LOS ANGELES (AP) - Some 4,500 federal troops with authorization to fire if fired upon headed for riot-torn Los Angeles overnight, and Rodney King pleaded for an end to the violence committed in his name. The death toll climbed to 40.

#### **Discovering Columbus** ships at Galvestion site takes real determination

By JOE WEAVER We had made it.

Standing on the deck of the tiny ship, I had to ask myself: was it worth it? A flying weekend trip to Galveston, a three-hour wait in the rain, and a \$5 admission charge to stand on the convex deck crowded with about twenty-five other tourists.

Was it worth it? You bet!

It depends on your perspective, I guess. Most people thought I was crazy to drive 800 miles (one way) to see the Nina, the Pinta, and the Santa Maria. Authentic replicas of Columbus's ships commissioned by the government of Spain at an expense of \$14 million were sailed to various ports in both hemispheres. To make matters worse, we had heard rumors that the ships could not be boarded and only pass-by viewing was allowed.

It rained intermittently the whole time we stood in line, sometimes pouring. We (that is, myself, my wife and our two daughters) had taken beach clothes, but no rain gear. Fortunately, my wife had suggested we stop at a convenience store and buy some large trash bags as a last-ditch measure. Good thinking on her part. They kept us semi-dry.

The family behind us was from Huntsville, where the parents were both professors at SHSU. I judged them to be just a few years older by the statement that the only line they had ever stood in that was longer or more miserable was when they went to see American Graffiti in an Iowa winter. We passed the two-anda-half hours in line in pleasant conversation, comparing the geographic and economic diversities of East Texas and the Panhandle.

This brought us to the ticket booth where we bought the only reasonably-priced item in the complex: Our admission tickets. Shortly after that, we had to decide among three branches, one for each ship. The waiting time for the Santa Maria, Columbus's flagship and the largest of the three, was about an hour-and-a-half, with

a half-hour wait being standard for either of the smaller ones. We chose a smaller one.

The Nina was farthest to the left, so we opted for it. (Of course, we could have seen all three if we'd had an extra six hours or so!) It was a wise choice. We found out later that this as Columbus's favorite ship. He deemed it the most seaworthy, and returned to Spain in the Nina after the Santa Maria was shipwrecked.

Boarding was allowed, but only on the main deck. We were not permitted on the forecastle or below, and if this landlubber saw the poop deck, he couldn't identify it. I was surprised to find that the deck was curved upward in the middle, and the gunwales were open on the bottom to permit any water to roll right back to the sea. (It occurred to me that anything dropped on that deck would roll right back to the sea, so I kept a firm grip on my camera!)

But the impressive thing was the size or lack of it, I should say. Twenty-five sightseers crowded the deck. which was just a little larger than the average living room, and the original ship required a crew of 22! Imagine filling your living room (or bedroom) with 20 people. Water is strictly rationed, food consists mainly of slated or dried meat (forget any fruits or vegetables), and no one really has any idea of how long you may have to stay there. For added effect, remove the door to the

bathroom, and peel off about three-fourths of the roof, opening the whole thing to the elements. Add a few rats, and you probably have a pretty good picture of what Columbus' crew encountered.

Unfortunately, on-deck information was pretty slim. There were a couple of "officials", but their duties apparently were limited to making sure people didn't slice off a souvenir or go "down the hatch". In the complex, there were some printed exhibits with a fair amount of information, and a 20-30 minute video which we disregarded. I was prepared for overpriced souvenirs, but \$20 mugs and \$50 sweaters were a little extravagant. We chose the 50 cent postcards.

Was it worth it? Without question. Sure, the drive was long, the wait was miserable, the souvenirs were overpriced. But I came about as close as I ever expect I will to standing where Columbus stood. If we had just gone to see a boat, we could have done that at Lake Meredith and bigger ones, too! We went to get a feel for history, to try to grasp what those ancient mariners experienced! It may be debated whether Columbus as a blessing or a curse, but his impact upon history is inescapable. And standing on the deck of his favorite ship, replica though it was, makes me feel just a little closer to him.

does destroys the planet. Cows, it seems contribute to global warming with their flatulence. Forests are denuded for cattle pasture. People are starving while cattle are consuming feed every day.

