



WHAT SAITH THE **SCRIPTURES?** Jon N. Bailey

QUESTION: Does the Bible teach that there will be a "secret rapture"?

ANSWER: The term "rapture" or "secret rapture" is used by alleged secret coming of Christ to secretly take away all living Christians and secretly resurrect the righteous dead. Supposedly after a period of time, those who have been "raptured" will return with Christ to set up a

earthly kingdom. Premillenialists and Dispensationalists differ greatly as to when this "rapture" will supposedly take place. reality, "rapture" is only a part of a complicated system of various resurrections, multiple judgements, detailed predictions of the future, and a very materialistic view of the kingdom of God. All of this is unscriptural and false.

The "secret rapture" theory is false, for the English word "rapture" is not even used in the Bible. Advocates of the theory claim the idea is found in 1 thessalonians 4:17, where the Latin Vulgate version of the Bible used the Latin "rapturo" word meaning "seize, snatch, take". This verse, however, is not

speaking of a "secret many to describe an rapture" but of the second coming of Christ at the end of time. 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

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
