In the Rising Star School Board of Trustees election held jointly with the City, one incumbent and one newcomer were elected. Returning to the Board will be

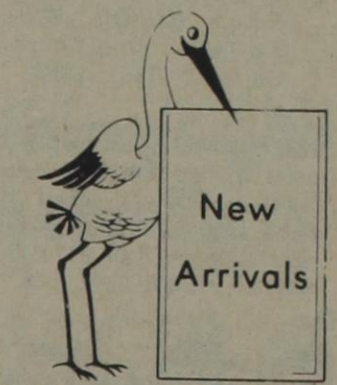

# Social Security News

Those of you who were entitled to social security checks and who continued to work last year are reminded to file your annual report of earnings no later than April 15, 1980. Note: An annual report of earnings is not the same as a tax return, but is a

separate report which must be filed with the Social Security Administration. Your local office has the necessary reporting forms. All persons under age 72 who were entitled to social security checks last year and who had total earnings, including both wages and self-employment income, in excess of the exempt amount should file an annual report of earnings. Exempt amounts for 1979 were

### PUBLIC HEARING FOR SENIOR CITIZENS PROGRAMS SET

Public hearings to gather facts for planning Senior Citizens services will be held at 11:00 A.M. on April 16, 1980 at the Senior Center in Cisco, and in Ranger on April 25 at 11 a.m. at the Ranger Senior Center.

The Hearing, conducted by West Central Texas Council of Governments Area Agency on Aging, will be one of 19 held throughout the West Central Texas Council of Governments region. It will be open to all residents of Eastland County, but will be directed primarily at persons age 60 or over.

Included in the Hearing will be discussion about operation of Senior Citizens services under the Older American Act. National, State and local priorities will be reviewed with opportunity for input from the audience.

The bulk of the Hearing will be spent getting information from those present about the needs of older persons. This information will be used by the Area Agency on Aging in preparing its Regional Aging Services Plan for the period beginning October 1, 1980.

Results of this Public Hearing will directly influence the future of Senior Citizens this County as well as in the West Central Texas Council of Governments region.

Social security checks are paid to beneficiaries who continue to work on the basis of their estimated earnings. It is imperative the annual report of earnings be filed in order to insure that all benefits due are paid. The annual report should be filed timely, no later than April 15th, 1980, to prevent a penalty from being assessed if earnings exceed the exempt amount.

Those of you who are not currently entitled to social security checks but who are now working towards social security coverage are advised that, in 1980, one quarter of coverage may be credited for each \$290 of covered earnings.

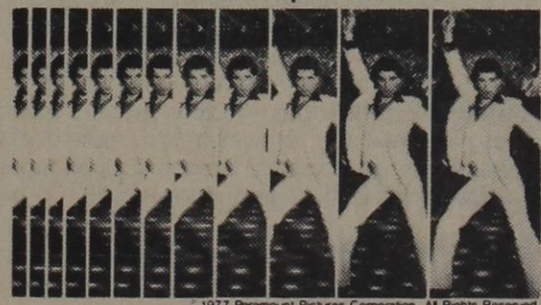

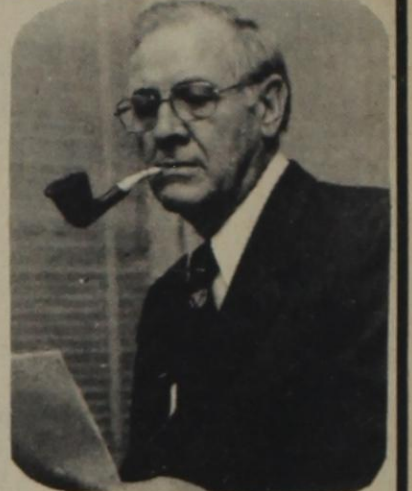

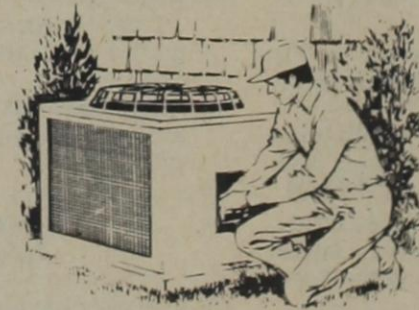

**Homemaking Tips**

**HOMEMAKER'S TIPS**

In today's health-conscious society, many Americans hold myths about the proper role of vitamins. While vitamins are essential for good health, excessive amounts are unnecessary and can be harmful.

Once a day, "just to make sure," millions of Americans take a multivitamin pill. Then, when cold season comes around, some stock up on vitamin C. And if all these vitamins do not prevent that "rundown feeling," they might try a little - or a lot - of all the vitamins, with an added boost of vitamin B12. Yes, Americans spend over \$600 million a year on self-prescribed vitamins.

