Redetermination

Of Eligibility For Supplemental Security

ministration reports that each person who draws a goldcolored check under the Supplement Security Income (SSI) program will be asked to have his eligibility for the check redetermined each year. The reason for this "redetermination" is to make sure the person is being paid the right amount. For the most part, this redetermination of eligibility shows that the check amount is correct, but sometimes the payment must be raised or lowered because of a change in the individual's circumstances.

If someone is asked to contact the social security office for the redetermination, it is important that the contact be

made as soon as possible. Payments cannot be continued if the redetermination is not completed within a certain length of time.

Also, if a person goes into the social security office for a redetermination, it would be helpful and would save time to bring a copy of his most recent bank statement and savings' account statement.

Finally, even if no redeterminatiion of eligibility is due, but a person receiving SSI checks has a change in circunstances such as a change in income, an increase in resources, or a change in residence, the change should be reported immediately to the social security office.

Legal Rights Of **Homemakers**

Thursday, June 2, 1977

Texas law has improved its treatment of homemakers in recent years, says a new study, but more changes are needed before women at home are afforded their full legal and economic rights.

The report, one of a series examing the legal rights of homemakers in all states, was released by the Texas International Women's Year (IWY) Coordinating Committee in Austin Tuesday (May 17).

"The Legal Status of Homemakers in Texas", based on laws in effect in the state in February 1977, was written by State Rep. Sarah Weddington of Austin and published by the National Commission on the Observance of IWY.

"If the homemakers personal security, rights responsibilities strengthened, the partnership into which she has entered will also profit from that strength the study said.

The report was requested by the National IWY Commission's Homemaker Committee, Michigan Congresswoman Martha Griffiths, and prepared under contract with the Center for Women Policy Studies of Washington D.C.

"The woman who examines these problems can plan her life in a way to avert tragedy or minimize its consequences,' the booklet-form report said.



The Beef Referendum

What it is.

Soon you'll have an opportunity to vote on the beef research and information plan. Here are some facts to consider.

It's a self-help program. If the beef business is going to get more profitable, producers themselves are going to have to make it more profitable. The beef referendum provides the toolspromotion, research, foreign market development,

marketing information-to do the job. It's producer-controlled. The plan will be run by a Beef Board made up of cattlemen who have been recommended by their fellow cattlemen. Every state or region will be represented in proportion to its beef production.

It's fair. The investment needed for the program is provided by a collection of just 3/10's of 1% on the sale of each animal. It's based on a "value added" system that guarantees each person pays only his fair share.

It's needed. The beef industry's present research and information effort is inadequate by any standard. We spend a small fraction of what many other, smaller commodity groups spend (e.g. cotton, citrus, dairy, soybeans). The referendum will generate the \$30 to \$40 million a year needed to solve our problems and strengthen our markets.

It's accepted. Nearly 90 producer organizations endorse the program. During a series of six public hearings held by USDA, 150 beef and dairy leaders spoke out in favor of the program; only 6 against.

What it isn't. It's not a government program. This

is a producer program. Producers wrote the law. Producers are paying for the referendum through voluntary donations. And producers will run the program from day one, once the referendum passes. The government's involvement is limited: The Secretary of Agriculture formally appoints the Beef Board members, who are nominated by producer organizations; he is also responsible for seeing that the money is spent according to producer wishes, as set out in the law.

It's not a tax. The program is voluntary. The

collection is automatic. But if anyone, for any reason, doesn't want to participate, he can ask for a refund and get it promptly. With no red tape. That's the law.


It's not just an advertising program. The program is comprehensive. Some of the money will go for consumer education. Some for foreign market development. Some for production research. Some for new product development. Some for improving marketing and distribution.





SECRETS OF SEWING WITH SHEERS

The wrap dress is an all-time favorite. It's easy to make, being without buttonholes or zipper and comfortable to wear.

Scarves by the yard, which is new on the market, has the magic. In addition to the color snap of the unique designs, there's freshness in the silky feel of filament polyester woven fabric.

The wrap dress illustrated has gathers at the sleeve cap and on the diagonal lines of the midriff. The tie belt is gathered to the waist. Seams are straight. It's the stitching technique for silky wovens and sheers that makes the difference.

Use polyester thread with a cotton core. For very sheer fabric, look for the wording on the spool, "extra

fine for lightweight fabrics. The right size sewing machine needle is extremely important. To avoid snagging fine fiber with a damaged needle, use a fresh one, a no. 11. The fine diameter of the thread and the size of the needle's eye need to correspond. If the needle is too big, the thread will continually "saw" through the eve and become frayed.

The number of stitches worked into a seam has significance. When you use a skinny thread and slim needle, you also need to work more stitches per inch into the seam. Apply approximately 12 to 14.

For a special dress in sheer fabric, conceal cut edges of seam allowances with a french seam. However, for a casual day dress, double-stitched seams will provide a neat seam finish.

To make a double-stitched seam, stitch seam with right sides together, as usual. Then, make a second row of stitches within the seam allowance about one-eighth inch from the actual seamline. Trim seam allowance close to the second line of stitching.

