"A complete conservation plan for the entire farm should be the first step in bringing about actual conservation on the land," according to E. R. Steen of the Soil Conservation Service. "Large amounts of money and labor should not be expended in carrying out conserva tion practices on most farms until after a plan has first been developed."

Soil Conservation Service men have worked with eleven farmers and ranch ers in completing plans that cover approximately 13,450 acres in Terry and Yoakum Counties during the past six months since the Service has been operating in these counties. These men are assisting the farmers and land owners to develop conservation and farming plans based on an inventory of the farm and the farmers' resources. The whole theory of conservation planning is to develop plans for the farm as a whole instead of trying to patch up the erosion scars nere and there on the seprate fields of the place.

"The first s ep in buildng a conservation program on the farm," Steen ays, "is to take an inven tory of the soils, slopes, rosion conditions, and the present cropping system. With these facts incorporited on a map, the farmer ind the conservation techneciah can go over the arm field by fie'd, working out use changes and er son control practises to hold the soil."

Farmer and technician hen discuss family needs, narket opportunities, cost of installing the new program, and other financial considerations to make ure the plan is economically sound. The plan also ncludes a detailed schedue of work which blends pplication of the conseration program into the ormal routine of farming perations.