According to some recent articles and books by so-called nutrition "experts," this sort of therapy should do the trick. But millions of Americans now know it does not work. The FDA's National Clearinghouse for Poison Control Centers reported that 4,000 cases of vitamin poisonings are reported each year, with some 3,200 involving children. Other Americans, with rashes, diarrhea or headaches, may also be unwary victims of the belief that since vitamins are good for them, the more the better.

An advertisement on television shows a person explaining how he stays healthy and looks "great." He says he watches his diet, get plenty of exercise, and "just to be good health. The implication of such advertising has contributed to the myth that even a balanced diet cannot provide adequate nutrients.

A balanced diet which generally meets the United States RDA requirements for vitamins A, B, B12, C and D nearly always will provide the needed amounts of other vitamins, despite the claims of some people that these other vitamins are hard to find and therefore must be eaten in special foods or taken by pill. Even though eating is a personal thing and the acceptability of foods varies from person to person, it is possible to obtain the U.S. RDA in many different diet patterns because of the wide variety of foods containing similar nutrients. But the simplest, surest guide to sure," takes a vitamin - mineral supplement every day.

This is the way we have come to expect the marketing of dietary supplements. They are promoted as an "insurance" policy to guarantee follow for a good daily balance of nutrients is still the selection of foods from each of the four food groups - milk, meat, vegetable and fruits, and breads and cereal. Additional vitamin supplements should be prescribed by a medical doctor who is capable of diagnosing dietary deficiencies.

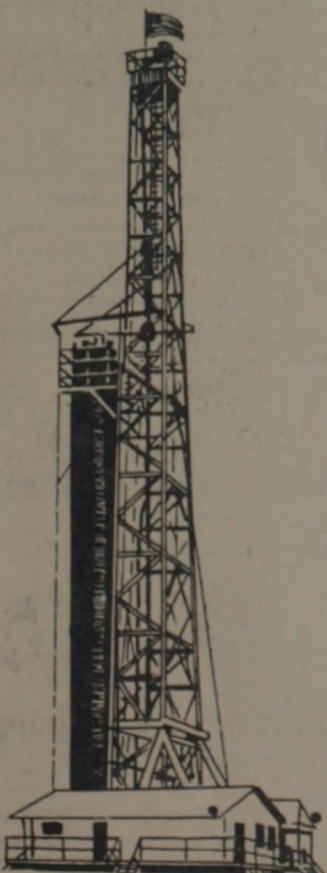

### Church of Christ

#### WHAT SAITH THE SCRIPTURES?

**QUESTION:** Does a person have to obey the Lord in order to receive salvation and eternal life?

**ANSWER:** Men must obey both God the Father and his on Jesus Christ if they are to be saved eternally. Jesus emphasized the importance of obeying God when he said, "Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father who is in heaven" (Matt. 7:21). Likewise, the necessity of obeying the son is seen in the following verses (Matt. 7:22-27), where only those who hear and obey Jesus are saved. Jesus is "the author of eternal salvation unto all them that obey him" (Heb. 5:9).

Since the Bible teaches that we are saved by faith, many wrongly conclude that we are actually faith expressing itself in action. Without outward acts of obedience, faith is "barren" and "dead" (James 2:17-26).

In the Letter to the Romans, the apostle Paul wrote a great deal about how men are saved by faith. In the introduction and conclusion of that book, he made it clear that his work of preaching was to bring about the "obedience of faith" (Rom. 1:5, 16:26). The book's greatest example of faith is Abraham (Rom. 4:1-22), a man whose faith was always obedient. "by faith Abraham when he was called,

obeyed..." (Heb. 11:8). "By faith Abraham, being tried, offered up Isaac..." (Heb. 11:17). Abraham's acts of obedience are actually what made his faith "perfect" before God (James 2:21-24).

Only in obedience to God does our faith save us from sin. Baptism is the act of obedience where one who believes in Jesus Christ is united with him, raised in "newness of life", and truly "justified from sin" (Rom. 6:3-7). Before this act of obedience, men are "servants of sin" (Rom. 6:17). When men obey from their hearts the gospel of Jesus Christ, they are "made free from sin" and become "servants of righteousness" (Rom. 6:18), thus purifying their souls in their "obedience to the truth" (1 Peter 1:22).

The question might be asked, "What shall be the end of them that obey not the gospel of God?" (1 Pet. 4:17). The scriptures declare that all those who know not God and all those who do not obey the gospel "shall suffer punishment, even eternal destruction from the face of the Lord and from the glory of his might". This punishment shall come upon them when the Lord Jesus returns from heaven with the angels of his power in flaming fire to render vengeance on the wicked (2 Thess. 1:7-9).

Men must obey the Lord if they are to be saved eternally. This obedience of faith is also essential if they are to escape the judgement of God.
