Fair This Year Very Successful

Last Saturday night rung down the curtain on the 28th Panhandle South annual Plains Fair, pronounced by officials as by far the best Exposition in the more than a quarter of a century history of "The Show Window of the Plains."

Exhibits in all departments were pronounced by department heads and by the record crowds that visited exhibit buildings as outclassing in quality anything shown here in recent years. Officials frankly said that some departments had in the past had perhaps more exhibits in number, but never has the quality been better, they said C. C. Jobson, Superintendent of the Agricultural Department, announced that more people had been in the agriculture building than in any of the seven years he has been working with the department. Other department heads announced similar public recep-

Attracting particular att-ention was the pattern or model livestock exhibit by Texas Tech College, which a cross section of the college stock as individuals along with methods of preparation and exhibition of show stock.

Featuring the night entertainment program each night of the week was a series of the best rodeo performances ever brought to the South Plains. Most of the fine stock for the rodeo was furnished by Lynn Beutler of the Beutler Bros. ranch at Elk City, Oklahoma, who also arena director and responsible for the snappy program that was unreeled. High class free entertainment was given each alternoon in front of the grandstand, and on Friday and Saturday this was lugmented by appearance with equipment, of 125 men and officers from the 260th Coast Artillery from Fort Bliss Anti aircraft and anti mechanized weapans were placed on exhibition and inspected each afternoon.