Press seam allowance to one side. When pressing, test temperature of the iron on a scrap of fabric first. Use a press cloth between the iron and the fabric and press on the wrong side. Most sheers, especially those with a shiny surface, require low temperature and very little moisture. Use a light-handed pressing motion, not an ironing maneuver.



suggestions on how to shave your electric consumption — doing your part in the energy crunch and at the same time saving money - here are more tips on how to avoid future shock when you get your bills from your

friendly electric company.
Use fluorescent bulbs rather than incandescent bulbs in places like the kitchen, workshop and closets. Fluorescent tubes last 10 times or more longer, cost less to operate, and give you more lumens (a measure of the amount of light a bulb puts out.) A 40-watt fluorescent provides more light than a 100-watt incandescent.

If you notice an incandescent bulb turn dark. replace it because vaporized tungsten is collecting on the inside of the glass. You're getting less light but the bulb is still using the same watts.

Where you need maximum light, use higherwatt bulbs rather than two or more low-wattage bulbs; one 100-watt bulb produces about 50 percent more lumens than four 25watt bulbs.

The "instant on" feature of some TV sets uses electricity constantly and taking time to pull the plug when the set is not in use will save a lot of juice.





EASY SHIRRING ADDS CHARM The sundress is a big style item. The one illustrated has curved straps, flattering and comfortable. The pattern does double duty as sundress or jumper depending upon what type of fabric is used.

Shirring is decorative and at the same time, it gathers the fullness of a loose garment into uniform, attractive folds. It's a step beyond gathering. Gathering is one or two rows of stitches to control fullness. Shirring is three or more rows and provides

extensibility, the shirring of the front band is done with elastic, adding practicability to pretty.

Add the knack of sewing with elastic thread to your storehouse of knowledge and you'll use it time and again. It's great for little girl clothes, as well as for older girls and young women.

Mark the line of stitching, where the first row of shirring will be placed, with machine basting. Next, wind bobbin with elastic thread, doing this evenly and without stretching thread. Adjust machine's stitch length to 10 stitches per inch. Draw several inches of both threads to back of needle, ready for you to grasp, before needle takes its first bite into the fabric.

Stitch on right side of fabric in order that the elastic thread will be on the underside. Stitch just a hair's breadth from the machine basting, which is your guideline. As you stitch, the elastic thread will pucker the fabric evenly.

After stitching the first row of shirring, stitch second row, using presser foot as your guide to keep rows an equal distance apart. As you stitch, hold the fabric taut in order to stitch on a smooth surface. To do this, hold fabric in back of needle with left hand and in front of needle with right hand. Don't yank it, just hold it firmly and evenly. Use same procedure for other rows. Ten stitches per inch gives an average amount of

fullness. Fewer stitches per inch provides more fullness; a shorter stitch, less fullness. After completing the rows, draw spool thread ends to

Not only do salads taste good and provide interesting tex- and four radishes add up ture and color to the dieter's menu, but they are full of vitamins and minerals that are optimally available in uncooked produce. And, of course, calories are quite low.

Salad dressings are a little trickier. Just plain oil and vinegar can be calorically high since the oil itself has 100 calories per tablespoon (that's 500 calories in a mere quarter cup). Bottled dressings use lots of oil, and sometimes sugar, too, so they can be way out of line for careful calorie counters. But the bottled diet dressings have about 10 to 15 calories in a tablespoon, they taste good, and there are a lot of varieties to choose from.

Salad makings are almost without exception good calorie bargains. A head of iceberg lettuce has 60 calories. Boston lettuce has 30, and one tomato has 40 calories. A whole carrot has just 20 calories, a stalk of celery, 5. An average cucumber has 30 calories, Bermuda onion has 25 calories and red salad onions have 20. to only 5 calories. For interesting variety, chopped apples add new flavor and texture to salad bowls at just 70 calories per apple. Raw spinach is a nice change from lettuce and has only 20 calories per quarter pound. A whole cup of fresh sliced mushrooms has just 20 calories (the same amount of canned mushrooms, has 40 calories). Shredded or sliced raw cabbage has just 15 calories per cup.

Leftover cooked vege tables can be tasty additions to salads. A cup of diced cooked beets, for example, has 55 calories and adds interesting color and flavor. Chopped broccoli has 40 calories per cup. For a protein add in salads, hard-boiled eggs have 80 calories each and an ounce of Swiss or cheddar cheese has about 100 calories. Three ounces of water-packed tuna have

only 108 calories. Have salad often, especially now that produce is coming into season. If you watch out for the dressings, salad is an excellent diet food.

How do diuretics [water pills] work? - B.McL.

Generally diuretics perform only one function. They remove sodium (salt) from the body. When sodium in the body decreases, usually water in the body decreases. That's why people who take diuretics are also put on a low salt diet. If your salt intake is high, and you are taking a diuretic, you are working against the medicine.



WINDOW PLANTS

New architectural designs are more than ever leaning toward structures that utilize the natural heat and light of the sun in order to conserve energy. If you're planning on building or renovating, check out some of the following window designs which will keep utility bills low while giving plants more sunshine.

