - as well as those carried on ships ann submarines, including the

County in particular - is poised to become the global center of an

business.

Two aviation companies that have been the economic cornerstones in the
county for more than 40 years county for more than 40 years
Gencral Dynamics and Bell Helicopter Textron - are affected by the
shrinking defense budget, but aviation's impact continues to grow.
About 10,000 jobs have been losi plose nearby Carswell Air Force Base. As many as 2,000 Bell jobs depend
upon continued funding of the $V-22$ Osprey tilt-rotor aircraft in the
defense budget defense budget. Congressional
supporters have kept the program alive despitico opposition from Defense Secrctary Dick Chaney. Yet he commercial side of the
multi-faceted aviation business is blossoming.
AMR Corp., parent of American Airlines, has seen its local employ-
ment grow from about 11,000 to ment grow from about 11,000 to
nearly 27,000 in just four years. Early
this year, AMR moved ahead of the shrinking GD to become the county's argest employer.
Even without the recent layoffs.
American likely would have passed GD in just a couple of years. In DFW and at its corporate campus in far east Fort Worth, in January, $\$ 800$ million maintenance base Alliance, adding at least 4,500 jobs o the local economy over the next five years.
No. 2 carrier at DFW, has seen its ocal employment grow nearly 40 percent since 1988 , from 4,770 to
6,700 , making it the county's fifth-largest employer.

cost to the government. Often, out-
of town firms bill travel consultation time, and out-of-pocket expense fo any services they provide outside of the audit function.

believe that the hospital will be better served by an out-of-town CPA firm

By BEVERLY HARDER County Extension Agent-HE TAILGATE PARTIES Tailgating becomes a favorite activity with fall weather and football
games. These events can be lots of fun games. These events can be lots of fun
with good food and good friends. But winnt
dot the later giset of foodborne illness sour the remembrance of a good
${ }^{\text {time. Foodborne illness, with it's stomach }}$ cramps, diarrhea, nausea, headaches and maybe even vomiting, can be caused by improper handiing of foods. illiness grow at temperatures between 40 degrees Fahrenheit and 140 degrees F. This is called the "danger zone." So even though the weather may be cooler the problem. So what foods present a problem?
Almost any food can be a vehicle for Almost any food can be a venicie for
foodborne illness, but the most perishable foods are moist, proteinpoultry, fish, seafood, eggs and dairy products. This listeven includes items such as cream pies, custards and pastries that include cream fillings
These foods should not stay in "danger zone" temperatures for more than two hours. dishes containing these perishable foods should be kept either hot (above 140 degres 40 degrees F)
(belo
Popular hot menu items such as chili, soups, stews and even hot dips can be safely transporied in a hermos if the er precautions are aken. Check the seal of the thermos to be sure it fits tighly. Be sure the thermos is clean; and rinse it with boiling water right before using it. Bring the food to as
high a temperature as you can before pouring it into the thermos. Try to prepare just enough food to
serve your guest without leftovers. serve your guest without leftovers.
Any leftovers probably should be Any leftovers probably should be
discarded.
Hot casseroles should probably be Hot casseroies should probabiy be
served immediately upon arriving.

Wrap them in several layers of aluminum foil, followed by newspap-
ers and a towel. Observe ers and a towel. Observe the two hou limin with these.
Cold foods c an ice chest with ice, dry ice or cold packs to keep the foods below 40 degrees F. Pack the foods in shallow
containers and be sure the foods containers and be sure the foods are
cold when they are put in the icechest. If sandwiches are oin the menu, they should be kept cold or else eaten within the two-hour limit. Foods such as deviled eggs and dips with dairy products in them also fall into the two hour category.
If fast foods or deli foods are on the menu, either pick them up immediately before the event and eat within two hours, or
purchase them ahead of time. Keep purchase them ahead of time. Keep
these foods refrigerated and rehea them if they are to be eaten hot. If you don't want to bother wi perishable foods, there are other some specially-prepared dried or cured meats, some hard cheeses, peanu butter, fruits and vegetables, breads
and cereal mixes, nuts and popcor all and cereal mixes, nuts and popcorn a At the site, follow. food handling practices. This means clean hands, utensils and dinnerware isposable items are probably a goo
idea. Spread a clean tablecloth on the tailgate or table and enjoy. In short, to enjoy a tailgating
adventure without later *Plan the menu to fit the situation *For perishable foods, keep "hot foods hot" and "cold foods cold." *Don't let perishable foods stay in the "danger zone" for more than two ${ }_{\text {HKeep }}$ hourything clean to avoid contamination.

Host Gres Lee (of Nickelodeon's Total Panic) is joined by chief detective Lynne Thigpen, who issues bulle tins, reviews clues and introduces reports from celebrity investigators from Kool Moe Dee to Regis and Kathie Lee. Musical diversion, as well is the show's addictive main theme, is supplied by Rockapella, a talented quartet also seen in recent Taco Bell commercials. And yes, there are prizes.
If all this sounds pretty commercial for a non-profit corporation that has built its reputation on presenting the facts, just the facts, it is.
Carmen Sandicgo signals a change of emphasis at PBS that may be either the beginning of a hip new era in educational programming or the first swirls of complete homogeneity in broadcast television. After all, if PBS won't - or can't afford - to do E-TV anymore, who will?
