## ECONOMY FRUIT CAKE

Combine in pan 2 cups raisins, 2 cups brown sugar, cups water, 1 cup shortening. Let simmer 20 minutes, let cool. Take 31-2 cups of flour and sift a little over 1 cup chopped nuts. Sift the rest with 2 teaspoons salt, 2 tap cinnamon, 2 tsp soda. Stir into cooled mixture, add nuts, use not-too-deep loaf pan for about an hour and fifteen minutes, or until done. Let stand about 24 -hours or longer before cutting.