The erroneous claims of the antibeef lobby are too implausible to be taken seriously. But who would have predicted a decade ago that restaurants would offer smoking and nonsmoking tables?



#### **Termites Swarming** Here



and control them early than late. Termites will be actively swarming in the months ahead. They fly out of their nests, sometimes by the hundreds and thousands, to mate and start new colonies. If you find some of the critters, first use this handy drawing to see whether it is an ant or termite. Many species of ants swarm at the same time, and it's easy to mistake

Notice that termites wings are about the same length and have lots of veins, while ant wings have few veins, and their forewings are longer than their hindwings. Also, termites have broad waists and straight or curved antennae, while ants have narrow waists and sharply bent antennae.

# Bass prefers to be general manager

SAN ANTONIO (AP) - Bob Bass always was an early riser, and this year has been no exception. Never mind that, too often, sleep consists of a few, fitful hours.

And never mind that each day seems to bring another Spurs calamity. First, David Robinson. Then, Willie Anderson. Now, Rod Strickland.

Then, of course, there is the outside chance next year's coach, Jerry Tarkanian, will oversee one practice and immediately beg Bass to come back from his vice president of operations job. But even the most prolific replacement coach in basketball history (1974, 1980, 1983 and 1992) has to say no sometime.

"Bob is wound tight," Fitzsimmons said. "His gasket's about ready to blow. He'll be a very happy camper when he can go back to the other job."

Even so, along with relief, there is reluctance in Bass' mind about leaving. In fact, there is a stubbornness. When Bass took the reins of a then-talented team from Larry Brown Jan. 21, he saw problems, sure, but also promise. The last thing he envisioned was leaving behind a team, literally, in pieces.

"Personally, I felt I got cheated when David got hurt," Bass said. "Here was a chance to do really well. But it's not only me. When I say, 'I,' I shouldn't say, 'I.' Our season ticket holders, our fans, the other 11 players, the coaches, they were all cheated."

So from the start of this first-round series against the Suns, Bass has been racking his brain, trying to make up for lost bodies. He broke out the "HWSD" T-shirts. He insisted the "experts" were selling the Spurs

Game 1 in Phoenix, Sean Elliott said Bass was as emotional as the team had ever seen him. When the Suns took the game 117-111 with some late calls Bass deemed questionable, it left the 63-year-old coach drained.

Bass is one guy who hasn't been thinking ahead to the Tarkanian regime. He wanted to get the most he could out of his last coaching chance.

"Bob, I don't have to tell you, is pretty serious about what he's doing," Spurs owner Red McCombs said. "Bob is the epitome of a professional. He didn't take this on as interim at all. He dove into it with all his heart and soul. I respect the dickens out of him. That little guy has really shown something. He's really shown some class."

If the season ends this week, all most will remember is the Spurs falling in the first round for the second straight year.

What many won't remember is the fact Bass took over a 21-17 team and, albeit with a favorable home schedule, got the Spurs to a high-water mark of 42-25.

Still, the combination of the injuries and the fact he often had to beg players to play on the road led Bass to tell friends this by far was the hardest season of his career.

The grueling nature of NBA travel only has magnified the job of holding together a dwindling team. Fortunately for Bass, he had assistant coach Gregg Popovich to turn to, especially the first few weeks after taking over.

"It takes so much more energy to coach an NBA team now," Bass said. "The thing that surprises me is that, in most cases, teams are playing real hard. The major portion of arenas are sold out, the others are near-sellouts. The exposure by the print media and also by TV and radio, the coverage is so complete, that the players have a tendency not to let up.

Bass wasn't wild about the idea, either. Less than an hour after Brown's firing, he still seemed to be in semi-shock.

But for the players, there couldn't have been a better transition coach. As someone who already attended ever home practice and made most of the deals that pieced together this team, Bass already knew the personnel.

What opened his eyes, he admits,

was actually being in the locker room with them. A coach learns the most about a player, Bass said, when he asks him to perform at a high level. And Bass, a throwback to his days

as a high school coach in Oklahoma dating to 1950, has some unusual ways of asking.

'I always kid him," Elliott said. 'He always has those sayings. A lot of Texans, they have those sayings. Like, 'Boy, he's tough. He can carry his weight in wildcats.' You sit there thinking about it for a minute. BB told me one time, 'If you don't run the floor, I'll be on you like a duck on a June Bug."

