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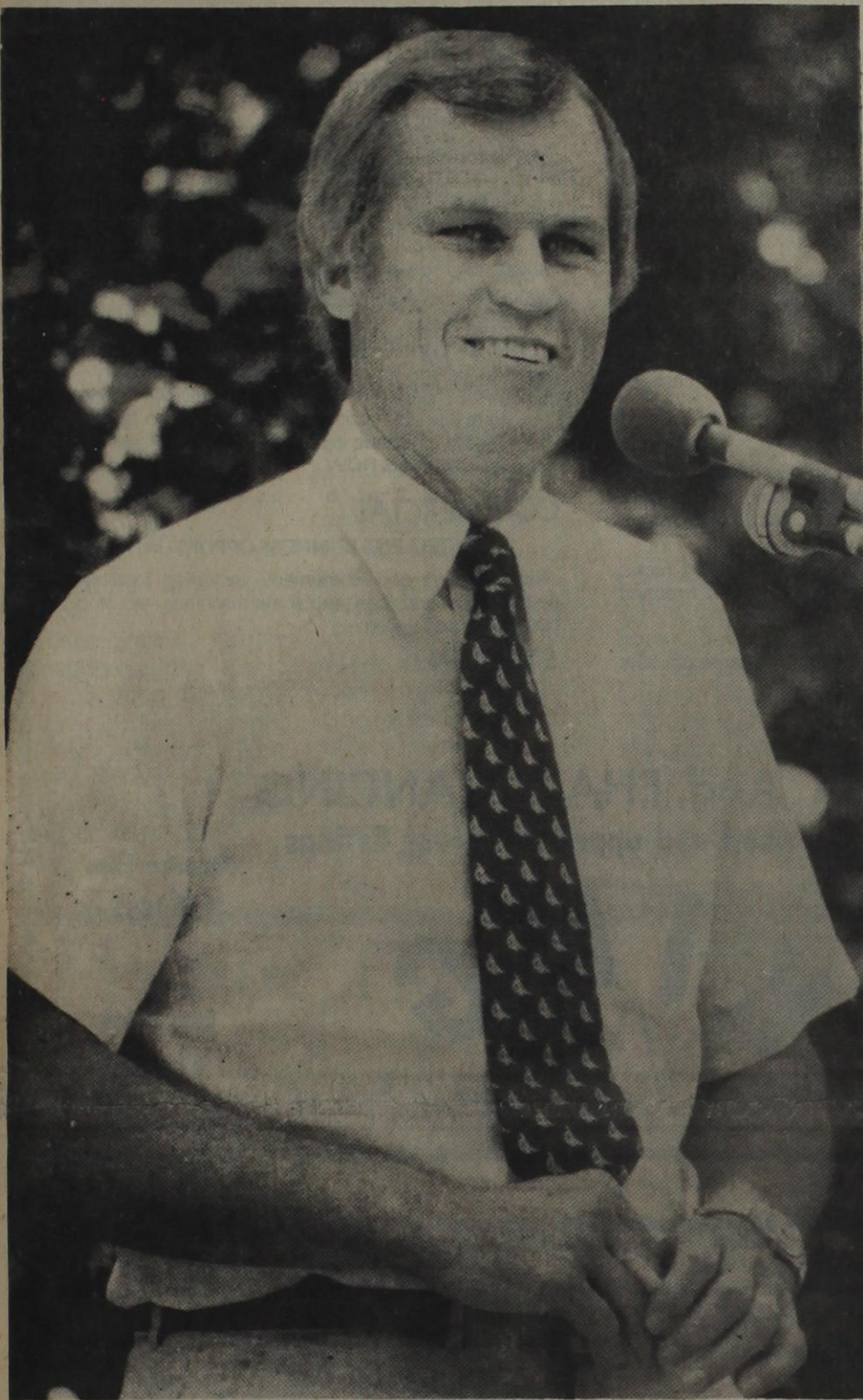