Clerestory windows are strip windows, oriented horizontally, usually near the ceiling. Light from these windows is better distributed because they allow natural exposure to enter farther into the

Window walls are getting more and more popular and they certainly add beauty to homes by allowing the gardener to merge his indoor planting designs with those outside the window which gives a lovely open air effect. Living curtains of hanging plants are fast replacing fabric draperies on these windows.

Bay windows are not romantic-looking, they make wonderful plant niches for indoor gardeners. Because they protrude beyond the wall plane, they gather more light and are able to absorb three different exposures throughout the day. Extended windows can be constructed from greenhouse components to provide a miniature conservatory indoors.

Skylights bring light deep into the area providing the best possible sunlight to areas that would otherwise go unlit. These dramatic ceiling windows are now available in acrylic plastic as well as glass constructions, and they come in various translucencies and tints. 

Just follow the simple rules of the American Medical Association: 15 to 20 minutes exposure the first day; 20 to 25 minutes the second day; 25 to 30 minutes the third day; 30 to 35 minutes the fourth day. Thereafter base exposure time on the degree of redness and tenderness of your skin. The shorter exposures are for those with light skin; the longer times are for darker skin. and at high altitudes.

Want to get a good, painful, Remember this about tanning -- it can't be rushed. It's easy. Just stay out in the Trying to rush it will only result sun in your shorts or swim suit in a burn. The burned skin will peel, leaving you pale and pink

Of course, the AMA also points out that there is no health picking up a summer tan value in tanning. In fact, it contributes to early aging, and wrinkling of the skin, and to proliferation of skin cancer. But, if you insist on a tan, start

slow and build up gradually. Consider the time of day for your suntanning. The sun's rays are most potent between 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., standard time. You won't get much tan before 8 a.m. or 4 p.m., standard time. Don't forget that you can burn on cloudy days, on the water

Suntan lotion can be helpful in preventing a burn and promoting a tan. The lotions contain a chemical sun screen that absorbs some of the rays, while letting others through. They also contain a lubricant to keep the skin from drying out too quickly. Suntan lotions must be reapplied at least once every two hours, and whenever the film may have worn off or washed off.

A bland cold cream or a lightweight mineral oil may be applied to the skin. If the pain is excessive or if extensive blistering is present, consult your physician.



Legislators Face Cancer Question

Desperate cancer victims are turning to the Texas Legislature to help them obtain an illegal drug they falsely hope wili cure cancer, the Texas Medical Association says. The House of Representatives has passed a bill leglaizing manufacture and use of Laetrile, an extract of apricot pits. The bill now goes to the Senate Human Resources Committee.

Cancer is a terrifying disease and many people understandably want to try anything to get well. the trouble with Laetrile is that it is totally unproven as a cancer cure, TMA says. People should stick to proven therapy and not abandon it for a drug that has no effect.

Several people presented emotional testimonials at a House committe hearing. They all claimed Laetrile had curred or slowed down their cancer. Some of these people had undergone traditional cancer therapy as well as taking the unproven Laetrile so it is hard to credit thel cure to Laetrile. Others had taken Laetrile alone and were still alive after a few years. Of course the testimonials all were favorable because many patients who took Laetrile and died could not

testify that it failed. Nobody ever ignores cancer like the common cold. No one knows how many times cancer slows down or goes away by itself without treatment. People always treat it with something. These Laetrile-takers may be cases where the disease slowed down by itself. This may be true because Laetrile was discovered more than 50 years ago and extensive scientific tests repeatedly have shown Laetrile does not cure cancer. The prestigious Sloan-Kettering Cancer Institute in New York recently has completed the most extensive animal tests ever done on the drug. In a paper to be formally published soon, the research declares Laetrile has no effect on cancer.

In the past the center has done animal tests on other

treatments. The animal tests showed good effects and the drugs or radiation techniques then produced good results in humans. Laetrile cannot get past the animal testing stage because it has no effect.

One big argument for, legalizing Lactrile is that a terminally ill patient should have every opportunity to get well and certainly the drug could not hurt them.

Doctors agree patients should have every opportunity to get well. But there is no way to legally restrict Laetrile to terminally ill patients alone. The big danger of legalizing Laetrile is that thousands of people not terminally ill at first could die because they would give up proven methods for Laetrile. "No worthless drug is without harm," the federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA) says.

Another danger of the pro-Laetrile bill is that manufacturing the potentially dangerous drug could be virtually unregulated in Texas. Laetrile contains cyanide, a deady poison, and unregulated manufacture could let many badly made drugs on the market. Dangerous products already have appeared and the federal Food and Drug Administration had to ban two Laetrile products falsely advertised as "Dietary supplements." Five of the "vitamin" capsules could kill a child and 20 could kill an adult. Legalizing an unproven, ineffective drug like Laetrile could open the door for a whole flood of bad products to be pawned off on the public as cures for everything from heart disease to broken bones. Health officials have done a lot to protect the public from dangerous drugs such as thalidomide, which causes birth defects and was legal in other countries. Laetrile supporters mean well but legalizing the drugh could mena a setback to the days of snake oil tonics when people sold and bought anything because they did not know any better.
