CANYON REUNION.

Hereford Defeats Amarillo in the Ball Game Thursday.

Over two hundred Herefordites visited Canyon yesterday for the purpose of witnessing the ball game between the Hereford and Amarillo nines, this being the third and last game of the series which was to decide the winner of the \$100 purse given by the reunion committee.

In the first of the series of games at the Canyon reunion, Hereford and Hale Center crossed bats Tuesday which resulted in a victory for the Hereford's by a score of 10 to 5.

Wednesday in the second game Amarillo and Plainview played which proved to be an easy victory for the former team by a score of 20 to 3.

In the third and deciding game, which according to previous arrangements was to be played between the winners of the two former games, much interest had been manifested, as there has always been a rivalry for baseball honors between these two towns, and there was a large crowd of fans present on both sides, each doing their share of the shouting. The game was called at 4:30 by Umpire Wells of Clarendon. From the first it was evident that the Amarillo contingent were up against it, as they were unable to hit Parnell, Hereford's pitcher, while Jones of the opposing nine proved to be a mark for the Hereford bats.

at one time Mr. Wells was forced to arrive at an ultimatum and he gave the Amarillo team two minutes to play ball or to forfeit the game. Mr. Wells proved to be very fair in all his decisions.

In the last half of the ninth inning the score stood 15 to 9 in Hereford's favor, and the case was a hopeless one for the wearers of the black and yellow. In this inning Hereford's catcher, Love, was run into by Ridings of the Amarillo team and his left leg broken just above the ankle, and of course our boys did not feel like continuing the game, and by the magnanimity of Hereford's captain, Jesse Munchus, who made the proposition, the game was called a draw, though he had the right to have the game decided in Hereford's favor as it stood at the end of the seventh inning.

Mr. Love was carried to a surgeon's office, where his leg was set and incased in a plaster paris jacket, and made as comfortable as possible under the circumstances and he was brought to this place today, where he will receive every attention possible.

The unfortunate ending of the game was deplored by everybody.

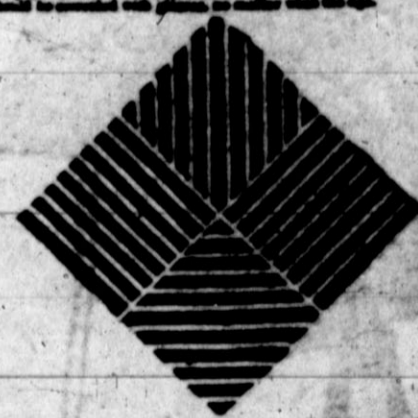