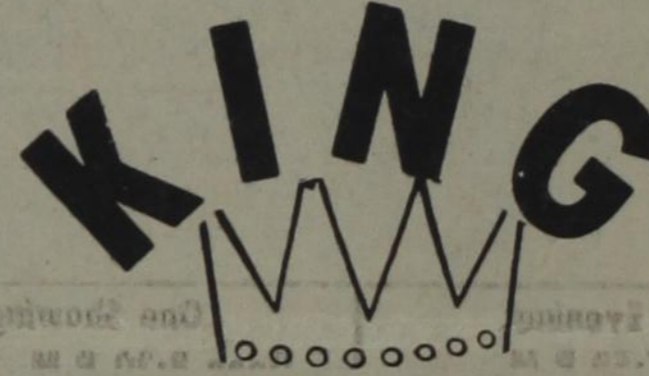

ANSWER: The term "rapture" or "secret rapture" is used by many to describe an alleged secret coming of Christ to secretly take away all living Christians and secretly resurrect the righteous dead. Supposedly after a period of time, those who have been "raptured" will return with Christ to set up a earthly kingdom.
 Premillennialists and Dispensationalists differ greatly as to when this "rapture" will supposedly take place. In reality, the "rapture" is only a part of a complicated system of various resurrections, multiple judgements, detailed predictions of the future, and a very materialistic view of the kingdom of God. All of this is unscriptural and false.

The "secret rapture" theory is false, for the English word "rapture" is not even used in the Bible. Advocates of the theory claim the idea is found in 1 Thessalonians 4:17, where the Latin Vulgate version of the Bible used the Latin word "rapturo", meaning "seize, snatch, take". This verse, however, is not speaking of a "secret rapture" but of the second coming of Christ at the end of time. Paul says that Jesus shall return for us and we shall be "caught up in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air; and so shall we ever be with the Lord". We shall be "ever with the Lord" in our heavenly home (Phil. 3:20-21).
 The "secret rapture" theory is false, for Christ's coming will be visible and audible to the whole world. "Every eye shall see him..." (Rev. 1:7). "The Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trump of God" (1 Thess. 4:16).
 The "secret rapture" theory is false,

for Christ will return to raise all the dead at the last day (John 5:28-29; 6:40,54). "There shall be a resurrection of both the just and unjust" (Acts 24:15).
 The "secret rapture" theory is false, for Christ will return to judge all the living and the dead at the same time (John 5:28-29; Acts 10:42; 17:31; Mt. 25:31-46; 2 Thess. 1:7-10; 2 Tim. 4:1).
 The "secret rapture" theory is false, for when Christ returns, this earth shall be destroyed. "The day of the Lord will come as a thief, in which the heavens shall pass away with great noise, and the elements shall be dissolved with fervent heat, and the earth and the works therein shall be burned up..." (2 Pet. 3:10-13).

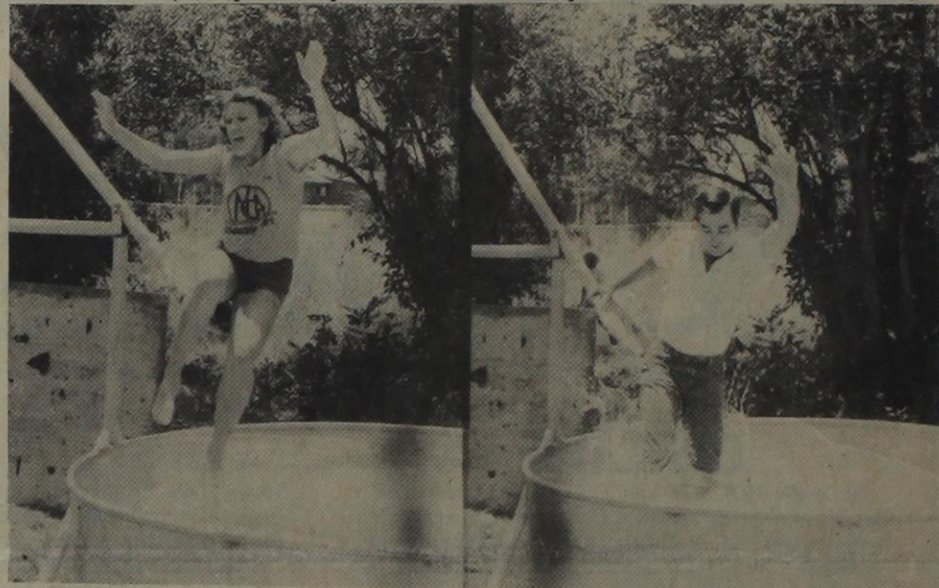
I was impressed with Congressman Stenholm's talk. He sounded like a country boy trying hard to get something done and done right. It was an enjoyable day all around. The Lord