Then there was a late-season game at Denver, sloppy and dreadful from everyone's standpoint. But Bass had the Spurs playing hard that day.

And with some late defense, they pulled out a 90-87 victory. The result ultimately helped them hold onto the No. 5 seed in the Western Conference. 'BB's hands shake a lot. It was a

tight game, and he was trying to diagram a play, and his hand was shaking so bad, I thought I was in an

Perhaps the biggest thing that has kept Bass going is the fact his coaching blood began to flow again. That and the fact he has been part of the Spurs' organization since replacing Tom Nissalke as head coach in 1974.

He has been coach four times, assistant to then-President Angelo Drossos (1976), assistant coach to Doug Moe (1977-79), general manager (1980-83 and 1984-85) and vice president of operations (1987 to

That's some personal investment in one franchise.

"This team puts so much pressure on you, because it's got so many expectations," Bass said. "And then you turn around and put it on yourself. We're supposed to win. The situation just has a lot of pressure."

At least Bass has had one friend, Scooter, who didn't care whether the Spurs won or lost. And then there is Pat, who helped her husband with the opposite approach.

She gets just as upset over Spurs losses, perhaps more so, than Bass himself.

"She's been a great wife for me because she's never sympathetic with me when we lose," Bass said. "She doesn't let me get down. When you think you're getting down, she just kicks you."

Fitzsimmons, who coached the Spurs from 1984 to 1986, while Bass was general manager, knows Bass well enough to see how badly Bass

More than vaguely, Fitzsimmons still remembers playing at Midwestern State University from 1953-1955, while Bass was beginning his 15-year tenure as head coach at Oklahoma Baptist University.

"He's a coach, he's always been coach," Fitzsimmons said. "I played against Bob Bass' team in college. He doesn't like me to say that because he probably lies about his age. He's probably about 75. So he doesn't like to say he was sitting on the bench in a little leisure suit, with the short hair, no gray in it. And I'm out there playing against him. He

swears that I was 30 years old then." Soon, Bass will go back to being plain old vice president. Pulling trades. Going to Luby's for lunch or having chicken fingers at Good Time Charlie's with his old friend, former Spurs treasurer Maury Holden.







# Man builds baseball camp in son's memory

QUEEN CITY, Texas (AP) - Dr. Clyde Berry has a story guaranteed to bring a tear to the softhearted.

Berry, a former football and baseball coach at Arkansas' Henderson State University, lost his son Jay to muscular dystrophy when the boy was 15 years old.

"Jay was a fanatical baseball fan even though he never played the game," said the elder Berry, who remarried and moved here in 1988 after retiring from HSU. "He loved to watch baseball. It was like he played all nine positions because he would identify with all the kids."

It was approximately two weeks after Jay's death that Berry had an experience that will live with him forever. He was working on a Little League field and a thunderstorm was brewing. There was a loud clap of thunder and Berry told one of his co-workers a bad storm must be approaching.

A 12-year-old friend of Jay's was standing nearby and overheard what Berry had said. "No coach, they're playing baseball in heaven tonight and Jay just hit a home run," the boy

Jay Berry may never be forgotten if his father has any say in the matter. Berry and his wife purchased 124 acres near here and are currently in the process of building the Jay Berry Memorial Baseball Complex, which will feature six complete baseball fields, dormitories and a mess building. When completed, this facility will be the site of the first annual Jay Berry Memorial Baseball Camp in 1993.

The camp was a dream of Berry's long before his son's tragic death. He grew up a fanatical baseball fan himself, and even played professional

After the war Berry got his education, attending school at Batesville, Ark., for two years before transferring and getting his degree at Henderson. His masters and doctorate followed. Berry was named head football coach at his alma mater in 1967, but that career was cut short by another tragedy.

A plane crash claimed the life of HSU's team physician and left Berry crippled. Another Berry son, 8-yearold Clyde, was also on the plane, and it was his heroism that might have saved his father's life.

'It was a real foggy night and the plane crashed short of the airport in Little Rock," recalled Berry. "Clyde wasn't hurt seriously and it was he who found his way out of the woods to the highway and flagged down the ambulance. He then led them back through the woods to the crash site. The attendants told me later that he had saved my life."

Eight hip operations followed and his football coaching career was over. He was replaced by his top assistant, the late Sporty Carpenter, a former Liberty-Eylau coach recently inducted into the NAIA Hall of Fame.

Berry missed coaching and jumped at an opportunity in 1982 when Henderson's baseball coaching job came open. It was through this position that he met his current wife,

"I had a player (Rob Barnwell) from Queen City and through him I met Sue," said Berry. "She's lived around here all her life so when I retired we decided to settle here. The baseball camp is a joint adventure for both of us, and it has been her support that's made it a reality."

Located off Farm Road 2327, approximately one-half mile from Highway 59 South, Berry's elaborate complex is now nearing completion. He's planning a softball tournament 'next month and there may be other such events in an effort to raise funds already claimed an inheritance from his mother, his life savings and a large contribution from his wife.

Berry had projected his camp would be completed this June, but heavy rains slowed construction. Lights must still be installed on four of the fields, and construction on the dormitories and mess building has not started yet.

"If we open on schedule in 1993 we'll probably have only one dorm completed and it will house 48 boys," said Berry. "Our goal is to house 96 boys and have 120 boys per week at camp."

A deeply religious man, Berry's baseball camps will feature strong Christian leadership. He hopes to eventually affiliate his camp with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

"Even though our main activity will be baseball, there's no reason our campers can't be involved with good Christian men," said Berry. "We want our parents and campers to know there will be a wholesome and Christian to finance the facility, which has atmosphere here. That's our top

priority. I want to encourage some of boys anyway I can. I might even have our area laymen to come up and be senior counselors to the boys."

The baseball camp itself will feature former professionals, college and high school coaches and college players as members of Berry's teaching staff.

"We'll probably have six staff members and assistant coaches for our first camp," said Berry. "Our staff will grow as the camp grows. We think we're in a real good geographic area. There's not a camp like this in Arkansas, Louisiana or Texas. Probably the closest thing is the Chandler camp in Northeast Oklahoma.'

The camp will also feature individual instruction and team participation for all participants, ages 8-18. Campers will go home with personal evaluations and a video of their performance at

The cost will not be particularly cheap, but Berry is hoping to keep it near the \$350 mark. That fee would be lower than what similar camps across the country charge, according to Berry. That fee would also be less if campers commuted.

'I hope we never have to turn away a kid because of a lack of funds," said Berry. "I'll work with families and a boy come to camp two weeks early and work so he could go to baseball camp the third week. I don't see anything wrong with a boy washing dishes, picking up trash or maintaining the fields. I think there's a lot to benefit from being away from home for a week. And when the kids go home we want them to say, "I not only had a great time, but I learned a lot of baseball."



# Jacksonville boy overcomes accident; gets drafted by NFL

JACKSONVILLE, Texas (AP) -When you look up determination in the dictionary, you might find a picture of Raymond Etheridge.

Etheridge, a 5-foot-11, 190-pound wide receiver who started his sports career at Jacksonville High School, was selected in the third round of last weekend's NFL draft by the San Diego Chargers.

'He's a man with a strong will. He is very determined," says his mother, Vernolia Stewart. "Now that he's got what he worked for I know he's grinning ear to ear."

Etheridge's path to the National Football League has had many detours.

He was blazing 4.4 times in the 40-yard dash as a sophomore at Jacksonville, considered a blue chip running backdefensive back. Then tragedy struck.

Etheridge was involved in a traffic accident that left him with one leg so badly broken he nearly lost it. He was

in the hospital 45 days. The doctors told him his days in sports were over," his mother says.
"I told him to be thankful he had kept his leg and to thank God for his

But that answer didn't suit Raymond Etheridge. He kept talking about playing football. His mother challenged him to work toward his

"I told him if he really wanted to do it, to throw down the crutches and get ready to play," Mrs. Stewart said. "He worked at it and ended up faster

than he was before the accident." Looking back on those difficult times, Etheridge says he believes that what seemed like a tragic setback really was a benefit.

"I was getting cocky," he says. "I thought I had it all and I didn't really work hard.

"But I'm faster now than before. I ran fast enough to qualify for the Olympic trials in 1988 in the 100 and 200 meters. I ran a 4.33.40 at the NFL combine."

Still, nobody was talking to him about scholarships. It was only when Raymond went to California to stay with relatives that he came up with a football scholarship - to Pasadena Community College.

His mother pushed him to succeed,

"He's the oldest and he had to set an example for the family," Mrs. Stewart said. "I was hard on him in high school. I wanted him to graduate and have a good career. It didn't matter if it was football or anything else. ... I really wanted him to finish his college, but he had to go when opportunity knocked."

But that knock of opportunity came first from the Canadian League, not the NFL. Etheridge played last year for British Columbia.

The experience paid off.

"I really like being drafted by San Diego, being their third pick makes me feel good," Etheridge said. "I think it's a good organization to play for. I have a chance to start and get some playing time right away. I've worked hard to get to this point."

'Raymond making it to the NFL shows what you can do with the Lord guiding you," his mother says. 'Raymond sure has had a bumpy rad, a tough road many people would not have been able to travel. He proved it to himself and to the world he was good enough for the NFL."

Etheridge says it still hasn't really sunk in that his big chance has arrived.

'It's weird. It all hasn't hit me yet," he said. "Making it to the NFL....I think it'll be more exciting than the CFL. The CFL was more like a higher level of college."

Etheridge can't quite realize that he has reached beyond his childhood dream of being a hero in his East Texas hometown of almost 13,000

people.
"It's strange, when I was little all I dreamed about was the Tomato Bowl," Etheridge said. "Growing up and playing for the Indians and getting a tomahawk and all that. Now I'm in the NFL, the only thing that could make this better is to win the Super Bowl."



We shouldn't overlook the enormous contributions animal research has made to veteri-

nary medicine. Some have demanded that animal research be replaced by "alternatives" such as computer models and cell cultures. 



SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP) - Family support is important in helping people with rheumatoid arthritis cope with the pain, report researchers at the California School of Professional Psychology.

According to Arthritis Today, a publication of the Arthritis Foundation, the research was conducted by a team headed by Dr. Vesna Radojevic, who implemented a six-week pain-management regimen that included education and relaxation techniques.

Fifty-nine patients in the study were placed randomly in one of four groups, and the groups' physical symptoms measured before, during and after the treatment. The findings supported other recent studies suggesting that a link may exist between good health and strong interpersonal relationships, the publication reported.



#### MINDING YOUR OWN **BUSINESS** Don Taylor

Networking

hether you are looking for new customers, gathering business information or trying to find a new job, networking is a strategy that can work for you. Networking is the art of making personal contacts that help you achieve your objectives.

One of the early lessons I learned is that who you know may be as important as what you know. I do not mean to infer that by knowing the right person or persons you can expect preferential treatment. Rather, I'm saying that success is largely a matter of establishing a network of contacts.

Business is all about building relationships. For you entrepreneurs, this is especially good news. It means that you can grow your business by expanding your people network.

that business is always people to people. Companies don't talk to each other, people do. Corporations don't make inventory decisions, people do. Businesses don't provide outrageous customer service, people do.

The second part of this principle is that people do business with people they know, trust and like. Putting yourself in a position to meet new people and then developing those relationships, is a skill worth acquiring.

Six Networking Tips

Making the most of your people-to-people contacts requires a little planning. Once you decide what events are most likely to bring you together with desired contacts, use the following tips to speed the process along.

1) Initiate the contact. Put a smile on your face and extend your hand. Most people are just a little shy about making the first move. Your warm, friendly overtures will put them at ease.

2) Gather information. To determine whether a new contact can help you or if you can help them, you must get to know more about them. Ask polite, open-ended questions, then listen.

3) Arrive a little early. Social hours are usually first, and are great networking times. If a meeting is worth attending it's worth getting there early.

4) Develop a 10 second personal introduction that will help people remember you and what you do. An automobile mechanic friend of mine says he specializes in hard to solve problems that other mechanics can't fix.

5) Use your business cards. Carry a good supply with you and Frequently large companies lose sight of the basic principle collect cards from every appropriate contact you make. When I attend

long meetings I frequently make notes on the back of cards to help me remember the contact. Notes about physical features, unique conversations, special needs, etc., help refresh my memory for follow-on networking.

6) Give your full attention to one person at a time. Politicians are notorious for looking past one person to see if someone more important has come in. Don't do that. It shows the insincerity of your intentions. If you find yourself in a dead end conversation, wrap it up with a polite exit line like: "It was a pleasure meeting you. I hope to see you again at future meetings." Don't Overdo It

A final point should be made regarding networking. Don't overdo it. If you spend too much time networking, you may not have time to do your work. It is also possible to cause your contacts to blur together, making it difficult to follow-up effectively. You may not remember who you've met, what you promised or if you carried through on previous contacts.

Depending on how busy you are, two or three events per month may be plenty. If you make a few good contacts every month, you will have a strong networking base in a year.

When your network starts to work for you, remember your manners. "Thank you's" are always in fashion. A short phone call or brief note is welcome and appropriate.



A sprinkler system combined with smoke detectors provides the most reliable form of residential fire protection for you and your family. Excluding deaths by explosion or flash fire, there are no known cases of multiple deaths in a fully sprinklerized building due to fire or smoke, according to the U.S. Fire Administration. Though 80 percent of fire deaths occur in residential buildings,

they rarely have sprinklers.

to protect people in the area of fire origin and reduce fire damage. They activate five to seven times faster than standard commercial sprinklers and have a different spray pattern and droplet size. Also, they prevent the fire from growing to the flashover stage. This occurs when gases from burning materials accumulate and explode. #### Daytime star gets night job

By Candace Havens Last year, Charles Shaughnessy (Shane, Days of Our Lives) said he was frustrated with the stigma attached to daytime actors. It wasn't that he wanted to leave the daytime forum, he just wanted the chance to do other projects. Ironically, his daytime

exposure recently helped get him parts in a new CBS pilot tentatively titled McBride and Groom and the CBS movie Dayo.

"The daytime stigma is still there, but there is a slight consent. I recently did a pilot for CBS, but the way I got in to to see them was kind of a strange twist of good fortune," says Shaughnessy.

"The head of casting at Universal Studios was sick in bed one night and she just happened to see me on the Soap Opera Digest Awards. I was sitting at the table looking distraught when I didn't win. She thought that I looked like the kind of person who might be right for this pilot. So she found out who I was and called my agent. That's how I got the job," Shaughnessy explains.

In Dayo, Shaughnessy's character, Ben Connors, is the husband of Grace Connors (Delta Burke).

"Delta is a lovely person and we had fun working together, says Shaughnessy. "The movie is a sweet, charming, family movie. It's quite a change from all the 'disease of the week' and 'I killed my daughter' movies."

So what has Shane been doing on Days during all this time?

"The last thing I know, he was in his wheelchair banging his fist on a table saying, 'I will walk, dammit,' and then the next minute he is never heard from for four weeks," laughs Shaughnessy.

"I think they (the producers of Days) were a bit miffed when I went off to do the pilot, so it's like 'you sit and stew in your wheelchair and think about what you've done and when you are sorry you can come back," jokes the actor.

If, and that's a big "if" in the world of prime time, the pilot is picked up, we may be saying goodbye to Shane. But for now, Shaughnessy's happy with his daytime gig and plans to be around for

#### Cybill Shepherd says a mouthful

Cybill Shepherd may not have had a series since Moonlighting, but she hasn't been idle; she's spent time developing her own productions. According to Shepherd, too many parts require the woman to be either "the victim or the monster."

On Monday, May 4, Shepherd stars in the telefilm Stormy Weathers on ABC. Her character is a Los Angelesbased private eye who holds a black belt in karate. (Shepherd, a yellow belt, does some of her own stunts.) This gumshoe lets her fingers do some walking as well, tracking down clues on a computer.

It's the kind of role she enjoys, not only for herself but for the example it sets. An ardent feminist and the mother of two daughters and a son, Shepherd is outspoken in her support of women's causes.

She warms to her subject, lapsing into a pep talk on how women need to "deprogram" themselves and shake off old stereotypes. She insists women can "have it all" and notes that she breastfed her twins while continuing to work. "I did it for 20 months, and if I can do it with two, you can do it with one!" she urges her imagined audi-



#### 'Jungle Book' swings on Disney

Walt Disney's careful consideration of what children's entertainment could and should be has all but defined the genre for both television and motion pictures. As a group, Disney's animated films have been more successful than most because they involve whole families. More than movies, Disney films are events.

A Disney event worth noting occurs Sunday, May 3, on Walt's namesake cable network, The Disney Channel, when The Jungle Book makes its first television appearance in its 25-year history.

The animated musical concerns the adventures of Mowgli, a boy raised by wolves and other creatures in the jungles of India. Though the 1947 live-action version starring Sabu does the Rudyard Kipling story its own form of justice, that film doesn't feature a sleazy snake with Winnie the Pooh's voice (Sterling Holloway) and an unforgettable bum of a bear named Baloo (delightfully bellowed by Phil Harris).

Mowgli's animal family agrees it's best for a "man cub" to live with his own kind, but they have a tough time dragging the little one away from his familiar surroundings. Along Mowgli's path toward manhood are the looniest, sneakiest critters a boy could ever imagine. So gather up the kids and turn up the volume, because these cats swing through the jungle smoother than Tarzan ever did. O TV Listing Inc.

#### 'Lawrence After Arabia' removes veil of mysticism

#### Fiennes captures enigma of T.E., Lawrence


By Suzanne Gill "The uncrowned king of Arabia," Lowell Thomas put it. The title is peculiarly fitting for T.E. Lawrence -Lawrence of Arabia — whose triumphs were never legitimized by power. Lawrence was first lionized by contemporary Thomas' film-and-lecture show, but PBS' Great Performances may have the last word with A Dangerous Man: Lawrence After Arabia, airing Wednesday, May 6, and starring Ralph Fiennes.

A middle-class Englishman of slight build, with sandy hair and piercing blue eyes, Lawrence was a gifted linguist and archeologist and a vaunting egoist. A perversely charismatic figure, he summons up — or sums up, rather - the image of German philosopher Friedrich Nietzsche's 'superman": a transcendant hero who defies the accepted moral code in his "will to power."

Incapable of submitting himself to as the occasion demanded — and king and country, 30-year-old Lawrence, a British intelligence officer, became a hero by helping to lead a combined British and Arab force into Turkish-held Damascus in 1918. As a result of this unsanctioned campaign, Lawrence was, for a time at the conclusion of World War I, a world figure, straddling the gap between European culture and the mystical Arab world.

Fiennes' Lawrence is a colorful, mesmerizing serpent insinuating himself into the antichambers of power. He gives us Lawrence's willful, dramatic facade, a presence deliberately larger than life. (It is worth wondering whether it is possible to play Lawrence without overacting.) Beneath the exterior was an illegitimate son, a terrified adolescent, a man whose wobbling moral gyroscope threatened to go skittering out of control.

Lawrence used clothes as costume, like a skin he could shed, appearing in officer's uniform or the robes of a sheik sometimes in defiance of the occasion. Before our eyes, Fiennes peels off the layers. Soaking in a borrowed bath, Lawrence at last reveals his core. At the center is pure invention; a truly self-made man. O TV Listing Inc.

#### ESPN has yachting's wind at its back

Last month when the Stars & Stripes
defeated rival Kanza in a sudden-death
sail-off, executives at ESPN must have
breathed a collective sigh of relief.

A Kanza victory would have meant that both boats in the finals would have been owned by a single syndicate, turning what should be an exciting, drama-filled sea battle into an academic drill. The sports network could have found its ratings stalled like a sailboat on a windless day, but Stars & Stripes' victory ensured a ratings swell, with colorful veteran skipper Dennis Conner facing Bill Koch and the America3 Foundation for the right to meet the successful challenger yacht in the America's Cup finals.

Riding the wave of interest created by Conner's successful 1987 bid, ESPN made an unprecedented commitment to this year's coverage. Host Jim Kelley and crew Gary Jobson, Peter Isler and Sharlene Hawkes will call the best-of-seven America's Cup finals races, except for the first, which airs Saturday, May 9, on big-sister broadcaster ABC.

Fans can warm up for the finals on Friday, May 8, when A&E presents America's Cup 1987: The Walter Cronkite Report. The special gives neophyte fans an overview of the Cup's history, from its origins in 1851 through 1987, when Conner took back the trophy lost to the Australians in 1983.

# Magician Copperfield too busy for romance



Shifting his focus to the small screen, Oscar-nabbing film director Oliver Stone will executive produce his first project for television, Wild Palms. The six-hour "event series," which will air next season on ABC, is based on a comic strip running in Details magazine.
